Fabrao, Jonette "Joni" started Kamaiki Anuenue preschool in Kalihi Valley in the 1960s. It was her response to learning that the family income just barely disqualified her children from attending an existing preschool for low-income housing residents. "That was the beginning of her community service," said daughter Chandra Lee Satele. It reflected the lifelong service orientation of her mother, who was a Kalihi-Palama activist for years and continued in that role

when the Fabraos moved to Waianae. She was an advocate for people in her job, too. She was employed since 1989 by ARC in Hawaii, most recently as caregiver and manager at Pearl City apartments for the disabled. Fabrao, of Hawaii Kai, died June 13, 2005 in Straub Hospital. She was 65. "She wanted betterment for her family and other people," said Satele. "Our home was a community center." Besides her own four children, the family listed 17 people as Fabrao's hanai children. Fabrao held positions on the Kalihi Palama Community Council and the Kalihi-Palama Model Cities Program and on planning and recreation advisory boards for the area. She was a co-founder of the milk co-operative serving families in Kuhio Park Terrace and other Kalihi housing projects, and founder of the Kalihi Palama Hawaiian Civic Club. She was active in the Aloha Pono Lions Club. She was president of Waianae Uluwehi Community Association, which successfully challenged state housing authorities to repair apartments there after walls buckled and leaked in heavy rains. "My mom got her facts together, fought Hawaii Housing Authority, made them responsible," said Satele. "It went on for years and the homes finally got fixed with aluminum siding." Her survivors include husband Raymond C.; son Raymond; daughters Chandra Lee Satele, Raechelle Fabrao and Kimberly Fabrao-Iverson; brother Hamilton McCubbin; sister Carol Makahanaloa; and nine grandchildren. Farinon, William B. *Aug. 25, 2005* William B. Farinon died Aug. 25 at his home in San Mateo, Calif. He was 88. Farinon College Center is named in honor of Farinon and his wife, P T, who provided a contribution of \$11 million toward the \$16 million cost of the center, which opened in 1991. In the late 1980s Farinon helped Lafayette pioneer in a new arena of electronics. He gave the College more than \$3 million to establish a data control systems laboratory and to network the campus with fiber optic cable for the campus computer network. He established a scholarship fund for electrical engineering students in the name of one of his favorite professors. In a special celebration at the 160th Commencement, Farinon marched with the Class of 1995 and received his Lafayette diploma 56 years after his own class' graduation ceremonies had taken place without him because he'd failed a course as a senior. (He made up the course at another college that summer to qualify for his Lafayette degree.) Farinon served as chief of communications engineering for the Civil Aeronautics Administration in Honolulu from 1941-49. He then worked as a radio engineer for the Hawaiian Telephone Company until 1955, when he and P T moved to California and, working side-by-side, became pioneer entrepreneurs in what was to become known as Silicon Valley. Farinon Electric Company flourished and then merged with Harris Corp. in 1980. P T Farinon House, which opened in 1996 as a residence for first-year students, is named for the late Mrs. Farinon, who died in 2001. The Farinons' ashes will be scattered over the sea in Hawaii, family members say.

Fox, Jack Morton was a Honolulu advertising agency employee when he took on the Hawaii statehood cause for a client. The cause grew into his personal passion in the late 1950s, and then-Gov. Samuel Wilder King appointed him to the Hawaii Statehood Commission. "We moved to Alexandria, Va., for six months while he worked on it steadily in Washington, D.C., talking to senators and congressmen," recalled his wife, Marliiss. He spent weeks in a public relations tour through Southern states where there was strong opposition to admitting Hawaii. He and island resident Nancy Corbett "gave lectures to luncheon groups and did a lot of radio work," she said. "He was really enthusiastic about statehood." Fox, 83, died Jan. 28, 2005 in Rancho Murieta, Calif., where the couple has lived since 1989. Fox worked for Castle & Cooke Hawaii and C. Brewer Co., beginning in the public relations departments and rising to executive positions in the sugar industry.
