Aloha Kaeo, former supervisor of the city's lifeguard services, died Monday in Honolulu. He was 86. Kaeo was born and raised in Waikiki and like most youngsters, he spent all of his spare time in the water. The pure Hawaiian learned to swim at a young age when someone threw him off a bridge. A 1930 graduate of McKinley High School, Kaeo worked as a crane operator. In 1956, he was hired as a lifeguard by Bill Smith, an Olympic gold medalist who headed the department In 1967, Kaeo was promoted to supervisor of the lifeguards, a position he held until his retirement in

1983. During his tenure, Kaeo was credited with developing a strict training regiment for lifeguards. He also hired the city's first female lifeguard. Ocean Safety and Lifeguard Services administrator Ralph Goto said that there was no doubt who was the boss when Kaeo was in charge. "He was the man," said Goto, who joined the division two years before Kaeo retired. "Most of the guys who were around him have since retired. But their recollections of him are that he was very strict, but very fair. He was a great man." Ralph Crommett worked as a lifeguard under Kaeo from 1970 until 1974 and he described Kaeo as a "great water man" who cared about people. "I can't even tell you how many people I've rescued out of the context of being a lifeguard at a beach," Crommett said. "I'm talking about all around the world, and it's all because of the training I got from him." Kaeo is survived by his wife, Pauline; and nieces and nephews. Alice Chang Kamaka dies. The nurses at Kalaupapa made a concerted effort to get Alice Chang Kamaka into a movie filmed there two years ago. The staff of the state Hansen's disease hospital in the Molokai community knew the aged and frail woman had a historical link to the subject, Father Damien DeVeuster. "In the hospital scene, they had a full shot of her. That was all I wanted to see," said nurse's aide Frances Padeken. "She was the spirit of this place. She never gave up." Kamaka, 94, died Monday July 24, 2000 in Hale Mohalu in Honolulu. Diagnosed with leprosy as a teenager, Kamaka was one of thousands of island residents who was sent to the remote peninsula in an effort to curb the spread of the disease. She had lived at Kalaupapa since 1919, longer than anyone else now alive. She and other patients have lived there by choice since the guarantine was lifted in the 1960s. When Kamaka arrived, Brother Joseph Dutton was still caring for patients. Dutton had worked with Father Damien, known around the world for his 16 years of service at the settlement. The priest, who contracted the disease and died in 1889, was beatified by the Catholic Church in 1995. "She was very witty, she says what she wants to say," said Kalaupapa head nurse Fe Austria-Schwind. "She was happy-go-lucky, nothing bothers her." Kamaka, married five times, bore the name of her latest spouse, who died in the 1950s. She was a retired state worker, having served as a hospital orderly for several years. "She just loved life, she lived it her way," Padeken said. "She was ahead of her time. From the stories, she was hell on wheels, my kind of lady." Kamaka's niece, Gladys Lopes of Oahu, said, "She liked to sing, liked to dance, liked to drink beer. She would sing while my mother played ukulele. She was really kolohe (a rascal)." She outlived 12 siblings. More than 30 years ago, she bought a cemetery plot and paid for her own funeral arrangements, Lopes said. Dr. George Hueu Sanford Kanahele: Promotion of Hawaiian cultural values or "Hawaiianess" at Waikiki hotels and other tourist destinations statewide has a common thread, in that noted consultant Dr. George Hueu Sanford Kanahele probably had a hand in it. "If you look behind anything that's basically in motion in the hospitality industry, he's woven into the fabric of it," said Maile Meyer, a director at the Native Hawaiian Tourism and Hospitality Association. "His legacy is everywhere, absolutely everywhere in Waikiki. He was just so enthusiastic about the place up until the last minute," she said. Kanahele, 69, died Thursday night on Guam after suffering a heart attack, said his son, George Kanahele Jr. Kanahele, a historian who published several books and papers on Hawaiian values, Waikiki and Queen Emma, was on Guam sharing his work with the Chamorro people. He was also the editor of "Hawaiian Music and Musicians," a 1979 publication that is being updated. George Kanahele Jr. said his father was a workaholic, always immersed in projects. He said time was of the essence because there was a long list of things his father wanted to do. "He was fond about all the islands, but Waikiki was one of his projects that he was consumed with," his son said. "I think he wanted to bring some aloha back to the islands, and try to make Waikiki more of where you could feel that old Hawaii." Still, he always made time for father-son activities.

"We went skydiving together last week," George Jr. said. "We jumped out of a plane together at 12,000 feet. That was a nice father-and-son little outing we had."

Kanahele's brother, Albert, said the family of 14 siblings grew up in Laie and Kaneohe. Kanahele graduated from Kamehameha Schools before earning a bachelor's degree at Brigham Young University in Provo and a doctorate in political science from Cornell University. H. Baird Kidwell, a former associate justice of the Hawai'i Supreme Court and prominent Honolulu attorney, died Dec. 26, 2000 in Medford, Ore. He was 89. Kidwell was born in Maricopa, Calif., Oct. 20, 1911, and he attended Stanford University for undergraduate studies and law school. He earned his law degree in 1935 and worked for the Los Angeles firm of O'Melveny and Myers. In 1938, Kidwell joined the law firm now known as Goodsill Anderson Quinn & Stifel. He

Leonard Keala Kwan Sr., one of Hawai'i's most influential slack key guitarists, died vesterday. He was 69. Family members described Kwan as a quiet man who revealed his gentle personality through his music. "He loved music. He loved Hawaiian music," said Kwan's youngest son, KevinLee Kwan. "Any time our family was together, Dad would play." Born in Honolulu in 1931, Kwan made his first recording in 1957, a track entitled "Hawaiian Chimes," which featured an innovative use of chime-like harmonics. In 1960, Kwan recorded the first-ever all-instrumental slack key album, "Slack Key," for the Tradewinds record label. It included his best known and now standard piece, "Opihi Moe Moe." His second album, "The Old Way," was released in 1974. Kwan became the first slack key guitarist to publicly share his instrument tunings when he compiled the first-ever slack key guitar instruction book. His passion for music was passed on and shared with his sons, who "play a little of everything," KevinLee said. About 10 years ago, Kwan, KevinLee and Kwan's oldest son, Leonard Kwan Jr., played together at the Big Island's Slack Key Festival, where Kwan was later honored. "His music is so soothing, it's mind relaxing," said KevinLee. "For my dad, the slack key music that he played came from his soul; it's real peaceful." Kwan released his fourth album, "Keala's Mele" in 1995 for George Winston's Dancing Cat Records. Kwan's Hawaiian name, Keala, means sweet, which was the essence of his music, said Ben Churchill, Dancing Cat Records' vice president of marketing. "His style was unique to others," Churchill said. "Few people played like he did: sweet, smooth and gentle - the same kind of man he was." Kwan also played music the way he liked it, even if times were changing around him. "Leonard came from an older tradition," Churchill said. "He never really tried to get

fancy and incorporate new things like all the others. He kept true to the way he was taught to play."

Most recently, Kwan performed in a duet with Ledward Kaapana on Kaapana's, "Black Sand" CD. Kwan also sang and played guitar for a children's choir performing "We Wish You a Merry Christmas" on the album "Slack Key Christmas" to be released in late September. Dancing Cat Records has enough tracks by Kwan to make two albums, but producer and musician George Winston will comb through them to make a big compilation album of Kwan's songs, Churchill said. KevinLee said his family always listened to Kwan's music, but they will now hear it with new emotions. "Truthfully, listening to him now will be a tough one," KevinLee said. "Now that he's not here, there's more meaning behind his music. "I'm missing him already; I miss his smile and his voice." Kwan also is survived by another son, Kenneth, and seven grandchildren.
