Peter Perkins and other calvarymen battled tanks and machineguns covering Gen. Douglas MacArthur's retreat into Bataan, the Philippines. Perkins and others had eaten their horses because they had run out of food in those early days of World War II; the only food left were their mules, recalled Hawaii resident Bob Allen. Allen, then a Navy ensign on Corregidor, noted that Perkins survived the Bataan Death March. When Perkins was taken to Japan in 1944, an American submarine torpedoed the unmarked prison ship, Allen said. The ship sank, but Perkins survived. Perkins, former Hawaii resident and polo champion, of Paris, Ky., died Sunday Mar 17, 1996 in Del Rey Beach, Fla. He was 78. Perkins was called the world's best arena polo player. Allen, former Hawaii Visitors Bureau president and chief executive officer of Gray Line Hawaii, also was one of Perkins' polo teammates. "He was the highest-rated polo player to live in Hawaii," Allen said. "He was a very fine person and always a gentlemen," he added. "I never saw Peter lose his temper, even on the field." While living in Hawaii, Perkins worked for United Airlines. After leaving Hawaii, he played international polo - in England, France and Argentina. His love of horses stayed with him, as he became a breeder and trainer of thoroughbred race horses. In 1966, he and wife Diane started the San Francisco de Pilar horse farm near Buenos Aires, Argentina. They also ran a horse farm, Wimborne, at Paris, Ky., raising winners.
