Leon Edel, the Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer of American novelist and critic Henry James, has died at the age of 89. Edel collapsed at his Honolulu home Friday Sep 5, 1997 and was pronounced dead later in the day at Straub Hospital, his wife, Marjorie, said. Edel had undergone surgery about a week and a half before to have a pacemaker implanted for an irregular heart beat, she said. Edel received the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award in 1963 for the second and third volumes of his classic five-volume biography of James. Edel first began teaching in 1932 when he became an assistant professor of English at Sir George Williams University in Montreal. From 1934 to 1943, he was a free-lance writer and journalist and worked in broadcasting. He went to New York University to teach in 1953 and became a full professor in 1955. Edel was named the Citizens Professor of English at the University of Hawaii when he came to Honolulu in 1972. Following retirement in 1978, he continued to lecture at UH and other universities across the country. In addition to his wife, he is survived by a brother, Abraham, of Philadelphia; a niece, Deborah Edel of New Jersey, and three grand-nephews. Funeral services are pending. [SB 09/091997]

William H. "Bill" Ewing was a Southern gent with an eye for news and an appreciation for life in the fast lane. Ewing, who died Monday Jun 30, 1997 night in a retirement home in Yazoo City, Miss., at age 93, worked for 29 years at the Star-Bulletin as a political reporter, city editor, managing editor, editor and assistant to the publisher. He was editor of the newspaper from 1960 through 1965 when the Star-Bulletin had the largest circulation in the state. In a 1963 article for Honolulu Beacon Magazine, Cobey Black described Ewing as a "first-rate newspaperman whose career is a microcosm of the evolution of journalism over the past four decades. "Bill was the dashing press man of the '20s and '30s when personalities dominated the news, when disasters and deeds of daring filled the headlines and reporters lived dangerously. "In the war years of the '40s, he was among the war correspondents and top-flight broadcasters who awakened in the public an international consciousness that was reflected in the cosmopolitan news coverage of the '50s. "In the '60s, he has joined theranks of editors and political columnists who relay news in depth—the thinking man's era of journalism." By the mid-1950s, Ewing was opening new doors for reporters. "We must have been one of the leading newspapers in the country for hiring women reporters," said Star-Bulletin reporter Helen Altonn, who was hired by Ewing in October 1955. Author Tomi Knaefler, a former Star-Bulletin reporter, remembers the ethical standards Ewing established for his reporters. "We couldn't accept gifts or free trips and he set those standards at

a time when it was a common practice to accept that kind of thing," Knaefler said. "When he did it, I thought it was good for us." A.A. "Bud" Smyser, who succeeded Ewing as managing editor and then editor, said his longtime friend was a "demanding and incisive editor." "He wrote the best, most incisive commentary the Star-Bulletin ever carried," Smyser said. In her article. Black points out one encounter involving Ewing and an unnamed Star-Bulletin staffer, who was assigned to interview a lion tamer. Anxious to please her boss, the young reporter entered the lion's cage and did a firsthand story. "You mean you went right into the cage with the lion," Ewing asked the young reporter. "I nodded with pride," she recalled. "Right into the cage?" he asked again. "Yes," she replied. Finally, Ewing said, "And you didn't get any pictures?" The young reporter with a photographer in tow returned to the cage, Black said. The Associated Press sent him to Hawaii to cover the Massie murder case and he became the news service's local bureau chief. Four years later, Ewing joined the Star-Bulletin. The ashes of Ewing, who was born in Jackson, Miss., will be flown to Hawaii for inurnment at the National Cemetery of the Pacific at Punchbowl at a later date.
