A Kamehameha Schools graduate, Kamekona began acting and singing as a youth. He performed with his sister in the Hawaii Youth Theater and later in the Hawaii Opera, Manoa Valley and Honolulu Community theaters. But he didn’t dream of an acting career until later; then he did it mostly for fun, he said once in an interview. He became friends with Pat Morita while filming “Midway” in Hawaii. Emmet Kay - The Quiet Birdmen drank a silent toast to fellow aviator Emmet Kay last night in their traditional salute to pilots who "have gone west." The social organization of aviators "remembers what a good, gentle person he was," said Willie Schauer, a retired Air Force fighter pilot. "He was a soft-spoken man, very conscious of others' feelings and situations around him." Kay, 69, who flew for several companies in Hawaii and Guam for 50 years, died Thursday May 2, 1996 in Wahiawa General Hospital. Kay was best known for a 16-month interruption in his flying career, a period near the end of the Vietnam War when he was held as a prisoner of war by Communists in Laos. A civilian pilot, he was captured in May 1973 after his small Porter aircraft was shot down by ground fire. Kay was flying for Continental Air Service, which ferried supplies and people to CIA-backed operations near the Vietnam border in Laos even after the United States had entered into a ceasefire with North Vietnam. His imprisonment in limestone caves affected his health ever afterward, said son Kimo Kay. "He tried to get medical help but was denied by the government. He was a civilian, he fell through the cracks." Schauer said: "When he came back, he was quite bitter about the capture and his treatment by the United States after his release." The government did not compensate him or acknowledge him as a prisoner of war. Years later, however, the Special Services Association recognized him as an associate member of the group. Kay had organized a Guam air-taxi service, Micronesian Airlines, in 1965. After his release in 1975 and an unsuccessful run at the state Legislature, he piloted commercial flights in the Marianas islands for nearly 10 years. Born on Oahu, Kay also flew for Soar Hawaii, Aloha Airlines, Sky Tours Hawaii and Andrew Flying Service. He was a World War II veteran. Noel L.H. Krauss - As the state's lead "bug man," Noel L.H. Krauss got to travel the world looking for insects. His mission: hunt up parasites and predators with which to conduct biological warfare against alien weeds, insects and snails. Krauss died last Monday in Kaiser Hospital. He was 86. For more than 30 years, Krauss served as the state's (and the territory's) exploratory entomologist, roaming the globe searching for beneficial insects. He found more than a few. "Long after Noel leaves us, the results of his work will show up," said Clifton Davis, chief of the state's entomology branch, when Krauss retired in 1967. "His work is outstanding. We will be hard-pressed to find a replacement. You just don't find them these days with Noel's qualifications." Most of Krauss' collecting was done in rustic, back-country conditions. His travels took him to many places, including Malaya, Australia, New Guinea, New Caledonia, Fiji, the mainland, Panama, Guam, Brazil, Mexico, South Africa, West Africa and India. An
