L. Newell Tarrant, patriarch of an acting family who brought air-conditioning to Ruger Theatre and introduced the concept of "guest actors" at the Honolulu Community Theatre, died of cancer Thursday, Jan 27, 2000 in Raleigh, N.C. He was 88. "He was very committed to theater," said John Rampage, artistic director at Diamond Head Theatre, which previously was known as HCT. "I will always remember his commitment to raising the standards of the theater, to make sure it would continue. He had such passion for the stage, to take it the next level." And vision, said Joyce Maltby, director at Hawaii Pacific University Theatre. "He directed me in a show called 'Happy Birthday,' and he brought in his friend Peggy Ryan to choreograph a dance for me. He wanted me to set up some acting classes for children. Now, of course, there are a lot of children taking classes there." Jim Hutchison, who succeeded Tarrant at HCT, said: "What always impressed me about him was his energy and enthusiasm for theater. Few know that he won a Lifetime Achievement honor from the American Association of Community Theatres." Tarrant was managing director at HCT for 15 years, beginning in 1962. Ruger Theatre then had leaking roofs and poor acoustics. "Dogs used to bark in the middle of our plays, and we'd hear them," Tarrant had said in a 1969 Advertiser interview. He resolved the major problem — heat and humidity — with the installation of air-conditioning. Tarrant's staging of musicals drew lavish praise. Even composer Meredith Willson flew over for the launching of his "Music Man." A production of "My Fair Lady" was so popular, the military requested HCT to take the show to Midway. A Tarrant production in 1964 of William Goldman's "Blood, Sweat and Stanley Poole" also played the before a captive audience at the state prison. "No small feat," Tarrant remarked afterward, "because 'Stanley Poole' is a show set on an Army base, and weapons-handling is a crucial element of the plot. We had a helluva time getting all those Garand rifles and bayonets into prison." Under his leadership, HCT advocated the premiere of locally written plays, including Aldyth Morris' "The Damien Letter"

and John Kneubuhl's "Hello, Hello, Hello." To enrich productions and inspire community actors and technicians, Tarrant negotiated guest artist contracts with Actors Equity for Mainland professionals to work on both sides of the footlights, a tradition that continues today. Before arriving in the Islands with his wife, Jean Tarrant, and son Newell Jr., Tarrant was managing director of The Playhouse in Erie, Pa., for 16 years. He also had acting and directing credits spanning six decades in five other states: Texas, Indiana, North Carolina, Oklahoma and Ohio. Until his retirement, he was managing and artistic director of the Raleigh Little Theatre. He was proudest of his role in the early careers of such actors as Henderson Forsythe, Ann B. Davis, Bette Midler, Jerry Stiller, Rue McLanahan, Barbara Babcock, Frank Langella, Richard Herd, Ned Beatty and the late Vic Morrow. Tarrant's other survivors include sons Terry and Chester.
