Hitoshi "Hank" Sato was an outstanding journalist who had a tremendous sense of history. Having that sense of history served him well. Sato, a former assistant city editor for the Star-Bulletin, died May 2,

2005 at Kuakini Medical Center. He was 77. Sato was born and raised in Lahaina and attended Lahainaluna High School. In 1949 he enlisted in the Army and trained in Monterey, Calif., where he was taught Japanese to interrogate prisoners. After he was discharged in February 1953, Sato attended Ohio University in Athens, Ohio, where he majored in journalism. Soon after he graduated, he worked as a reporter for the Honolulu Star-Bulletin at its BigIsland bureau. Sato then moved to the Star-Bulletin's Maui bureau, but later took a job with the Maui News. After covering local news and the Legislature for the isle newspaper, he was hired at the Honolulu Advertiser. "He wrote very many poignant stories on the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor," Chuck Frankel, former assistant city editor and news editor, said. He also wrote about the Honouliuli internment camp on Leeward Oahu where many Japanese Americans were interned. Sato then worked as a reporter for United Press International in Honolulu before he was transferred to its Tokyo bureau in 1966. In 1970 he returned to Hawaii and worked as an assistant city editor at the Star-Bulletin. Sato was a mild-mannered, quiet man who was respected by his co-workers, reporter Helen Altonn said. After Sato retired, columnist Ben Wood and former business reporter Russ Lynch recalled how they would receive letters in the mail of clipped articles with typos circled by Sato. "If I made a mistake in the column, I would get it in the mail," Wood laughed. "It was some sarcastic remark." Wood noted that Sato was a valuable man on the copy desk, where he worked as a copy editor before he retired in 1993. Sato's wife, Harumi, said he was fluent in Japanese and enjoyed every moment of his journalism career, especially covering politics. She added that her husband was a patient man who enjoyed playing tennis weekly and fishing with his brothers in Maui. He was also very proud of his brother, Tadashi, a well-known artist. Sato and his wife celebrated their 50th anniversary last month. Frankel said Sato will be remembered among his colleagues for his integrity and knowledge of local history. "He knew what happened in Hawaii, and he was able to relate to local politicians and what they were striving for to make a fair Hawaii for everyone," he added. Tadashi Sato, one of the most important Hawaii artists to emerge out of World War II, has died on his home island of Maui. Sato, whose circular floor mural "Aquarius" is on permanent display at the state Capitol courtyard, died Saturday, June 4, 2005 from complications due to cancer. Sato, born on Maui on Feb. 6, 1923, was 82. "I think what he was uniquely able to do was combine aspects of modern art with influences from the landscapes of Hawaii," said Jay Jensen, associate director and chief curator of the Contemporary Museum in Honolulu. Artist Satoru Abe said Sato, whose brush strokes were unique, was a "great artist." "No one else painted the way he did, and probably no one will," Abe said. Ben Kikuyama, a Maui artist, said Sato gave him boxes of pastel crayons when he was a young, aspiring artist and later offered him sound advice when a critic told him to take some art classes. "He said, 'Don't worry about that, just find your own voice,'" Kikuyama recalled. "He felt it was more important to find your own style. He talked about Van Gogh and his own style." A fisherman who enjoyed being close to the ocean, many of Sato's abstract expressionist paintings captured the ethereal, unifying and reflective quality of water. The grandson of a sumi painter in Japan and son of a Lahaina candy store owner, Sato was among the group of Japanese-American veterans who developed as artists in New York after World War II. Sato, who worked as a security guard at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, got his break one night when actors Charles Laughton and Burgess Meredith and a Broadway producer visited his apartment to see his works. They bought seven paintings, with Laughton acquiring three of them. Sato, who later moved

back to Maui, said from that point on, he could work as a full-time artist. Some of his artworks on public display include a floor mural entitled "Submerged Rocks and Water Reflections" at the Shinmachi Tsunami Memorial in Hilo and a painting titled "Nakalele" at the Hawai'i Convention Center in Honolulu. Sato's daughter Janice Shimamura said he was a humble man who felt fortunate to be able to do something that he enjoyed for a living and wanted to share his art with the public. "He wanted his art to be accessible to everyone," she said. Sato is survived also by sisters Fumiko Sugai and Keiko Sato, and son-in-law Mark Shimamura. Visitation with the family starts at 2 p.m. June 17, followed by the funeral at 3 p.m. at Kahului Union Church. [SB June 9, 2005]

Tadashi Sato is known for his spare and subtle abstract compositions, but there is nothing spare or subtle about his stature in the art world. "He was one of Hawai'i's master artists," said James Jensen, associate director and chief curator of the Contemporary Museum in Honolulu. Sato died Saturday June 4, 2005 at age 82, but his legacy lives on in museums, private collections and public art displays from Honolulu to New York, including the Guggenheim Museum and Whitney Museum of American Art. Born Feb. 6, 1923, Sato served in the Army in the Pacific during World War II and went on to attend Cannon School of Business in Honolulu before pursuing his artistic talents at the Honolulu Academy of Arts and then the Brooklyn School of Art in New York. He returned to Honolulu to teach classes at McKinley Adult School, but went back to New York in hopes of making a name for himself in the art world. Sato's break came while he was working as a museum security guard. A friend who was a movie extra introduced him to actors Charles Laughton and Burgess Meredith, who were both art collectors. During a 1999 interview, Sato said Laughton, Meredith and some other actors came to his apartment at the urging of his friend. He remembered Laughton staring at one painting with a seemingly critical eye and after a long silence announced in his cultured accent: "My friend, this is pure poetry." Before the party was over, the actors bought six or seven works, and Sato promptly called his boss at the museum to quit. Sato, who painted with signature delicate, crosshatched brushstrokes, went on to do three one-man shows at the Willard Gallery in New York. But by 1960, Sato decided to move his young family back to Maui, where he opened a studio on Front Street and later built a studio in the rear of his Wahikuli home. Masaru "Pundy" Yokouchi remembers reading in the newspaper about Sato's return to Maui so, curious, he decided to visit his studio. "I walked in and he looked up at me like, 'Who are you?' " said Yokouchi, now

chairman of the Maui Arts & Cultural Center. Yokouchi ended up spending the entire day with him and then got "carried away" in handing over his first real estate dividend check — the whole \$1,000 — to buy two of his paintings. Yokouchi and Sato remained friends over the years. In 1965 Sato was honored by President Lyndon Johnson at the White House Festival of Arts, alongside Georgia O'Keefe, Jackson Pollock and other American artists. Later he was named a Living Treasure of Hawai'i by the Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i. Perhaps his most famous work is "Aquarius," the 36-by-36-foot circular mosaic that adorns the floor of the State Capitol atrium. The piece depicts submerged rocks and water reflections. Visitation will begin at 2 p.m. June 17 at Kahului Union Church, with a service at 3 p.m. The family requests casual attire and no flowers. Sato of Honolulu, Hawaii and Charlotte, North Carolina, died on April 15, 2005 in Presbyterian Hospital, Charlotte, North Carolina due to complications from pulmonary fibrosis at the age of 72. Mr. Sato was born on January 2, 1933 in Honolulu, Hawaii. He graduated from Iolani School in 1952 and went on the University of Hawaii. He later served in the US Army's Cold Weather Mountain Rescue unit in Texas. After being discharged from the Army, Mr. Sato moved to Los Angeles and being an avid semi-professional bowler, worked in the bowling business. he married Salome Shin of Honolulu in 1960, and shortly after opened his own business called Kapukai Lanes, a bowling alley and restaurant in Cucamonga, California. In 1968 a disastrous flood destroyed the business, and he returned to Hawaii with his family in 1970. Upon returning to Hawaii, Mr. Sato worked for Servco Pacific. Over his years of service in Servco, he worked at Kailua Toyota, Motor Imports, Servco Marine,

McWayne Marine and Lexus. In 1990, was married to Joann Ray of Lubbock, Texas. They met through mutual friends at Hawaii Baptist Academy where he served on the Advisory Council. At HBA, he contributed to the advancement of the school by assisting them in acquiring land and vehicles. In 1992, he retired from Servco as a group vice-president and general manager of the Servco Lexus division. After retirement, the couple moved to Dallas, Texas for a year before relocating to a retirement community, Hide-A-Way Lake, in East Texas. They moved once again in 1998 to Lubbock, where they lived until 2002. At that time, they relocated to Charlotte, North Carolina to be near family. Mr. Sato's health began to decline and in 2005 they made plans to return to Hawaii. Weeks before he was to return to his place of birth, Mr. Sato became hospitalized. David C. Schutter - Former prominent Hawaii trial attorney David C. Schutter who dominated local headlines in the 1970s and '80s for winning freedom for high-profile defendants, died yesterday June 10, 2005 at the Kailua home of his son Chris. He was 64. Former law partner and former Gov. Ben Cayetano said, "David was a brilliant lawyer, easily one of the best over the past thirty years." Schutter was often seen driving around town in one of his two cars with personalized license plates; a Rolls Royce

reading “SUE EM” or a red Ferrari reading “LITIGR.” He worked on many criminal as well as civil cases in Hawaii from 1969 until 1997, when he suffered a stroke while at the state courthouse. Doctors predicted he would be reduced to a vegetative state, but after rehabilitation at the Craig’s Institute in Colorado for six months, Schutter was able to return to Hawaii. He lived an active life, attending University of Hawaii sporting events, going to movies and frequently dining out. “He defied the medical experts and all odds,” said Chris Schutter, one of David’s sons who referred to his father as his “best friend” and often dined with him at Nicholas Nickolas, the restaurant renamed Aaron’s atop the Ala Moana Hotel. “He enjoyed those years and spent a lot of quality time with his family, who meant a lot to him ... especially his five grandsons and great-granddaughter.” In May, Schutter was taken to the Queen’s Medical Center for internal bleeding in his brain. On June 16, he suffered a massive stroke, this time to the right side of his brain. The one in 1997 had been on the left side. His family took him out of Queens. “The decision was made by myself and my three brothers that we would bring him home ... there was not much more they could do for him,” Chris Schutter said today. On Wednesday, with former Gov. Ben Cayetano, state Supreme Court Justice James Duffy and other friends at their side, family members removed his feeding tube. Schutter, whose firm took in more than \$1 million a year at times, represented prominent figures such as U.S. Rep. Neil Abercrombie, Mufi Hannemann, Alfred Ruis, Robert Hall and Rodney Kiyota. He also grilled “Hawaii Five-O” star Jack Lord in a 1975 trial in a breach-of-contract case and 20 years later, helped file a class-action lawsuit against the former Honfed bank (now Bank of America), alleging fraud and deceptive trade practices. Throughout his life, Schutter owned several properties and businesses, including a 17-bedroom Kahala estate that was once listed at \$45 million. Besides his law firm, he also owned several restaurants, a travel agency and a Waikiki night club. Schutter, who always wanted to become a lawyer, began debating in the fourth grade in Appleton, Wis. He entered Marquette University in 1958 and graduated in 3 1/2 years with a 3.5 grade point average and cum laude honors. He continued his education at the University of Wisconsin, where he graduated at the top of his class with a law degree. In 1965, Schutter began criminal defense work in Phoenix with the firm Lewis & Roca and worked with noted lawyer John Flynn, who defended Ernesto Miranda in the landmark Supreme Court case that eventually led to the “Miranda rights,” which must be read to every person upon arrest. After three years with the company, Schutter was forced to move to Hawaii because the Arizona 277th National Guard reserve unit he belonged to was relocated to Schofield Barracks. He was a corporal.

Schutter and fellow guardsman Henry Peters, who later became a state House speaker and Bishop Estate trustee, led a petition revolt that garnered 1,500 signatures to deactivate the 29th Infantry Brigade, so the infantry and Schutter's reserve unit would not have to go to war. The effort failed, and Schutter served for a short time in Vietnam. He returned to Hawaii in 1969, started his own law office and was elected president of the Honolulu Young Democrats. He grew to love Hawaii. On non-court days, he would toss the coat and tie, and pad around town in shorts and bare feet. Eleven years later, Schutter was the target of criticism after winning a plea deal for Rodney Kiyota, who was accused of murder in the 1976 stabbing death of Jeanine Kansaki. The deal meant 10 years in prison rather than a life sentence. Schutter also used the "white wine defense" in winning an acquittal in the early 1980s for Robert Hall, who was accused of attempted murder in the shooting of developer Rodney Inaba and three others at the Waikiki Yacht Club. Schutter and experts said an ingredient in white wine caused a brain dysfunction that resulted in "pathological intoxication" so Hall could not control his actions. "He had an incredible ability as a lawyer who fought for the proverbial underdog," said Paul Smith a former partner in Schutter's law firm. "I remember one time he was in court arguing his case to the jury, and he seemed to be the only person in the courtroom because he was so dominant and had become the center of attention." At one time, Schutter concentrated on civil law. He also was a law partner of Cayetano, who was then a state senator. "There are many highly intelligent lawyers in town but what separated David from the rest was his overpowering will to win, his willingness to take big risks and is extraordinary ability to connect with jurors and persuade them to his cause," Cayetano said. "He was innovative and often would take cases which other lawyers would not touch." Speaking of father, Chris Schutter told the Star-Bulletin today, "I remember a very compassionate, loving man. He loved nothing more in life than his children and his grandchildren. If he wasn't in court or in his office the remainder of his free time was spent with his grandchildren and his sons...and playing tennis. "Golf, tennis and his family were his loves....he was an avid sports fan." In 1981, Schutter donated \$25,000 to start the nonprofit Schutter Foundation, which wanted to "ban handguns in Hawaii and help develop a criminal justice system that was more effective and accountable." Schutter, who was born Sept. 2, 1940 and adopted by a Wisconsin couple six days later, is survived by his step-daughter Michelle and sons Tony, Chris, Devin and Stefan. In 1971, Schutter married Patrice Kimoto. The couple was married and divorced twice. In 1977, Schutter married Carole Schutter. They later divorced. Services are pending. [SB July 11, 2005]

Alfred Suga - When state Board of Education members were looking to place blame for six years of delays in renovating a nearly 60-year-old building at Kalihi Kai Elementary into a library, Assistant School Superintendent Alfred Suga called it as he saw it. The library, he said, was a "pork barrel" project initiated by a legislator. "The building should have been demolished. When you start renovating an old structure like this, you don't know what to expect," Suga said in 1996. Such candor is uncommon for a veteran state bureaucrat. But he wasn't a typical government bureaucrat, said Herman Aizawa, former state schools superintendent and Suga's boss at the time. Suga, 81, died Feb. 15.
