Corey Lanakila Carroll - Climbing the steep ridges around Waimea Canyon on Kauai to hunt goats was a favorite recreation for Corev Lanakila Carroll, 27, of Kekaha. Last weekend, the successful hunter was returning with a knapsack full of meat when he fell more than 200 feet to his death. "He's been hunting since childhood," said his father, Albert "He left us doing what he enjoyed doing, if it's any Carroll of Kekaha. consolation. It's beautiful country that is the memory we have." Corey Carroll, a champion swimmer for the University of Hawaii in the late 1980s, had been a firefighter with the Kauai County Fire Department for the past 18 months. He started his service career as a Kauai policeman, following the footsteps of his father, a retired Kauai police lieutenant. "He always had this interest of helping people," said Carroll. "He had an easier time getting in the police department, but deep in his heart he wanted to be a fireman. When the chance came, he took it." Earlier, he had worked as a part-time firefighter with the federal government at the Barking Sands Pacific Missile Range Facility. Albert Carroll was summoned to the canyon early Sunday morning after his son's two hunting companions made their way out of the canyon and reported him missing. They had followed their usual routine, separating Saturday morning to hunt on separate ridges, and

didn't become concerned until he failed to return to their camp late Saturday. The body was found by the crew of a county rescue helicopter. University of Hawaii swimming coach Daniel Arakaki said Corey Carroll "really focused and intense when he was competing. Out of the competition, he was just the greatest guy." Arakaki recalled that Carroll came to the university from Wai mea High School, which had a small swimming program, and gained steadily in confidence and strength during his career as an athlete from 1986-90. Rev. Kim On Chong, retired minister and former chaplain at Mid-Pacific Institute, thought being a minister was the greatest job in the world. "I just can't say enough about him," said Randall Roth, University of Hawaii law professor, who was associated with the former Campbell Estate trustee on Hawaii Public Radio's "Price of Paradise" radio program. "He's probably touched more lives for the better than anyone I've ever met. I felt honored just to know him and to witness the kind of life he had and the way he made everything around him better. He had a lot of class." Cornuelle came to Hawaii in 1942 as a Navy ensign and returned in 1953 to become Dole Company's vice president. In 1958 he became Dole's youngest president at age 38. "He was the dean of the business community and father of many fund-raising efforts to benefit those less fortunate," Dave McCoy, Campbell Estate's chief executive officer, said today. Friends and associates remember Cornuelle as a brilliant and competent man who was quiet and humble, who cared about people, had a great sense of humor and loved Hawaii. "He was a great believer in honesty and integrity in all things," his wife, Jean, said today. "The best way he could be remembered is with two words - 'be kind'." Campbell Estate when Cornuelle was board chairman, said his death is "one of the greatest losses to the state of Hawaii, not only for the business and nonprofit community but to a lot of Hawaiians he has helped over the years very quietly, and I'm one of them."
