Choy, Duke Cho known as the "people's doctor," gave free medical services to the needy and was a champion of the underdog during the historic land struggles in Chinatown and Kalama Valley. Dr. Kekuni Blaisdell, founding chairman of the University of Hawaii's medical department, said Choy was a model for everyone. "He was a hero. He was a giant, extraordinary. And very unorthodox -- doctors aren't supposed to be this way." Choy, 86, died Feb. 25, 2005 at his home in Honolulu. His family initially did not plan a memorial service, but decided to hold one after numerous requests. The service will be held at Central Union Church at 10:30 a.m. March 24, preceded by visitation at 9:30 a.m. What made Choy extraordinary was "a strong moral conscience, a sense of justice, where you have to correct wrongs because we have a responsibility," said Blaisdell, a native Hawaiian activist. "It's basic human compassion," and Choy had plenty of it. One of his daughters, Patti Choy of Brooklyn, N.Y., said her father, a pediatrician, founded the Third Arm, a free medical clinic in Chinatown in the 1970s and '80s. He also gave free medical service at Ota Camp in Waipahu, at the Hawaii State Prison and to anyone who could not afford it. He was one of the only doctors at the time to treat welfare patients, she said. The Third Arm led to his involvement with the People Against Chinatown Eviction, which opposed a rehabilitation project that would have forced poor people out of the downtown district. Among other causes he championed, Choy formed a committee to bring war-injured Vietnamese children to Hawaii for treatment, and organized the Physicians for Social Responsibility in opposition to the Vietnam War. He also joined the sanctuary movement at the Church of the Crossroads and was a draft counselor, his daughter said. UH historian and community activist Marion Kelly said Choy was involved in the Save Our Surf movement, founded by her husband, John Kelly Jr., in the late 1960s to prevent offshore development at Magic Island and other locations. Choy was also a cherished lifetime friend to the Kellys. He made "a better life for everyone with whom he came in contact. ... He was always helping people. That seemed to be his mission in life, and he took it seriously," Kelly said. Blaisdell said Choy was a key figure in urging other

doctors to support the founding of the UH medical school. Choy was chief resident at the University of Chicago in 1947, when Blaisdell was a student there. He found Choy to be "a superb teacher, an excellent clinician, with warm compassion for his patients and young students." Choy was quiet, soft-spoken and "down to earth," learning how to knit from his nurses during lunch so he would not feel left out, Patti Choy said. He loved making stationery using flowers he dried, tried tap dancing and folk guitar playing, and was a master at one-eyed pingpong after he lost vision in one eye from a stroke in 2000. His volunteer activities included helping Big Brothers of Hawaii, the Waikiki Drug Clinic, hospice care and the First Korean Methodist Church, where he was an active layman. Mrs. Coleman has the singular distinction of having served four times as first lady of American Samoa between 1956 and 1993. A warm, personable and down to earth woman. Mrs. Coleman earned the admiration of the Samoan Community as she worked unobtrusively alongside her husband. She exemplified, selfreliance and the practicality of island living. This meant among other things, having to make-do with what you have on hand. As first lady, Mrs. Coleman was known for her "hands-on" directness and involvement. She planned, shopped, dressed and fed her children, and sent them to school. When duty called, she personally greeted special guests of American Samoa, feeding and housing them when necessary. Mrs. Coleman was born and raised in Honolulu. She had one brother and five sisters. She attended Sacred Hearts Academy in Kaimuki before moving on to the Kamehameha (High) School for Girls where she graduated with honors in 1938. She married Coleman in 1941. He had graduated in 1939 from St. Louis High School. They had met in 1940 at a charity fundraiser fashion show. She was modeling a dress from the Bishop Museum that had once belonged to a member of the Hawaiian royal family. Standing beside her, Coleman served as her kahili bearer. The marriage lasted 56 years and produced 13 children. She was widowed in 1997. Mrs. Coleman first arrived in American Samoa with her husband and family in June 1952.

They arrived on USS President Jackson which had been dispatched to Tutuila to pick up members of the Fita Fita Guard and their families who were being transferred to Honolulu by the U.S. navy which had at this time turned over jurisdiction to the U.S. Department of the Interior. This transfer to Hawaii is sometimes referred to as the "Great Samoan Migration/Exodus" since it involved the movement of a large group of people. Mrs. Coleman became the first island woman to become first lady of Samoa when the Department of the Interior appointed her husband in 1956 as the Territory's first Samoan governor. They served until 1961, after which they were transferred by the Interior to Micronesia (then called the U.S. Trust Territory of the Pacific islands) where Coleman served in various posts from District Administrator to High Commissioner. The Coleman's returned to American Samoa in 1977 to run in the Territory's first-ever gubernatorial election. Coleman won and Mrs. Coleman returned as first lady of the Territory. She served as first lady from 1978 to 1985 and then again from 1989 to 1993. Cowen, James E. president and general manager of O'ahu Transit Services, died Tuesday. He was 80. Cowen headed the transit service, which operates TheBus, since January 1992. His last day at work before he became ill was July 1, said J. Roger Morton, senior vice president and director of operations. Morton said Cowen will be missed by employees at all levels of O'ahu Transit Services. "He was always very approachable as a chief executive officer," Morton said. "It didn't matter whether the employee was a bus washer or a bus driver or anyone. "Executives, he said, were encouraged to make their own decisions. "He told me from the start he'd give me wide berth," Morton said. "He'd allow me to make decisions even if they were the wrong decisions, as long as, in his opinion, they weren't so bad they'd harm the company. "He inspired people. He became a mentor." "It is a big loss," said Cheryl Soon, who was the city's director of transportation services in the Jeremy Harris administration and worked closely with Cowen for eight years. "He was nothing but a total joy to work with," she said. "He had the respect of everyone who worked with him. When we'd travel to the professional association meetings on the Mainland, it was obvious how well known and well respected he was throughout the nation — by everyone in the profession." Mayor Mufi Hannemann said Cowen was a true public servant. "I credit Jim's leadership at TheBus as instrumental in helping Honolulu being twice named America's best transit system," he said. Cowen was born in Dallas in July 1925. He served as an Army officer during World War II, then joined United Airlines and rose to head its operations in San Francisco. He moved to Greyhound Bus Line in 1962 and served as head of operations in several western states. In 1970, Cowen started Korea Greyhound Ltd., a joint-venture bus company in South Korea, and served as its first CEO. He returned to the United States in 1972 and headed the transit division of the Golden Gate Bridge, Highway and Transportation District, then in 1978 became general manager of the TriMetropolitan Transportation District of Oregon, more commonly known as Tri-Met. During his tenure, he oversaw the construction of Portland's light-rail system, and Tri-Met was named America's best transit system. He moved to Hawai'i in 1992, after retiring from Tri-Met. Morton said Cowen was disappointed that Honolulu never adopted a light-rail system. "He was in favor of rail," Morton said. "But when he came here as a tourist in the '70s he read about the rail debate, and then he saw it turned down in '92. He said he thought Honolulu lacked the political will. It was one of his disappointments." Cowen was an active leader in the American Public Transportation Association Its president, William W. Millar, called him a giant in the industry. "No other transit manager has ever received APTA's Outstanding System Award three times," he said.
