Moody Keliihoomalu - Moody Keliihoomalu's job as protocol officer with the state government put him at the front line of greeting kings, prime ministers and presidents when they arrived in Hawaii. When he retired in 1987 he had served 30 years in state jobs that also included election administrator and visitor information specialist with the Department of Transportation. "He loved his job, and his second love was the Special Forces," said Alfred Fernandez of Aiea, a friend who shared years of experiences in the Army Reserve. King performed until the day before his death, playing at the 100th birthday of his high school maestro, Earl Christoph. "He was a guy with a lot of energy," Baltazar said. "If there was jazz, he was always there. He was a true jazz player and a jazz fan." In college, King frequented the jazz clubs of New York where the young musician met Dizzy Gillespie—and jumped in and played with the jazz great. "He was not afraid of sitting in," Baltazar said. "He was not bashful." Just over 5 feet tall, "He was a little guy playing a lot of horn," Baltazar said. King was born in Wahiawa in 1924. William McKinley Klein Jr. had a passion for plants and gardens. A fervent collector, prolific writer and avid preservationist, he was able to help others see the value of plants and related research. As executive director of the National Tropical Botanical Garden, which has four gardens in Hawaii and one in Florida, Klein pushed hard to restore and expand the facilities, their collections of rare tropical and native plants, and their scientific research. Klein, 63, died yesterday Feb 12, 1997 of heart failure while attending a series of meetings and a celebration at the Kampong, the Florida garden.
