Ruth Hualani Lyman Rath, a social worker and advocate for women's rights, died Sunday in Honolulu. She was 92. Born in Wenatchee, Wash., she was a descendant of missionaries David Belden and Sarah Joiner Lyman. She grew up in Kohala, Hawai'i, and graduated from Punahou School in 1927. Rath was a social worker in Hawai'i, as well as in Washington and California. During World War II, she volunteered to work in the tuberculosis ward at Tripler Hospital. She fought for reimbursements for Hawaiians whose lands were seized when they were sent to the Kalaupapa settlement for patients of Hansen's disease. She helped to find homes for children born to patients in Kalaupapa, an isolated peninsula of Moloka'i. On April 2, 1963, Rath was one of five people who survived a plane crash off Kalaupapa. Although she had a broken arm and cuts, Rath swam and carried two injured passengers to shore.

Rath was married briefly in the 1930s to James Arthur Rath Jr. One of her uncles was Albert Kualii Lyman, the first U.S. Army general of Hawaiian ancestry, after whom the Hilo airport is named. Ruth Hualani Lyman Rath once jumped into the ocean from a plane moments before it burst into flames.

She then saved the pilot and a fellow passenger by bringing them to shore, her son says.

The medical social worker had been on a routine clinical visit to the Hansen's disease settlement in Kalaupapa with a medical team in 1963 when their plane crashed.

In a Star-Bulletin article, fellow passenger Joseph Hathaway said Rath pushed him out of the plane and into the ocean not a minute too soon. The plane exploded 15 feet away from them. "She was a tough, strong character" and "determined as steel," said her only child, James Arthur Rath III. But she always took care of people.

Ruth Rath died Sunday at the age of 92 at the Hale Nani Rehabilitation and Nursing Center. She lived in Nuuanu and Hawaii Kai. Rath was a pioneer in social work and an advocate for women's rights. As a social worker in Hawaii, California and Washington, "she always seemed to be looking out for the outcasts," her son said.

She fought the stigma of Hansen's disease with education and advocacy. She found homes for children born to patients sent to Kalaupapa. Even as a 20-year-old, she sought reimbursement for lands seized from Hawaiians who were sent to Kalaupapa. And during World War II, Rath volunteered to work in the tuberculosis ward at Tripler Army Medical Center. That impressed Dr. Edwin Chung-Hoon, who hired her for the state as a medical social worker at Kalaupapa. "She was always very concerned about the Hansen's disease patients and their acceptance in the community," said Jeanne Paty, health education officer for the Department of Health during the 1950s and 1960s, who worked with Rath. At that time, there was an effort to integrate more patients into the community with the availability of drugs to treat the disease, but they were still not being accepted.

Rath was the only social worker in the Hansen's disease division. "She was a very caring person and helped the public understand the problems the patients had, as well as helping the patients themselves," Paty said. "I consider her a real pioneer in her field and for the people of Hawaii." Rath, born in Wenatchee, Wash., was the eldest of six children. She grew up in Kohala on the Big Island and graduated from Punahou School in 1927.

Her father, Maj. David B. Lyman, was the first Salvation Army officer of Hawaiian ancestry. Rath's lineage can be traced to Oahu's chief Kualii, as well as missionaries David and Sarah Lyman. Longtime close friend Venus Gay Holt, 95, called Rath an exceptional person because she met her obligations to the community.

"She was always ready to donate and do things," Holt said. "She was a very generousperson." Holt recalled Rath having recipes for every island fruit and always donating jars of jelly to the Daughters of Hawaii, of which she was a member.
