Ignacio Razon "Nick" Garcia - Well-known Honolulu criminal defense attorney Ignacio Razon "Nick" Garcia, co-founder of the Hawaii Association of Criminal Defense Attorneys and State Bar Association leader, died Tuesday July 2, 1996 after suffering a heart attack. He was 42 "He was just the sweetest guy in the world," said his law partner, Randall Rosenberg. "He was a man of integrity. When he gave his word you could take it to the bank. He was known as one of the top criminal defense attorneys in the state." Known as a "champion of the underdog," Garcia served on the board of directors of the Hawaii State Bar Association and was a member of the board of the Hawaii Bar Examiners. He was also appointed as a delegate to the 9th Circuit Judicial Conference. "He was always a gentleman in the courtroom," Rosenberg said, referring to his former high school soccer coach. "It didn't matter who was on the other side. He wasn't in your face." Longtime friend Judge Marie Milks remembers Garcia as the "consummate jury trial lawyer. I saw in him absolute charm," she said. In 1994, Garcia successfully argued that a murder defendant was innocent by reason of insanity because of a chronic addiction to methamphetamine. Lani Rae Suisa Garcia, his wife and law partner, said Garcia's hero was St. Thomas Moore, who was beheaded for standing up for his beliefs. "Nick was a philosopher at heart," she said. "He was ardent in his passion to provide justice for the disadvantaged. ... He was so entranced by life, and in turn, we were all entranced by Nick." About the only thing Garcia couldn't master was golf, Rosenberg said. "He was a golf fanatic," Rosenberg recalled. "He was a big guy. He looked like Dom DeLuise. He'd introduce himself to juries as Dom DeLuise. If you can picture Dom DeLuise swearing at a water hazard that had just gobbled up his third ball." Madeleine J. Goodman, a longtime University of Hawaii administrator who pushed equity for women and minority faculty and helped establish the women's studies program, has died of cancer at the age of 51. Goodman left UH in the summer of 1994 after 25 years to become arts and sciences dean at Vanderbilt University. Chancellor Joe B. Wyatt said Goodman fought the cancer "with the same determination and spirit with which she approached her life's work." "Her death leaves a large void in our university community and beyond," Wyatt said. Goodman died yesterday afternoon at the Vanderbilt University Medical Center. UH Engineering Dean Paul C. Yuen said her passing is a great loss not only to Vanderbilt but to UH as well. Yuen said Goodman had a keen mind and was an able administrator who wanted to help people. "She always asked, 'What's the problem, what's wrong, and how can we best solve the problem so that everyone will be satisfied?" " he said. "She left an imprint here." A New York City native. Goodman began her career as a UH assistant professor in general science and women's studies in 1974. In 1978, she help create the women's studies program and served as its director for seven years. She also helped revise UH's sexual harassment policy as well as a new affirmative action plan for the Manoa campus. In 1986, after a year as a full professor, Goodman was named assistant vice president for academic affairs. From 1992-93, she served as as interim senior vice president. A past president of the UH faculty senate, Goodman led the creation of several schools, programs and institutes, including the School of Ocean and Earth Sciences and Technology. "She literally grew into every opportunity given her to serve the university," said sociology Professor Kiyoshi Ikeda, senate co-chairman. Goodman, who served on the graduate faculty at the John A. Burns School of Medicine, was a noted author and lecturer who twice received National Science Foundation grants. She earned her zoology degree from Barnard College at Columbia University in 1967 and her genetics doctorate from UH in 1973.
