Clyde Doran, a pioneer in Hawai'i's hotel industry, died Friday night Aug 18, 2000 at his home in Honolulu. He was 85. He had been diagnosed in April with cancer, said his daughter, Merrily Labarthe of Atlanta. "He was a fine man and a good friend," said Nancy Quinn, former first lady of Hawai'i and longtime friend of the Doran family. "And he was very brave through his illness." Doran came to Hawai'i in 1952 as a sales manager for United Airlines. In 1956, he declined a promotion that would have meant a transfer to Chicago, leaving the airline to begin a long affiliation with InterIsland Resorts and what is now the Hilton Hawaiian Village. "He said there was
