"I look at my parents and what they did for a living, and I can see the history of the island," Bolmeier said. As a heavy equipment operator, Akiona helped build many roads and projects, including the hairpin turn on Pali Highway, she said. Akiona's wife, Mary, ran Mel's Market, which they opened after moving to Waimanalo 47 years ago. They formed a partnership with Mary's sister and her husband, Emily and Walter Jones. Joseph I. Arakaki. Two words can best describe Joseph I. Arakaki, retired nighttime editor for the Honolulu Star-Bulletin. Loyalty. Golf. Arakaki, 74, who worked for the paper from 1953 to 1988, died Aug. 25, 2000 at Castle Medical Center. "He never missed a day of work, even when he was sick," said reporter Helen Altonn, who was working at the Bulletin when Arakaki joined the Honolulu desk from the Kauai bureau, in 1964. "I guess I would just have to say that he was a fine newsman," Altonn said. But outside the newsroom, Arakaki's life was golf, she said. Arakaki himself recently speculated that in the past 50 years, he had played more than 6,000 rounds of golf -- about once every three days. "I think he lived for golf," Altonn said. He later graduated from the University of Hawaii in 1951 with a major in chemistry and a minor in math. Having no luck finding work as a chemist, Arakaki joined the Bulletin as a part-time correspondent for kicks, planning to stay for a year or two. He'd never written a story before. He quickly proved to be an extremely productive writer. Less than year later, in 1954, Arakaki became the paper's first neighbor island bureau chief, based on Kauai, and ran the desk for the next decade. Arakaki transferred to Honolulu as a nighttime general assignment reporter following a restructuring of Kauai's coverage. He became night editor in 1975. "He was a feisty guy, a good guy," said Trini Peltier, who has worked at the paper for 45 years.

Altonn praised Arakaki's attention to detail in stories. Precision also paid off on the golf course. At one point, he had a 5-stroke handicap, nearly the best an amateur golfer can have. "I'm sure that he was golfing right up to the end," Altonn said. Arakaki is survived by sister Marjorie Habu and brothers Larry Y., Charles T. and Carl T. Arakaki. Services were private.

William "Bill" Kusuo Azeka, developer of Azeka Place Shopping Center, died Wednesday June 14, 2000. He was 79. Azeka described himself as a "butcher by trade" who sold a lot of barbecued ribs with his special sauce -- 3,000 pounds during one Christmas Eve. The community knew Azeka for his generosity and grace. In the 1950s, when the economy was depressed in south Maui, he sometimes allowed people to trade fish for groceries. He also gave families food on credit and kept a record of their debt by taping their grocery receipts to the cash register. For the past 10 years, the Kihei Community Association has been using free office space at one of the Azeka buildings. "One of the reasons we have been a powerful community association has been because of the tremendous support we got from the Azekas," said association board member Daryl Davis. Gene Thompson, past president of the Kihei Community Association, said Azeka was also sensitive to issues of growth and would discuss building plans with association members before moving forward with any development. "He was a very charming man, warm and nice. Everybody liked him," Thompson said. Azeka learned about business through his family, working in his

grandmother's store in Japan, then later at his parents' restaurant in Kahului. He built a store in 1950 on the family's farm land, now a portion of the shopping center, and later purchased two 10-acre parcels in Kihei. Azeka turned over most of the management of the business to his son, Tyler, in 1994. He is survived by his wife Jane; son Tyler; daughters Emilie Preston and Audrey Inaba; brothers Kenji and Joseph; and sister, Jane Tsukazaki. The family will begin receiving visitors at noon Sunday at Nakamura's Mortuary in Wailuku, followed by services at 1 p.m. and a reception. Casual attire is requested.
