Milton Hualani Carter Jr., president of the Musicians Union, died of an apparent heart attack Tuesday night Apr. 20, 2000. He was 73. Widely known in the entertainment industry and respected by both parties in contract negotiations, Carter had a major role in settling the labor strife that temporarily caused division within the Honolulu Symphony in the mid-1990s. "The greatest tribute you can pay to Milton is to admit that even if you were on the other side of the negotiating table, you had a great deal of respect for him," said Michael Tiknis, outgoing executive director of the Honolulu Symphony. "He was a wonderful person who commanded warmth and affection in an area that is rare for union officials. I don't think people knew all of the good things he did behind the scenes." Tiknis said Sunday's symphony concert, with Bach's Mass in B minor, will be dedicated to Carter. "He did everything for musicians," said entertainer Jeffrey Apaka. Carter had intended to retire from the Musicians Association of Hawaii, Local No. 677, American Federation of Musicians, at the end of May. His vice president, Michael Largenticha, immediately moves into the post. According to Jean Myers, president of Myers Advertising and a friend of Naomi Carter, Milton Carter's wife, said he "had wanted to do volunteer work after his retirement." "Milton was a strong union leader because he understood the process," said Myers. "It had to be a win-win situation for all parties. And that philosophy carried over into his family life, too." Largenticha pledged "to continue the good work Milton did." In 1984, Carter defeated I.B. "Buddy" Peterson, who had headed the Musicians Union for 38 years. The victory was a call for change and growth for musicians, Carter said at the time. Born in Hilo, Carter was a working musician and played trumpet and string bass. He was generous in support of the symphony musicians, particularly at the time when the orchestra was working without pay. "We were born to serve and lead, and (Jimmy) reached those heights," Miyamoto said. **Man of many skills** Miyamoto said Clark wove Hawaiian artifacts and was a fantastic example of a Hawaiian Polynesian, since he stood 6 feet, 7 inches. "He was somebody who commanded respect," his son said. Miyamoto said Clark died on his porch with his puppy sitting on his lap and his three other dogs around him as he worked on a saddle. Timmy Clark said those who knew his dad well often said that he was the best Hawaiian saddlemaker in Hawai'i. "He was just a man among men," Timmy said. Clark is also survived by three daughters, Lucy, Jamie Rapacz and Cora; and two grandsons, James and Naone. Dr. Ralph Bingham Cloward, a neurosurgeon whose career spanned treating casualties in the Pearl Harbor attack to creating landmark surgical innovations, died Monday Nov 13, 2000 at Queen's Medical Center. He was 92. Cloward began his Honolulu practice in 1938. A specialist in treating spinal injuries, he developed a technique using bone grafts to help fuse discs. "Most surgeons only remove the troublesome disc, but this doesn't cure the problem," he told the Star-Bulletin in 1986. Instead, he removed the damaged discs and replaced them with small plugs of bone, taken from the patient or from a cadaver.

For this procedure, he set up the first bone bank in the United States, and other bone banks sprang up around the country. Dr. Paul M. Lin, an editor of a medical book that reprinted Cloward's article on his technique, called him a "technical genius."

"Dr. Cloward was so far ahead of his time in technical skill that he made others appear inferior," Lin said. Cloward also perfected a technique that became famous: a way to operate on cervical discs of the neck from the throat, called an anterior approach. Before this, surgeons had operated from the back of the neck. The most publicized case using this technique occurred in 1965 after a husband-and-wife team of Polish doctors wrote to him on behalf of their 16-year-old daughter. They explained that a tumor on her spine might be fatal. Cloward's role as a Rotarian paid off: the Rotary Club of Honolulu paid all expenses to bring mother and daughter here, and the operation was a success.

Cloward also developed more than 100 surgical instruments that bear his name and are widely used. His Pearl Harbor Day memories included rushing to Tripler Hospital to aid the wounded. Doctors worked nonstop as the injured kept pouring in. On the evening of the fourth day, Cloward headed home after having performed more than 40

operations. The headlights on his Ford had been painted black except for a half-inch blue strip in the middle. In the blackout, his car dropped into an unseen, deep ditch on School Street.

But his surgical performance earned him mention in national magazines. Time reported he saved lives and wits of "a large number" of sailors and soldiers.

Cloward continued to patch up people into his late 70s. He was born in Salt Lake City, graduated from McKinley High School here in 1926 and studied at the universities of Hawaii, Utah and Chicago. He was chief of staff of the neurosurgery departments of Queen's, St. Francis and Kuakini hospitals, and a consultant in neurology and neurosurgery. He authored scores of technical articles in medical journals, going back to 1937. A man of many talents, he was a clarinetist with the Royal Hawaiian Hotel Orchestra in 1927 and played first clarinet with the Honolulu Symphony. He is survived by son Kerry; daughters Karen McGregor of Los Angeles, Calif., and Kathleen Sattler, and 12 grandchildren. In April, he and his wife were jointly honored as recipients of the Richard Smart Special Service award for their various contributions to communications, planning, cultural and artist pursuits. Cook was known for "being totally immersed on putting volunteers together for the Waimea Elementary school reading program," said his friend and fellow retiree Gene Erger, a former Honolulu radio figure. "Bill just gave and gave some more." Cook worked at The Advertiser for nearly five years in the 1960s where he was a pioneer in the specialized news writing field of urban and real estate planning. He also served as the newspaper's "planning critic." Cook left The Advertiser in 1968 to join the Milici Advertising Agency. Within a year, he was named as the agency's director. In August 1969, Gov. Elizabeth "Betty" Crocker: About a year ago, the city planted a giant crepe myrtle tree to replace a fallen monkeypod at Nuuanu Valley Park and dedicated it to environmental activist Elizabeth "Betty" Crocker. The purple-blossomed beauty beside Pali Highway is just a sample of the beautification legacy left by the former Outdoor Circle president and co-founder of Scenic Hawaii Inc. Crocker died Sunday Oct 15, 2000 at the age of 79. "She had a knack for bringing people together -- business people, the city, the state," said Cynthia Marnie of Scenic Hawaii Inc., a former Outdoor Circle president. "I told her she has the gift of ho'omalimali (flattery)."
