Edward Cole Bryan was a leader in the Republican Party and manager of a sugar plantation, but friends recall most his fortitude and optimism despite crippling pain. Bryan, who died May 27, 1997 in Johnson City, Tenn., at the age of 77, was stricken as a young man with a form of arthritis that eventually fused his vertebrae. The condition forced him to use crutches for 30 years, and finally a wheelchair, yet he continued to persevere. "He was a very remarkable man, a real gentleman of the old school," said Robert Gordon, a friend and retired Castle & Cooke Inc. executive. "He never complained, and carried on just like an ordinary person, although he was in terrible pain of most his life. He just was a completely unquenchable guy." Bryan was born in Waialua on Aug. 22, 1919. He graduated from Leilehua High School and went to the Colorado School of Mines on scholarship, earning an engineering degree. He was a captain in the Army Signal Corps during World War II, and in 1947 was named housing director of the former Ewa Plantation Co. It was the start of a 25-year career in the sugar industry that saw him rise to vice president and manager, a position he held from 1962 to 1970. After the plantation was sold, he was a Castle & Cooke vice president for public affairs until leaving in 1972. Bryan was active in Hawaii politics, elected in 1957 to be the Republican Party's territorial chairman. He got headlines and criticism when he agreed to speak at a International Longshore and Warehouse Union convention, at the time associated with radical politics. His forthright speech and demeanor, though, turned the criticism to praise. "I think it was the first time they'd ever seen a plantation boss with an aloha shirt on," recalled William Paty, a former state official and manager of the Waialua sugar plantation. "In those days everybody starched around with a long-sleeve shirt and tie, so he was a very special guy that way." He was a delegate to the 1950 Constitutional Convention delegate, and generated headlines again when he declared for the 1968 convention—and the ILWU endorsed his successful bid. At other times, Bryan chaired the state Land Use Commission, and was on the statehood

commission. He served multiple terms as head the Arthritis Foundation of Hawaii, receiving a national foundation award. He also was active with the Boy Scouts, St. Francis Hospital, the Honolulu Central Seventh-day Adventist Church, the Ewa Community Church, the Calvary-by-the Sea Lutheran Church, Pearl Harbor Rotary Club, Hawaii Medical Library, Hawaii Humane Society, and Hale Mohalu Auxiliary. As a lifelong amateur ham-radio operator, he joined an exclusive club by reflecting his signals off the moon. "He was a rather brilliant man, and his influence was high because he was a child of the land, a keiki o ka aina," Gordon said. Bryan is survived by wife Bennie; sons Michael and Edward; daughters Kathleen Racki, Mary Thielkeld, and Christiane Bintliff; stepchildren W.
