Opal Vivian Fagan, aviator and writer, dead at 85. Honolulu resident Opal Vivian Fagan wrote a book about World War II flying experiences called "Zoot Suits and Parachutes." But Fagan did more than write about wartime flying — she experienced it. As part of a select group of women aviators, Fagan test-flew and ferried military aircraft as they emerged from wartime factories. She was part of Women Air Force Service Pilots, or WASPs. "The only thing she didn't get to fly was the B-26 (bomber)," said her daughter, Shannon Fagan, of San Francisco. Vivian Fagan, a Hawai‘i resident and pilot for 51 years, died Wednesday Nov 1, 2000. She was 85.

Fagan ran a beauty shop in Toledo, Wash., before taking up flying in 1940 for the adventure of it. Of the 25,000 women who applied to be a WASP, 1,074 were picked. Among her wartime duties, Fagan ferried old planes from Stockton Army Air Force Base to bone yards in Blythe, Calif. In a 1999 article in The Advertiser, Fagan recalled other duties. "We towed targets for live ammunition," she said. "We flew the tow planes so the fellows on the ground could shoot at it. We did testing after engine overhauls. We had to do all sorts of things that the men didn't want to do. After the war, she ran an airport and flying school in Lind, Wash., before moving to Honolulu in 1949. In Honolulu, she trained pilots at Trans Pacific Airlines, which later became Aloha Airlines, Shannon Fagan said. Vivian Fagan was still flying up to the age of 80, entering Apuepuelele interisland races in a Piper Cherokee or Cessna, her daughter said. "She was always such a gracious person," Shannon Fagan said. "It was hard for some people to put her in that (pilot) role later in her life, but she always had a sense of adventure and never lost her spirit of challenge. The way she expressed that was through flying." Shannon Fagan said her mother died of ovarian cancer after learning of the disease five months ago. Her mother was married to John Fagan for 35 years. John Fagan died in 1986. Vivian Fagan also is survived by a daughter, Andrea, of Honolulu, and a grandson. A memorial service will be held at 4:30 p.m. Wednesday at Unity Church of Hawai'i, 3608 Diamond Head Circle. CARL ALEXANDER FARDEN JR.; real estate developer Carl A. Farden Jr., member of a prominent Hawai'i family, died Sept. 12 at Castle Medical Center. He was 73.

Farden was born in Honolulu and was the son of Carl Farden Sr. and Lucy Kailipakalua Searle. Carl Farden Sr.'s three brothers and seven sisters, including Irmgard Aluli, were active in the Hawaiian real estate industry and in 1977 were awarded the Hawaiian Music Foundation's Hawaii Aloha Award. Carl Farden Jr. was a 1944 graduate of Punahou School. He earned a bachelor's degree at the University of California-Berkeley and a master's in economics at Columbia University. While employed with Hawaiian Electric Co. in 1951, he was ordered to active duty with the

Navy. In 1960, Farden ran unsuccessfully as a Republican for the Honolulu City Council seat held by Clesson Chikasuye. A year later, Farden was named Midwest regional manager for the Hawai'i Visitors Bureau in Chicago. In April 1962, Farden returned to Hawai'i as the assistant general manager of the visitor bureau. But he resigned in September of that year to become sales manager of the Great Books of the Western World organization.

Farden was active in local real estate and helped develop the Prince Kōhio Hotel in Waikiki. He also was appointed by Sen. Daniel Inouye to a panel that commissioned statues of King Kamehameha I and the Rev. Damien de Veuster that stand in Statuary Hall in the nation's Capitol.
