Randy Farden, 57, wrote famed song 'Beautiful Kauai'. Funeral services will be Saturday for Rudolph Haleakala "Randy" Farden Jr., the Hawaiian songwriter who wrote the 1968 hit "Beautiful Kauai." Farden died Friday at his Waianae home. He was 57. An ohana service and scattering of ashes is scheduled for noon Saturday at Pokai Beach Park. The family requests casual attire. Leis may be worn in lieu of floral offerings. Farden wrote "Beautiful Kauai" at a hotel on the Garden Isle in 1967. It became a hit the following year after Don Ho recorded it and later became a hula standard thanks to Kawai Cockett and the Lei Kukui Serenaders. "His big hit 'Beautiful Kauai', was inspired by the fantastic view of Hanalei Valley, Mount Nomolo Kama and the bay he saw from his hotel window," said Tony Todaro, in his book "Golden Years of Hawaiian Entertainment." Farden was born in Honolulu but grew up in Waianae. He is a member of one of Hawaii's most accomplished musical families. "Randy Farden comes from an illustrious musical family -- Irmgard Aluli is his aunt," Todaro wrote. Other relatives include Edna Bekeart and the late Emma Sharpe. Although a member of the class that was first to graduate from Waianae High School, he left school early to enter the Navy, graduating from the Navy-sponsored Yokosuka General High School in Japan. His Navy service took him to the Philippines, Australia, Japan and Vietnam. He was with the Honolulu Police Department from 1968 to 1975, serving as a patrolman, undercover officer and canine handler. His career also included time as a private investigator and tour escort. In 1982, he joined Kentron International Inc., eventually becoming a watch commander and chief of security and customs agent on Wake Island. Later, he was with the state attorney general's office as an investigator with the child support enforcement unit. He then retired to Waianae to care for his parents, pursuing his hobbies of golf and photography.
