Randolph Martin "Randy" Lee Jr. - A taste of old Hawaii charm that lured resident regulars as well as returning visitors was the hallmark of hotel and restaurant executive He was general manager of the prehigh-rise Halekulani Hotel for 16 years and owner of the Willows Restaurant for 13 years before its 1993 closing. Lee, 65, died Monday Sep 8, 1997 in St. Francis Hospice. Friends didn't wait for the eulogy to share their memories and anecdotes about the gracious innkeeper. They prepared a memory book of remembrances and vignettes for a benefit tribute last year sponsored by friends when they learned of his struggle with cancer and medical bills. "The outpouring of love was just unbelievable," said Dick Rodby, president of Kemoo Farms. "He was Hawaii's Princess Diana - he touched so many lives." Entertainer Nalani Olds said that despite his frail health, Lee "could not help acting the gracious host. He was tired but he never let up on being cordial, he wanted to stand up to greet everyone. "He always had the knack to make people feel welcome and special," Olds said. "One of his qualities, when he engaged you in conversation, he only spoke to you. He was really

interested, he remembered what you said, he remembered your children by name." What kamaainas and visitors remember best is the "kamaaina luncheon" that Lee instituted at the old Halekulani, reincarnated as the "poi luncheon" at the Willows, the setting for many people's special celebrations. The format was Hawaiian food served with class and Hawaiian entertainment with impromptu special appearances by well-known entertainers. "Those luncheon shows were more like a family luau, not a show," said Rodby. "He got me started doing them at Kemoo; Randy was more refined - ours were more Haleiwa style." Olds said she was 16 when she began dancing hula at the Halekulani oceanside shows, and numerous other entertainers were given a start by Lee. Under Lee's administration, cuisine at the Halekulani restaurants and the Willows received awards from gourmet and travel magazines. He was honored by local restaurant and hotel associations. "When things were going good, the training table for St. Louis (athletes) was the Willows. They could go there and have a meal anytime," Olds recalled. Lee was a 1950 graduate of St. Louis High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in social sciences at Georgetown University. Before joining the Halekulani, he worked at Hawaiian Airlines, Hotel Hana on Maui and the Mauna Kea Beach Hotel on the Big Island. He is survived by his wife, Sunny Jean; sons Randolph M. Launa Love said she never told her 77year-old husband of the dispute while he was in Kaiser Hospital with pneumonia. "(Yesterday) was the day that they told us to get off the beach, but we had lawyers, so we didn't have to go," she said, adding lawyers Richard Gronna and John Goemans are helping her. "Hopefully, things will work out for the best, and I'll still be able to operate down there in Turkey's name," Launa Love said. "He was so much full of fun and life, and he loved the old Hawaiian ways," she said. "He was a wonderful father, husband and friend." A Japanese firm now owns the recently closed Waikikian Hotel and Tahitian Lanai, and Aston Hotels and Resorts helps look after the property. Aston said the longtime beach concession offering kayaks, pedal boats and air floats would have to go, and news stories brought out community support to keep the beach concession in place. Love had operated the concession for over a quarter-century under an informal agreement with the previous owners. Love would arrive at the beach concession at 7 a.m. seven days a week. His freckles, said to resemble spots on a turkey egg, earned him his nickname. His boyhood idol was Sam Kahanamoku, Duke Kahanamoku's brother. "I learned everything from Sam," he had said. "I watched him all the time." Love grew up in Waikiki and became a part of the golden era that brought famous celebrities to the famous beach. "Those were the coat-and-tie days," he later said. "And before that there were the hat, coat and tie days." "He's definitely one of the legendary old-time Waikiki beach boys," said Grady Timmons, author of the book "Waikiki Beachboy." Love became Henry Kaiser's beach boy when Kaiser opened the Hawaiian Village, Timmons said. "I think he spent about 50 years on the beach." Before moving to the lagoon, he was a beach boy fronting the Royal Hawaiian and Moana hotels, Timmons said. "He

was known as one of Waikiki's best canoe steersman." Ellen Chun Lum was an accomplished oil painter who designed the original prints for what came to be known as "aloha shirts." "I think she'd rather be remembered as a landscape oil painter," Arthur Lum said, referring to his mother, who died Feb. 22, 1997 at her Honolulu home. She was 82. "To make a living, she had to do commercial art," he added. In 1936, Ellen Lum's hand-painted designs of the malolo (flying fish), kihikihi (Moorish Idol fish), a Hawaiian man fishing at night by torchlight and an abstract tapa print were transferred onto Fuji silk short-sleeve shirts and sold exclusively by King-Smith Clothiers for \$1.95 apiece. Ellen's brother, Ellery Chun, called them "aloha shirts" and registered the name. The primary colors of the original shirts were brown, black, navy blue, cobalt blue and green. Contemporary versions of the original prints—especially malolo and kikikihi— are featured on shirts today. "If she hadn't done the first production runs, I just wonder what we would be looking at today," said Arthur Lum, a Punahou School graduate like his mother. Ellen Lum earned a degree in home economics from the University of Hawaii the same year aloha shirts made their debut. She was, however, very interested in art and fashion design. Encouraged by artists Millard Sheets and Huc-Mazelet Luquiens, Lum attended to Chouinard School of Art in California. Her paintings have been on display at the Honolulu Academy of Arts. Lum, however, had to become a working artist to pay bills. She bought the family clothing business founded by her father, Chun Kam Chow, from Ellery in 1950 and relocated King-Smith Sportswear to Kalakaua Avenue.
