Charlie Chung - As a teen-ager, Charlie Chung first learned to play golf using guava sticks for clubs. He was a caddy at the Oahu Country Club who went on to become the first Chinese-American to win the Manoa Cup in 1924 and 1925 and was the first local champion to win the Hawaiian Open in 1930. Chung of Honolulu died Friday Jul 3, 1998 at Kaneohe's Aloha Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. He was 95. His newspaper and magazine clips say he was the world's first Chinese-American golf professional. The clips, put together by his family over two years as a present on Chung's 81st birthday, fill four scrapbooks. "His career was real short. It was only 10 to 12 years, but he accomplished quite a number of firsts," said his son, Ronald. Chung said his father broke many racial barriers: the first nonwhite to play in an amateur tournament at Pebble Beach in 1925, a member of the Professional Golf Association before the bylaws were changed to allow nonwhites, hired as a golf pro by the Redlands Country Club, one of the country's oldest private clubs, in 1926. His father never talked about discrimination on the golf course. "He was a poor Chinese guy who was a very good golfer," Chung said. "All these rich guys used to take him golfing. Dad said he always took their money." Chung returned to Hawaii in 1929 to become the pro at the Moanalua Golf Course. He went on to be a pro at the Maui Country Club and was manager of the Pali Golf Course from 1957 to 1970. Chung was a contemporary of Francis Brown. They were both invited to play in the California state amateur tournament in 1925. With victories in the Manoa Cup behind him, Chung ended Brown's four-year dominance of the tournament. Jack M. Crandall - Longtime Star-Bulletin newsman Jack M. Crandall, who died Tuesday Mar 3, 1998 at his Kahaluu home at age 90, had two consuming passions—golf and newspapering. Oddly, the first led him to the second. As a boy in Depression-era Chicago, young Jack started hanging around the country clubs, where he'd heard you could pick up the princely sum of 50 cents caddying for the golfers of the upper crust. A few of those payoffs a day went a long way toward helping mom and the family. Along

the way, he picked up a real affinity for the game (he eventually worked as a pro at one of the clubs), becoming a fine golfer as well as a prized caddy. And it was in that capacity that he got involved in what would be his life's work. He caddied for newspaper mogul William Randolph Hearst. Crandall snagged a job in 1934 as a cub reporter in the sports department of the old Herald-Examiner. He moved to the rough-and-tumble news side (it was in Al Capone's heyday) a year later and never looked back. He worked for several Chicago papers and some in Pennsylvania before taking a job in 1947 at the Denver Post, where he became news editor. He came to the Star-Bulletin in 1956, worked a year as telegraph editor and returned to Denver. But Hawaii beckoned, and he was back in just seven months to become copy desk chief and then news editor of the Star-Bulletin. He served in other capacities before his retirement in 1974. A Star-Bulletin editor once wrote of Crandall: "He knows his way around the shop, knows where the lost can be found. He can ferret out solutions for almost anything that can go wrong in news-page makeup. He says it's all happened before. To him." So he was accustomed to frustration—but probably never more so than when, at age 73 while enjoying a game of golf on the Bayview course at Kaneohe, he hit a 7-iron shot and a spray of water flew up and hit him in the eye. He told columnist Dave Donnelly the water blinded him momentarily, that he wiped his eyes but couldn't see the ball. So he hit a provisional shot. It wasn't until he reached the green that he learned he'd hit a hole-in-one, his first in 63 years of golfing. And the worst part: There were no witnesses. Crandall was a former state chairman of Sigma Delta Chi professional journalism fraternity and was an elder of the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
