Heine Kamai, 66, helped perpetuate Hawaiian spirit His participation in the Royal Order of Kamehameha was key interest in life for Heine Ikaika Kamai. His succession to the top state office, alii nui, had him planning for the future at a time when he knew his health was failing. "He was concerned about our plan to go into the next century, how we can help the Hawaiian people and make sure the order is still viable into the 21st century," said Francis Ching, high talking chief of the order. "He was a quiet and very

effective leader. He was a good teacher. He was very strong in his convictions. "He was intent on getting as many people involved as possible and to let it grow . . . to be more visible but in a dignified way," Ching said. The organization was created in 1863 by King Kamehameha V. As a fraternal society with limited membership, it has not been as politically active nor publicly visible as other Hawaiian community or advocacy organizations. "Shiro, of course, was a very close friend of mine and one who did a great job as attorney general," said former Gov. William Quinn. "I appointed him because I needed a good person, and I thought he fit the qualifications very well." Quinn had worked closely with Kashiwa on a number of things before statehood. "As an attorney general he did a great job," he said. Kashiwa reviewed the joint operating agreement of the Advertiser and Star-Bulletin that allows the two Honolulu dailies to save costs by combining printing, advertising sales and distribution while keeping ownership, news staffs and editorial policies separate. Kashiwa found no reason to challenge the agreement. Kashiwa was retired as a judge in the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Washington, D.C. His legal career included serving as an associate judge on the U.S. Court of Claims and earlier as an assistant attorney general under President Nixon. Honors he received included the Order of the Sacred Treasure, with gold and silver star, in 1995 from the government of Japan. That award cited his achievement as the first American of Japanese ancestry to receive presidential appointments to the top positions he held—and also praised his "good faith effort in adjustments to exclude misinterpretations of law and eliminate misunderstandings between Japan and the United States." He was named Outstanding Nisei by the Japanese American Citizens League in 1970. On Jan. 14 of that year, he became the first nisei and the first member of the Hawaii bar to represent the United States before the U.S. Supreme Court, in arguing an eminent domain

Edward Kato of Kalaupapa said it was the proudest accomplishment of his life when he took part in the 1995 burial of a relic of Father Damien DeVeuster beside the Kalawao church built by the 19th century missionary. "I told him, 'You demonstrate what Damien was in many ways. No matter what curve ball is thrown at you, you can do your utter best. You endured with grace and great style,'" said the Rev. Joseph Bukoski, head of the Edward Kato commission that coordinated local participation in the beatification of Damien by Pope John Paul II that year. Kato, 80, who lived at Kalaupapa since he contracted Hansen's Disease at the age of 19, died Sunday Feb 15, 1998 in Hale Mohalu hospital after a long battle with cancer. He was retired as manager of the Kalaupapa Store. He was an artist who depicted the place where he lived and the church Damien built in numerous paintings, most of which he gave away to friends and acquaintances. And he became a world traveler as soon as the mandatory quarantine of patients was lifted in the 1960s. "He tried to touch bases all over the world," recalled Edward Lau of Honolulu, Kato's friend and fishing companion. "He had a lot of friends all over the world. The only place he didn't go was South America and the Middle East. He was unique for someone who comes from Kalaupapa. No one traveled, they were afraid to. He kind of spearheaded the idea." "Ed was one of driving factors that kept the Lions Club going," Lau said. Kato was secretary and treasurer of the Kalaupapa chapter of the service organization for many years. "He always helped the community, he did all the sign-painting for the community." Kato was named the Maui County Outstanding Older American Man in 1996 in recognition of more than 50 years of volunteer service. "He would never talk bad about anyone in all the years I knew him," said Lau. "He was generous to a fault, an all-around good guy." The Rev. He loved Molokai and the settlement. “He had the soul of an artist, not just painting but music and anything that pertained to beauty.” He was not the kind of person to talk about regrets, said his sister, Janice Kupelian of Honolulu. One of those unspoken disappointments was in 1994 when Kato was slated to meet the pope and participate in the Damien beatification. The event was postponed at the last moment because the pope was injured in a fall. By the time the event was rescheduled, he was unable to travel, but was happy with the hometown celebration. “He was a person who, even with his own pains and hurts, smiled forth with God’s goodness. I can picture his beaming smile,” said Bukoski. A funeral Mass will be said at 10:30 a.m. March 5 at St. Pius X Church in Honolulu. Friends may call after 9 a.m. A memorial Mass will be held Monday at St. Francis Church in Kalaupapa. His fishing companions will scatter his ashes in the water off Kalaupapa. Kato was born on Maui. Paul Weissich, director emeritus of the Honolulu Botanical Gardens who met her at the institute, said she was “a great advocate for Hawaiian culture.” He said she told celebrants at her 80th birthday party, “I may be haole on the outside, but I’m 100 percent Hawaiian on the inside.” Weissich said she was interested in Hawaiian native plants and “anything the Hawaiians used and how they used it.” She was “sort of an anthropologist” as well as a botanist, he said. “Sort of a hybrid mix—an ethnobotanist. She was ahead of her time. Nowadays it’s very popular to be concerned about things Hawaiian. Thirty-five or 40 years ago, it wasn’t.” Charles Lamoureux, Lyon Arboretum director, said Krauss had at least three careers. When the pineapple institute closed, she went to UH to teach ethnobotany. It was so popular, he said, that it grew from one to six sections a semester. And it was all pro bono, he said. “She was a person of extremely high principles. She wasn’t paid because she didn’t believe in the loyalty oath and refused to sign it,” he said. Lamoureux said Krauss “knew everybody and worked with anybody, and anybody who came to her with a request she would help.” She gave of her

time, knowledge and even money, he said. "She was always helping students of the university." She wrote many books. Her last was "Plants in Hawaiian Culture," considered a classic. As a language specialist, he was assigned to the 27th Infantry Division, taking part in invasions of Makin, Majuro, Saipan, Tsugenjima and Okinawa. He interrogated prisoners, translated documents and took part in persuading Japanese soldiers, holed up in caves, to surrender. He returned to Hawaii after the war, working for Hunt Foods.
