Soichi Sakamoto, the famous swim coach who inspired ordinary Hawaii children to become Olympic champions, died last Saturday Aug 2, 1997 at the age of 91. "Olympics first, Olympics always," was Sakamoto's rallying motto, which, according to one of his former students, he first used when he

formed the "Three Year Swim" Club in Puunene, Maui, in 1937. John Tsukano, now 72, a charter member of the club, said Sakamoto asked members to sign a contract in which they agreed to stay in the club for three years. Club members also could not drink, smoke or have serious romantic involvements. "Everything was for the Olympics," Tsukano said. "We were just kids from the plantation, but he made us believe that we could succeed." And they did. Some of the best swimmers in Hawaii were coached by Sakamoto, including Olympic gold and silver medalists Bill Woolsey and Ford Konno, gold medalist Bill Smith and bronze medalist Evelyn Kawamoto Konno. Sakamoto also trained many national swim champions, including Keo Nakama, Jose Balmores, Bunmei Nakama, Halo Hirose and Ivanelle Hoe. He had the ability to spot talent and see their future, said Woolsey, winner at the 1952 Helsinki and 1956 Melbourne Olympics. For Woolsey, Sakamoto was a "counselor, a psychologist, a father (figure)," and more. Woolsey was 15 when he started training with Sakamoto and just 17 when he won his first Olympic medal. Every Sunday, Woolsey said, the "coach" would spend individual time with each of his swimmers. "He would counsel us about our education, our families, swimming and our lives," Woolsey said. Hirose, another member of the club, credits Sakamoto for an innovative breast stroke, a kicking machine and the flip turn free-style swimmers use today. Friends said Sakamoto switched from coaching track and field to swimming because he saw its potential. He coached at the University of Hawaii from 1945 to 1961. Sakamoto, who according to his friends was not a good swimmer himself. inducted into the International Swimming Hall of Fame. Hawaii swimmers hold an annual meet on Maui in his honor. Sam Sanford, a former radio disc jockey and restaurateur known for his pranks and outrageous sense of humor, died Saturday Dec 13, 1997 in his home. He was 68. You're eatin' breakfast with them," Sanford said in a 1975 interview. "So I have to reciprocate. I have my restaurant where people can come and share time with me." Sanford, originally a New Yorker, led a colorful life. From an affluent family, he was thrown out of Yale in his sophomore year. He later joined the Air Force, and he ended up running a bar in the Virgin Islands and then a hotel in Haiti. He was also a newswriter for CBS. Sanford also hosted a radio show called Sounds of the Pacific, which played all Hawaiian music. Ray Sweeney, another close friend and former business associate, said Sanford was part of Hawaii's version of the "Merry Pranksters" of the 1960s who played jokes on one another. Sweeney and Bowen both recalled the time a friend dumped a box full of baby roosters in his studio during a live radio show. Sanford also is survived by wife Sheila; a son, Jacob O'Connell of Pennsylvania, and a daughters, Camilla of San Francisco and Sydney. Valentine Andrew Siefermann - He arrived on Hawaii shores as a young bomber pilot in World War II. He left Hawaii shores as a distinguished and respected major general of the U.S. Air Force. Valentine Andrew Siefermann, 77, of Kaneohe, died on Tuesday Dec 30, 1997, exactly 16 years after he retired as major general under Govs. John Burns and George Ariyoshi. The former adjutant general of Hawaii and director of state Civil Defense also had a love of motorcycles that grew from following one of his son's hobbies. Siefermann became the leader of the pack to form Hawaii Motorsports Association Inc. with a membership of more than 1,000. He also cleared the way for the state's first offroad motorcycle track in the Waialee area near Kahuku. Described as "gung-ho," Siefermann served as the brigadier general of the Hawaii Air National Guard. He pioneered the idea for all Air National Guard units in the nation to report to the major air command. This allowed the Air Guard units to move into action faster without the red tape of command delays. Siefermann was born in New York. He was commissioned in the Army Air Corps in 1942, and piloted fighters and bombers in the Pacific campaign during World War II. He left active service in 1946 to be one of the first to join the Hawaii Air National Guard. Siefermann led the state Air National Guard as its first commander. And in 1953, he earned the rank of brigadier general. He worked with the U.S. Air Force to implement the system that enabled the Air National Guard to assume the Air Force's role in air defense of Hawaii. His system was adopted nationally eight years later. The Hawaii Air National Guard operated both the fighter and radar units in Hawaii's air defense system, and still does to this day. Siefermann's career escalated to adjutant general of Hawaii and Director of State Civil Defense for Gov. Burns in 1973. He then was promoted to rank of major general and served under Burns and later Gov. Ariyoshi until his retirement, Dec. 30, 1981. In addition to family and career, Siefermann became involved in a wide range of business and community activities, including president of Hui Koolau, anorganization covering the area from Heeia to Kualoa. Frank Su'a was more than a warrior in the war on illegal drugs. "He was a crusader," police Maj. Kenneth Tano said of Su'a, retired commander of the Honolulu Police Department's Narcotics/Vice Division who died Tuesday Nov 4 1997 at his Kailua home. "What was notable about him was the intensity and commitment he had to educating the public about the ills and harms of drugs," added Tano, current head of the Narcotics/ Vice Division. "I remember he'd be out there talking to the public night after night." Su'a, 61, retired as a police major in 1989 after 40 years in local law enforcement, including 32 years with HPD. After retiring from HPD, he worked for former U.S. Attorney Daniel Bent as liaison to local law enforcement and

served as Hawaii coordinator of the Western States Information Network, a narcotics intelligence operation. In the late 1980s, Su'a put together a slide presentation on illegal drugs and often talked to community groups on his own time. "He did it because of the kids," Patricia Su'a said of her husband's commitment to educating the public. "He didn't want drugs to get to them.
