Frederick P. Haehnlen, 72, of Hawaii Kai, a University of Hawaii emeritus professor of educational psychology, died Saturday Apr. 15, 2000. Haehnlen joined the University of Hawaii in 1957 and became provost of Kapiolani Community College in 1972, serving in that post until 1975. He had been appointed by Gov. John A. Burns to the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education in 1966. Haehnlen also served as UH athletic director in the early 1960s. Born in Gettysburg, Pa., he came from a sports-minded family of teachers. He played both football and basketball in high school. Also, he ran in track events. After Navy service, he graduated from Gettysburg College in 1949 and was on track and football teams there. He later entered law school at Washington & Lee University but was recalled after one year to active Navy service during the Korean War. He was assigned to Japan. He eventually returned to Gettysburg College and became qualified to teach. He later taught at Hanover, Pa., where he also coached football and track from 1953 to late 1955. In 1956, he taught a half-year at Carlisle, Pa., and also coached golf. That summer, he returned to Japan as a civilian educational instructor and adviser for the U.S. Air Force. He remained in Japan until September 1957 when he joined the University of Hawaii faculty as supervisor of practice teaching at University High School. Haehnlen is survived by wife Tomi; son Tim; and sister Genie Czeck. Betty C. Hamilton, known for generosity, dies at 91. During the late 1960s, Betty C. Hamilton welcomed newly arrived residents to Oahu with a gift basket full of goodies as a volunteer hostess for the Aloha Newcomers Welcome Service. "Her generosity carried beyond her," said daughter Sarah Preble. Hamilton, 91, known among friends and family members for her generosity and creativity, died of a heart attack at Pohai Nani Good Samaritan Retirement Community on Aug. 20, 2000. "She has many friends who will miss her smile and vitality," said Edna Shoup, 80, best friend of Hamilton's for 25 years.

"We spent a lot of fun days together." Born in Racine, Wis., on Aug. 11, 1909, Betty and her husband, John, decided to retire to Kailua from Old Greenwich, Conn., in 1966.

Hamilton donated her body to the University of Hawaii medical school, which "was absolutely in character of her." Hamilton was the president of Friends of the Kaneohe Library, a group of volunteers who stacked and sorted used books from other libraries, individual donors, estates and schools. "She was very knowledgeable about books," said volunteer Marilyn McGovern. Along with volunteering at the Kaneohe Public Library, Hamilton spent her time petroglyph rubbing. Often, she would organize petroglyph tours to the Big Island. "It was a wonderful way of escaping reality," said Shoup, who accompanied Hamilton on their petroglyph rubbing trips. Hamilton's other interests included ceramics and plants. "She was a prolific craft person," said Preble. "She always had great plant sales in her home in Kailua." From palm trees to gingers and ferns, she had her finger on many different things, Preble said. "We would go to the beach to pick up pebbles for her plantings," said Shoup. The prolific inventor came up with the idea for the newspaper vending machine in 1947, a self-balancing washing machine in 1950 and a food dehydrator developed during World War II. Yetsuo "Yets" Higa, the oldest of eight children from a working-class Wahiawa family, created a mini-empire of influence spanning trucks, soda pop, pizza and baseball. He died Sunday July 30, 2000 from complications related to Alzheimer's disease. He was 84. The urge to compete and make deals spurred him to build Y. Higa Enterprises into Oahu's largest trucking and storage business, a packing and crating business with worldwide connections, Pepsi-Cola bottling plants and Domino's Pizza in Japan. A baseball lover, Higa also brought the St. Louis Cardinals and the New York Yankees to Hawaii and Japan to play ball. "He was friends with all the Yankees, including Mickey Mantle. He had autographed bats and balls," said Mary Higa, married to Howard Higa, one of three surviving children. "He loved baseball and sports." Higa was born in Honokaa, Hawaii, the son of an Okinawan contract laborer who moved the family to Wahiawa in 1923. Higa joined his dad's small trucking business soon after graduating from Leilehua High School in 1934 and expanded it from two trucks to a multimillion-dollar company. In the early days, Higa often borrowed money from friends to buy trucks. He believed the only reason they loaned him money was because he was honest and kept his promises. "If you are honest, people won't forget you," he had said. Higa was head of the firm and four of his brothers worked with him. When Pearl Harbor was attacked, Higa sent his trucks to help haul away the debris. But guards prevented him from entering Hickam Air Force Base because he was Japanese American. "I told them I was born on the Big Island, and I was an American, but it didn't do any good. You can't argue with a bayonet," he had said. The Navy called him later to ask for his trucking bill and he replied that he hadn't sent a bill because he felt it was his duty to help his country. The officer commended him for his patriotic duty. Duty paid off. Eventually Higa had contracts for packing, crating and hauling from all military branches. Ouida Hill, considered the grand dame of Big Island society for more than 30 years through the 1960s, died at age 100 earlier this month (January, 2000) in her Honolulu condominium. She met her husband, William Hardy "Doc" Hill, on the beach at Waikiki in the 1930s. He was a prominent Big Island businessman and longtime state senator, and preceded her in death in June 1970. Doc Hill's colorful career in the Legislature included his appearance in a kimono to protest an overtime session, saying his wife had left for Hilo in disgust over his odor. The Hills were hosts to people from all over the world — from royalty to political figures — in their Keauhou estate in Kona, recalled longtime newswoman Maxine Hughes. "The two of them made a good team both socially and politically," said retired legislator Joe Garcia. Doc Hill, famed for presenting silver dollars to his guests, owned most everything in Hilo during his career as a businessman. But his wife, whom he called his "little redhead," was considered a political and social force in her own right. Ouida Hill was born in Virginia. She was a registered nurse when she reached Hawaii in 1926 as an employee of the Mayo brothers, who founded the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn. Anne Kailakanoa Holt was known as an ambassador of aloha to the mainland. Holt got the reputation during years of work for the Hawaii Visitor and Convention Bureau. She died in San Francisco on May 25, 2000 after being struck by a delivery truck. She was 71. A part-Hawaiian, Holt was born and raised in Honolulu, the sixth of 10 children. She graduated from the University of Hawaii and worked as public relations coordinator for the Visitors Bureau in 1958. She ate at the best restaurants and gave the leftovers to homeless people. Kam recalled the time Holt took out to dinner a woman who was a gift-wraper at a department store. "She was just crying after that and telling me how special Auntie Anne was," he said. "She saw greatness in everybody," he said. She was an elegant woman, always well-dressed, Kam said. Though she never wore muumuus, Hawaii was always in her heart. She represented the romance of the islands at a time when Hawaii was just being opened up to travel from the mainland. "Everyone who has met Anne Holt fell in love with her and Hawaii," said Stanley Hong, former president of the Visitors Bureau and now president of the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii.
