Ichiro “Iron” Maehara, the professional baseball scout who discovered and signed Sid Fernandez for the Los Angeles Dodgers, is remembered by the retired major league pitcher as a giving person.

“As a baseball man, he helped a lot of people,” Fernandez said of Maui’s “Mr. Baseball,” 88, who died of cancer Monday Apr 6, 1998 at Kahului Hale Makua. “He treated everyone fairly—someone you could always trust—and was very humble.” Fernandez, who pitched 15 years in the big leagues before retiring last August, sat next to Maehara recently at the dedication of Iron Maehara Stadium in Wailuku. “I’m glad they did it while he was still alive,” Fernandez said. “It was well deserved for what he has done for the community and baseball here.” Maehara also signed Onan Masaoka, a left-handed pitcher from Waiakea High on the Big Island, for the Dodgers. The Puunene native, the eldest of 10 children, guided the Maui AJA Baseball League for many years and was instrumental in setting up spring training on Maui for Japanese professional baseball teams such as the Hanshin Tigers and Yakult Swallows. There was much more to his life than baseball. Maehara retired from Hawaiian Commercial & Sugar as a division overseer in December 1970 after 42 years with the company to join Mayor Elmer Cravalho’s administration as director of Parks and Recreation. He later became Cravalho’s administrative assistant. “Through his actions, he was able to demonstrate the definition of community,” Cravalho said. “History will be kind to him when it recognizes his many contributions to people.” Maehara, an outstanding ballplayer, earned the nickname “Iron” because he could play every position. His association with the Dodgers dates back to the mid-1960s, when the National League team sent coaches Junior Gilliam, Duke Snider and Red Adams to Maui to assist the Tokyo Orions, who were training there, Maehara’s wife of nearly 60 years said. “He would go down after work and serve as an interpreter,” Florence Maehara added. “Red Adams told him he knew a lot about baseball and got the Dodgers to make him a bird dog (talent scout).” Maehara’s father was a Japanese

language school principal and his mother was a teacher. He gave up going to college to help raise the family. "He was like my father, and people thought my father was my grandfather," said Patrick Maehara, the youngest sibling. "He was a community-oriented person, always doing things to help others." Maunupau Jr., 72, who died Dec. 6, 1998. And Maunupau would just love that, said his niece Ku'ulei Minchew. He was concerned that people learn their language and culture long before the Hawaiian renaissance of the past 15 years. "I remember walking with him and he would walk up to any Hawaiian, anytime, with no shame or fear, and ask 'Do you know your language, do you know your history?' He was rejected 95 percent of the time. People would walk away and say, 'I'm not interested.' He'd still walk up to the next Hawaiian and try again." Maunupau was the son of Thomas K. Maunupau, who was fluent in the language and served as interpreter for Bishop Museum researchers. Minchew said her uncle felt the traditional style of the Hawaiian language was being lost. "He would seek out kupuna, and picked up the pattern of the way they spoke. He taught language on the musical sound of how they spoke. That was his lifelong goal, to learn first the secrets of the language." Maunupau taught the language as a volunteer at the Women's Community Correctional Center and Waiawa Correctional Facility and in various community programs. Rose Moe performed Hawaiian music for six decades. Hawaiian music ambassador Rose Moe, who strummed the ukulele and guitar for six decades around the world, died Friday Dec 18, 1998 at age 90. Moe of Laie, who won the Hawaii Musicians Award as a living legend, traveled with her husband, Tau, playing Hawaiian music from Paris to Rangoon. They met Gandhi in India, where Rose gave birth to their son Lani during riots. A taxi equipped with dual machine guns escorted Rose to the hospital for his birth. They also met Adolf Hitler in Germany at a fund-raiser for German orphans. The Moes feared the meeting because they smuggled many Jewish musician friends out of the country. A few years ago, Tau Moe said that guards once asked Rose why she wore three fur coats. She was smuggling out furs that belonged to their Austrian agent. Rose answered: "I'm from Hawaii so I get very cold." The Moes began their amazing adventure in the 1920s when they left Hawaii as teen-agers to work for Madame Riviere, a French ambassador touring the colonial outposts of Europe. They performed with Madame

Riviere's Hawaiians, a group of musicians and dancers, according to Bob Brozman, an authority on historical Hawaiian music. In the 1930s, the Moes went independent. They toured Singapore, the Middle East, Germany, Italy and India. The family found many fans of Hawaiian music in Egypt, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Switzerland, Russia, Denmark, England, Sweden and Finland. Tau, who survived Rose, once said he believed the greatest number of musicians and fans of Hawaii are found in Scotland, where fans asked them many questions about Hawaii, according to Tony Tadar's "The Golden Years of Hawaiian Entertainment." The Moes retired to Hawaii in the 1980s and were rediscovered by Brozman, who released numerous albums documenting the best of Hawaiian music from 1915 to 1935. Brozman said he was rummaging through a San Francisco basement in the 1970s when he came upon a series of rare Hawaiian records. One recording by Madame Riviere's Hawaiians made a deep impression on him. "I was struck by the deep, ethnic, emotionally laden music," Brozman wrote. A decade later, Brozman, known for his large 78-rpm Hawaiian record collection, almost dropped the phone when Tau Moe called him. Brozman recorded a landmark album of the Moes in 1986. The historic recreation of the family's Hawaiian music from 60 years ago received rave international reviews, including the Library of Congress Select List Award. Sam "Steamboat" Mokuahi Sr., 80, who created lifelong memories of Waikiki Beach for countless visitors and children, died Tuesday Jun 16, 1998. He was a legend—one of the last great oldtime surfers, lifeguards and beachboys, the unofficial "Mayor of Waikiki." Big, strong and bronzed from a life in the sun until well in his 70s, Mokuahi had a gentle heart and befriended people from all over the world, family and friends said yesterday. He had supporting roles in several films made in Hawaii, such as "The Old Man and the Sea," and took folks like actors David Niven and Alan Ladd canoe-riding. "He was a perfect gentleman," Ken "Squirrel" Carvalho

recalled. “He called everybody ‘laddy—laddy boy.’ He danced hula at my wedding.” Harry S. Robello said, “We were buddy-buddy when he first came on the beach, way back, right after the (Second World) War. He started as a lifeguard and ended up a beachboy. He did everything—surfboard, steer canoe.” Mokuahi once explained that he got the name “Steamboat” because his great-great-great-grandfather was born on a steamship coming to Hawaii. “My grandmother translated the name into Hawaiian, which is Mokuahi,” Mokuahi Sr said. All those who carry the Mokuahi name are proud of it, whether they are hanai or blood-related, said his nephew, Kevin Mokuahi, Lokahi Canoe Club coach. He said his uncle “made everybody feel like family.” Mokuahi was born in Honolulu and taught himself to surf as a child at Kakaako, when ironing boards were used as surfboards. He would cut a piece of plywood, Kevin Mokuahi said, and tell kids, “Here, take this out and catch some waves.” His uncle had a business but was always giving people surfboards because he wanted them to enjoy the ocean, Mokuahi said. “If they had no money, he’d say, ‘Take the board out and bring it back.’ ” He said his uncle’s Waikiki hangout was mostly in front of Duke Kahanamoku’s in the Outrigger Canoe Club—where canoes will gather at 8:30 a.m. June 27 to scatter his ashes.

Michael J. "Jerry" Murphy, a former Star-Bulletin reporter who spent nearly two decades as a public relations professional before crossing back to reporting and column writing for another 20 years, died Friday Apr 17, 1998

in Castle Hospital. He was 74. As a public relations man whose job was to get stories about his employers published in the media, Murphy was respected by journalists because they knew his heart was on their side of the fence. "He was kind of a natural news guy," said Charles Regal, a Seattle newspaperman who also made the switch to public relations and worked with Murphy when both were with Matson Navigation Co. Noting how Murphy got back into writing and editing after 14 years with Matson and another few years in government public relations, Regal said: "He ventured into public relations for a little bit, but he returned." After working for some years on East Coast papers, Murphy, who was born in Waterbury, Conn., was recruited by then-editor Riley Allen and joined the Star-Bulletin in 1953. He was with the newspaper until 1956, serving as general assignment reporter and later specializing as military writer. Murphy was proud of his military service. He fought in the Army "for three years and 11 days" in World War II, he used to say, serving in Europe and making it into the Pacific just about the time the war ended. Lyle Nelson, who started as a Star-Bulletin reporter a few years before Murphy, recalls him as a good reporter who was "always a friendly type." "Matson took him away from us," Nelson said. Murphy, who joined the company in the days when it still had passenger ships, was named Matson's Hawaii public relations manager in 1958, and in 1969 won the same title at Matson's parent, Alexander & Baldwin Inc. He left in 1970, telling friends he wasn't really happy with corporate public relations, but soon landed another job as information officer for the Honolulu Board of Water Supply. It wasn't until 1974 that Murphy returned to his first love, newspapers, working for a local weekly, Wind Word in his home town of Kailua, and from 1978 on at the Sun Press papers. He was editor of the Windward Sun Press and wrote a weekly column for the paper on diverse issues, often interspersed with wartime memories. After some staff reductions two years ago, he wrote the column from his Kailua home on a free-lance basis. "He was a good newspaperman," said Ken Berry, publisher of the Sun Press papers and MidWeek. "He was people-oriented and he had a nose for news. He was a quick thinker. I think he was good because he knew the territory better than the young reporters, and of course he demonstrated his writing style in his popular Sun Press column that should have got him syndicated." Murphy, whose wife Carolyn died in 1989, is survived by sons Michael Damien Murphy and Matthew Duncan Murphy, daughter Gael Marie Cookman and four grandchildren.
