Alford starred in the children's show, "Sheriff Ken's Posse" and "Sheriff Ken's Rangers," from 1953 until 1965, on KGMB-TV and KONA-TV. Russ Apple "was in love with Hawaii, in love with the history," said Hawaii Volcanoes National Park Superintendent James Martin. Apple, who retired in 1981 as National Park Service Pacific historian, shared his knowledge of Hawaiian history and legends in his "Tales of Old Hawaii" column in the Honolulu Star-Bulletin from 1969 to 1986. He died yesterday Feb 5, 1999 at his home near the park. He was 78. He was with the park service for 30 years, starting as a ranger at Kilauea Volcano. He was the first superintendent at Pu'uuhonua o Honaunau (City of Refuge) national park in Kona in the 1960s. "He was the one who drove the restoration of the site," Martin said. "He was this tremendous resource, he had a lot of knowledge that was never written down," Martin said. "If there was anything I needed know about the park ... I tapped Russ." Martin said one of Apple's last projects was tracing the Ala Kai trail, to be developed as a national trail following the first primitive road system around the Big Island. Phyllis Fox, former executive director of Historic Hawaii Foundation, said, "The Volcano House restoration stands as a living monument to him." Apple was involved in restoring the hotel opened at Kilauea crater in the 1870s. Since retiring, Apple had been writing a history of Hawaii and lecturing at Volcano Art Center. "He had a way of getting you into history, he made it believable that it's about real people," said his wife, Virginia McDonald Apple. Apple graduated from Westminster College in Pennsylvania and earned a master's degree from the University of Hawaii and his doctorate in Pacific history from Columbia Pacific University.
