PAO, BROTHER FRANKLIN (1935-2007) Brother Franklin Pao brought his Hawaiian culture into public and private gatherings, sought as a chanter to open ceremonial events at churches and convention halls and to offer a blessing for the opening of a home, business or movie set. He joined the Society of Mary, a Catholic religious order that founded Saint Louis School and Chaminade University, in 1954 and worked in several positions in California before returning to Hawaii in 1982. Once home, he immersed himself in Hawaiian studies at Chaminade and graduated from the University of Hawaii Hawaiian Studies Program. "He believed that Marianist spirituality and Hawaiian spirituality go well together because of our emphasis on ohana, on hospitality, on sacredness. All of those things fit in so well," said Marianist Brother Dennis Schmitz. Pao, 72, died Oct. 12 at his Chaminade residence. He had been registrar at Saint Louis School for 21 years until his retirement in 2006. Schmitz said Pao was a mentor to people interested in joining the religious order or its community of lay members. "He would emphasize to them, 'Don't lose your culture. Bring the values of your culture and your religion together.'" In May, the four Hawaiian royal societies presented Pao with a Kalani Alii award, recognizing his contributions to the advancement of Hawaiian culture. He was member of the Royal Order of Kamehameha I and in 1988 was named kahuna nui, the highest ranking chief, said William D. Souza, a leader in the Honolulu chapter. Souza said, "He brought to our order a sense of unity. When there are different points of view among us, he would try to have us make peace with each other. He cared that we do things right, be pono, not be mean to each other." Pao was graduated as a kumu hula under the tutelage of John Keola Lake, and was a kahuna of the Puu Kohala Heiau on the Big Island. Pao was born in Honolulu. He

Peterson, Vincent May 17, 2007 Vincent Z. Peterson taught high-energy physics at the University of Hawaii for 30 years and worked with other physicists on experiments at leading research centers on the mainland. He is remembered beyond his own field of science because "he was keenly interested in the academic environment and the preservation of academic freedom," said UH physics professor Michael Jones. Peterson, 85, died Thursday in Berkeley, Calif. "A lot of people outside the sciences remember Vince for what he contributed to forming academic policy and the academic atmosphere on campus," Jones said. Peterson was elected to several terms on the UH Faculty Senate. He upheld the right of a scientist to pursue research, a debate that was revived last year over the proposed creation of a University Affiliated Research Center at Manoa that raised opposition to classified military aspects of work to be done there. Soon after his arrival in Hawaii in 1963, Peterson got Atomic Energy Commission funding for particle physics research, according to the UH Department of Physics and Astronomy Web page. The UH physicists did work at the University of California at Berkeley Radiation Laboratory, the Stanford University Linear Accelerator Center and Fermilab in Illinois. "The main thing he was involved in was experiments involving neutrinos," Jones said. Scientists study neutrinos -- high-energy, invisible elementary particles detectable only by interactions or collisions with matter -- in research that could lead to an understanding of the origins of the universe. "One thing he did that really helped put Hawaii on the map in terms of particle physics was to organize a series of summer conferences that brought distinguished scientists, including Nobel Prize

winner, as lecturers," Jones said. Young physicists and students had the opportunity to meet with the leading researchers in a summer school format that has been used as a model elsewhere. Peterson retired in 1992 and moved to California in 2002. He was born in Galesburg, Ill., and served in the Navy during World War II. He received his doctorate in physics from UC-Berkeley, and taught high-energy physics at the California Institute of Technology for 12 years before moving to Hawaii. He is survived by son Galen; daughters Karen, Andrea and Ingrid; and five grandchildren. A memorial service will be held at a later date in Hawaii. Peyton Jr., John Francis, *April 5, 2007* John Francis Peyton Jr., a veteran federal prosecutor in Hawaii and former director of the state Department of Public Safety, died in a car accident in Africa. He was 62. Relatives said Peyton was driving with his wife, Eileen, on Wednesday night, Hawaii time, when the car's tire blew out, flipping the vehicle several times. Peyton died in the crash. His wife, who escaped with minor injuries to her shoulder, will return to Honolulu in a few days, said Peyton's son John Peyton V. Peyton was working in Malawi, a country in southeastern Africa, on a U.S. Treasury Department contract helping the Malawian government pass legislation to crack down on money laundering and other financial crimes. He also helped create policies to apprehend criminals, said his daughter Erin Peyton. "He was very committed to public service and to helping other people," she said by phone from New York. Peyton served 20 years as an assistant U.S. attorney, including 18 years in Honolulu. In 2004, Peyton left after 18 months as director of the state Public Safety Department to help Bosnia establish its Rule of Law administration. Peyton handled high-profile cases. He successfully prosecuted Ronald Rewald in 1985 for swindling about \$20 million from Hawaii residents. Rewald was sentenced to 80 years in prison but was released in 1995 after a back injury placed him in a wheelchair. Senate President Colleen Hanabusa said Peyton was instrumental in the start-up of the federal Weed and Seed program to rid neighborhoods of drugs. Peyton also served as chief litigator for the Central Intelligence Agency. "He was just a great guy with a wonderful sense of humor, a great lawyer," said Hawaii Attorney General Mark Bennett, who worked with Peyton as an assistant U.S. attorney. "John was honest, ethical and tough," Bennett said. He added, "John was the kind of person who wanted to try to make life better for people and try to do the right thing." Gov. Linda Lingle said, "John was a good man and a dedicated public servant who always strived to ensure the safety and well-being of the people of Hawaii. His commitment to helping people extended to the international community." In January 2006, Peyton began his contract with the U.S. Department of Treasury that would have ended this December. Peyton planned to retire and divide his time between Honolulu and another house in Idaho, his son John said. Born Oct. 27, 1944, in New York, Peyton graduated from the University of Dayton and received his law degree from the University of Cincinnati and a master's of law from George Washington University. He came to Hawaii in 1983. John Peyton V said he spoke to his father the night before he learned of the accident. His parents talked about their plans for a two-day drive to a

game park, where they would observe wildlife and visit a nearby village. Pyle, Robert L. (1923-2007) Robert L. Pyle, a world-renowned bird expert, died Sunday after a five-month-long illness. He was 83. Pyle compiled and kept the definitive database of birds that are seen in the islands, both rare and native, said family members and friends. And he was working on a large scientific work to relate rare-bird sightings with weather patterns in the Pacific. Pyle had been involved with bird-watching, the Bishop Museum and the Hawaii Audubon Society for decades, and leaves a legacy of service and science with his three children. "He will be sorely missed by his friends on Bishop Museum and around the world," said Allen Allison, vice president for science for the Hawaii Biological Survey at the Bishop Museum. "He was a first-class scientist and a first-rate guy." Pyle had the unique ability to connect Hawaii's bird-watching and scientific communities, Allison added. He used the sightings of all bird-watchers from around the state to compile a database of native, migratory and rare birds that reach the islands. "If someone makes an important sighting and no one writes

it down," the information can be lost, Allison added. Pyle, through his contacts, made sure that would not happen. With an eye for detail, he made frequent trips to the sighting spots to view the birds that made it to the islands, whether on purpose or by accident. Pyle, who grew up in Wilmington, Del., was a meteorologist by trade. His first job in the islands, in 1953, was for the Smithsonian Institution, as part of its Pacific Ocean Biological Program. However, he eventually moved to Seattle to receive a Ph.D. in meteorology, said Leilani, his wife of 53 years. After spending a decade on the mainland, Pyle moved back to Hawaii in 1975 to run the first weather satellite office in the state. He retired in 1984. But his lifelong passion was for birds, his son Richard Pyle, a biologist at the Bishop Museum, said yesterday. The elder Pyle instilled his love for nature in his children, Leilani Pyle said yesterday. He began taking his eldest son, Peter, on bird hikes before he was a year old. It rubbed off: Peter Pyle is another world-renowned bird expert, a wildlife biologist at Point Reyes Bird Observatory in California; Richard Pyle is an ichthyologist at the Bishop Museum; and daughter Ellen is a plant expert and also volunteers at the Bishop Museum, Leilani Pyle said yesterday. She has also volunteered at the museum for decades. All four will combine their talents, with the help of volunteers, to finish Robert Pyle's monograph: a comprehensive look and analysis of all the data, both of birds and meteorology, he had compiled over the years. The family has yet not set memorial plans. They ask that in lieu of flowers, donations be given to help complete the project.
