He belonged to the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 1260. His wife, Roxanna Laheamanu Ako Davis, called him a gentle bear who was always there with a helping hand. "He never asked for anything in return," she said. "Wayne was just such a very humble person." Davis once gave his last \$25 to a man just out of prison who needed a birth certificate and state identification card to get a job, she said. A week later the man robbed a bank and was apprehended. Although he had hoped the man would go straight, he never tried to get the money back, his wife said. "He gave with aloha, he wasn't angry," she recalled.
