Alfred "Freddy" Los Banos Revered veteran dies at 76 A sniper may have shot Army Master Sgt. Alfred "Freddy" Los Banos during the Korean War, but the wound never stopped him. Paralyzed from the waist down by a sniper's bullet in 1950 while serving with the 5th Regimental Combat Team, Los Banos used a wheelchair. He overcame his disability and served on numerous veterans' organizations and traveled the world attending meetings and other veterans' observances. Los Banos, 76, died Tuesday Aug 31, 1999 at St. Francis-West Hospital. Los Banos also fought the Japanese as a member of the U.S. Army's 1st Filipino Regiment during World War II after he was drafted in 1944. "He was a soldier's man," said his brother, Domingo. Sen. Daniel Inouye described Los Banos as "Hawaii's number one veteran. He served in the Philippines with very little fanfare and publicity. For those of us who have been in uniform, we are well aware of his heroic contributions. His presence at gatherings of veterans will be sorely missed. I lost a good friend." "He is the kind of individual who grows on you," said Bob Hamakawa, head of the Korean War Veterans Club. "Even with his handicap, he never complained. "I put him on a pedestal. I really admire that man. He was a real role model." After serving in the Philippines, Los Banos was discharged in 1944, but re-enlisted four years later. On Aug. 14, 1950, Los Banos was wounded. After 16 months of rehabilitation at several Army hospitals, Los Banos was medically retired as a master sergeant. He served with the Veterans Administration as a counselor and later as director of prosthesis for the Pacific region. In April 1990, Los Banos underwent amputation of both legs below the knees because of infection in both feet. Retired Brig. Gen. Irwin Cockett, who grew up on Kauai with Los Banos, said he always considered Los Banos as his mentor. "He was my drill instructor when I took basic training at Schofield and we went to Korea together," said Cockett. Later, as both worked on various veterans' observances, Cockett, who once served as head of the Hawaii Army National Guard, said, "I never did anything without consulting him first because he always knew the pulse of the veterans' organizations we were working with." Survivors include his widow, Caroline; one son, Alfred "Buddy Jr.;" two daughters, Pamela Sandridge and Winifred Mattos; two brothers, Domingo and Bernard; two sisters, Beatrice Ranis and Conchita; and 8 grandchildren. Charles Luckman, a multi-faceted architect who designed Aloha Stadium as the first facility with stands that reconfigure for baseball or football events, died Tuesday Jan. 26, 1999 at his Los Angeles home. He was 89. A family spokesman said Luckman died in his sleep. An entrepreneur once called the boy wonder of American business, Luckman headed soap companies and designed space centers and skyscrapers. The Kansas City native gained an architecture degree from the University of Illinois. But after graduating in 1931, he designed brochures for soap products. Luckman became a super salesman and by age 33 was president of the dentifrice firm Pepsodent. Four years later, he was president of Lever Bros. In 1937, Luckman saw a comedian named Bob Hope in a Broadway musical. The Bob Hope radio show followed, with Pepsodent as its longtime sponsor. In 1947, President Truman tapped Luckman to help feed war-devasted Europe. He was honored with Britain's Order of St. John, France's Legion of Honor and Italy's Star of Solidarity. The Europe task was his second government calling. In 1946, he had been named to the President's Committee on Civil Rights. In its 1947 report, that committee sought to uphold civil liberties by backing anti-lynching, anti-poll tax and anti-discrimination bills. It called for a permanent Fair Employment Practices Commission, voting rights for native Americans in the Southwest and citizenship for all who qualify, including residents of U.S. possessions in the Pacific. Luckman left the soap business in 1950 and turned to his first love, architecture. In addition to Aloha Stadium, his landmark creations included the Cape Canaveral Space Center in Florida, the Johnson Space Center in Houston, Los Angeles Airport, the Prudential Center in Boston, the Phoenix Civic Center and the new Madison Square Garden in New York. In a 1955 Star-Bulletin interview, Luckman reminisced about his career, his tenure as president of Pepsodent and Lever Brothers, and opening his own firm. "I work long hours -- up at 5 . . . to read reports, get to the office at 8:30, leave about 7," he said. "Retire? About every six months I say I should. I don't think I ever will, too much drive inside." Luckman is survived by wife Harriet and sons Charles Jr., James and Stephen.

Lyman received the highest honor by the Punahou Alumni Association in 1985, recognizing outstanding community service and service to Punahou. She was a study hall supervisor of seventh and eighth grades and an assistant librarian until she retired. "She was hugely popular with the students because she was a great listener," said Marion Lyman-Mersereau, her daughter. "She was a very understanding person. They came to her with their problems and most of the time through her listening, figured the answers out themselves," she said. Lyman spent her active retirement with her family and her many volunteer activities, including storytelling to kindergartners at Punahou. She ushered for the Honolulu Theatre for Youth, helped at the Hawaii Maritime Center, and served as a docent at the Lyon Arboretum. She was on the flower committee at Central Union Church, and on the board of directors for the Lyon Arboretum and the Punahou Alumni Association. She was born Marion Webster in Honolulu. Her father came to Hawaii a few years before her birth to serve as president of Kamehameha Schools. He later became dean of students at the University of Hawaii. Webster Hall is named after him. She married David "Bel" Belden Lyman Jr., whose missionary family arrived in Hawaii in 1832 from Connecticut. Marion Lyman played the part of Sister Baldwin in "The Harp in the Willows" in 1947, a play based on the life of Rev. Lorenzo Lyons. Lyman-Mersereau wrote a poem for her mother's funeral service to be held at 5 p.m. Thursday at Central Union Church's main sanctuary. "She was a giver first, of time, money, understanding, love and of life. A lover next of family, friends, people and all their foibles, laughter, plants, flowers and the ocean. A lady always, classy, gracious, graceful and elegant." Lyman is survived by sons David, Daniel, James "Kimo;" daughter Marion Lyman-Mersereau; 11 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.
