Wen Ming Lee isn't a household name, but anyone who's cooled down with a shave ice on a summer's day at Waiola Store in McCully knows his claim to fame. For years, throngs of people have lined the corner of Waiola and Pa'ani streets for Waiola Store's signature shave ice. The store is known for its finely shaved ice and its unique flavors — mochi ball, li hing mui, to name a few — that were developed by Lee. Lee, the retired owner of the mom-and-pop store who put its shave ice on the must-get list of local residents and visitors alike, died Sunday March 28, 2004. He was 61. His son, Jerry, who took over the business in 1996, said his father enjoyed his work and coming up with new flavors of shave ice. "My dad was a good father and a good husband. He was just a quiet guy; he didn't fight with anybody," said Jerry Lee. "But I know he worked hard, seven days a week, 12 hours a day. We didn't have any employees so he knew how to do everything. He did a lot of work to improve the shave ice." Wen Ming Lee was born on Feb. 13, 1943, in Taiwan. After retiring as a government employee, he and his family moved to Hawai'i in 1984. No one spoke much English, but Lee was determined to make a better life for his family so he purchased Waiola Store from his uncle. The store had opened in 1940 and had several owners over the years. Like many neighborhood stores, Waiola struggled as large supermarkets and big-box stores put the squeeze on the

smaller operations. Needing to draw customers, Lee began to tinker with the shave ice side of the business. Lee tried new flavors and worked on the fine consistency of the shave ice. "It can be a simple operation with just a stand with ice and syrup," Jerry Lee said. "But if you want it to be it real good, it's a lot of work, it's an extra step, otherwise you're no different than anybody else. He always said if we don't do it, then somebody else will." The elder Lee also stressed the importance of education. He encouraged his son to pursue a master's degree in business administration at the University of Hawai'i. "He gave me a choice to go out and get a job or take over the store. He allowed me to pursue my own interests," Jerry Lee said. "I like to work here at the store, so he guided me through the first few years." During his retirement, Wen Ming Lee enjoyed ballroom dancing and traveling. He often visited his parents in Taiwan. "He was a soft-spoken, warm-hearted person. He was always giving, a very kind person," Jerry Lee said. Col. Peter Leentjes, a retired Canadian army officer and widely recognized authority on international peacekeeping operations, died of a heart attack July 28, 2004 in Monterey, Calif. The resident of Mariner's Ridge in Hawai'i Kai was 58. Leentjes, who had extensive experience in United Nations peacekeeping duties, was in demand around the world as a speaker, adviser and trainer on the operations sometimes known as PKO. He had been in Monterey to take part in a PKO conference. Derek Boothby, a senior official retired from the United Nations, said from his home in Vermont: "Peter was one of those rocks of inspirational leadership, sheer professionalism and dedication that life produces from time to time. "His energy, cheerfulness and conscientiousness have been widely admired for years. I know that in the U.N., from (Secretary-General) Kofi Annan down, Peter was very highly thought of and greatly respected." Boothby pointed out Leentjes' dedication to U.N. ideals, saying he was "one of those rare persons who held his head high enough to see the imaginative vision set out in the U.N. Charter, and yet kept his feet firmly planted on the ground of realism and practicality." Leentjes was born in the Netherlands in October 1945, just after World War II, and emigrated with his parents to Ontario, Canada, in 1952. He graduated from the University of Western Ontario in 1967 and was commissioned in the Royal Canadian Armored Corps. During his career, he was posted in Germany, Cyprus and France. He became fluent in French, Canada's second official language, and served in a Frenchspeaking regiment. In 1992, he was the operations officer for the multinational force in Bosnia. In 1994 the United Nations established a training unit in PKO as more troops from around the world were being tasked to take on peacekeeping operations. Leentjes was chosen in 1995 to command that unit, which drew officers from the United States, Sweden, Zimbabwe, Italy, Austria, France and Singapore. They forged a doctrine on peacekeeping that Leentjes called "a pragmatic response" to conflict. He said PKOs should be based "on consent, impartiality and non-use of force except in self-defense." Peacekeeping operations are a reversal from regular military operations. The U.N. trainers had to take soldiers trained to apply maximum violence to achieve their mission in the shortest time and with the least possible losses, and retrain them to apply measured, minimal force to restore and keep order. Many of his travels in that U.N. assignment took him to Africa, where he acquired a taste for the art and sculpture. Leentjes

retired from the Canadian army in 1999 after being decorated with the Order of Military Merit and the Meritorious Service Medal. He came to Hawai'i to work with the Center of Excellence in Disaster Management and Humanitarian Assistance, which has its headquarters at Tripler Army Medical Center. For the past four years, he led a team of representatives from nongovernmental relief, medical and human rights organizations to Thailand to train U.S., Thai and Singaporean forces in simulated humanitarian operations. He relished donning the blue beret of a U.N. peacekeeper once again to play his part. Col. Leentjes is survived by his wife of 37 years, Jean; son, Chris, daughter, Sarah; and brother. Larry. Yau Sing Leong gave sound advice: "All I can say is to work as hard as you can, achieve as much as you can and don't worry about anything else." Leong, a retired federal government economist and professor of business economics at the University of Hawai'i, died Jan. 30, 2004. He was 105. Leong was born in Kaluanui, and spent his early childhood on the family rice farm. In 1954, Leong returned home and taught business economics and statistics at the University of Hawai'i, where he served as the economics department chairman from 1959 to 1967. During World War II, Liljestrand was the surgeon for the secret Red Hill Underground Fuel Storage Facility, which included enormous fuel tanks and seven miles of tunnels. Many people were injured and seven died during the construction of the project. Liljestrand retired in 1977, but he remained active with the Chamber of Commerce's Public Health committee until 2002. He also was involved with Planned Parenthood. The Adventurers' Club, Rotary Club of Pearl Harbor, Kaneohe Yacht Club, Honolulu Art Academy, and the Oriental Art Society, and was a member of the Academy of Family Physicians and Hawai'i Medical Association. Ruth Ellen Lindenberg, a respected advocate for those who could not speak for themselves, died last Friday, May 7, 2004 at the Maunalani Nursing & Rehabilitation Center. She was 91. She had lived independently until a few weeks before her death and remained active in social, health and consumer issues, said the Rev. Sam Cox, a longtime friend and community associate.bShe was working on a report to give as president of the social advocacy group Kokua Council at its next meeting May 24, he said. Instead, her life will be celebrated at the meeting at 11:30 a.m. at Harris United Methodist Church. "If I were to describe an advocate, she would be it," said Rep. Dennis Arakaki (D. Kamehameha Heights-Kalihi Valley), House Health Committee chairman. "She had not only the intelligence, but she had the passion for people, and I think she knew how to express the need of people. ... Throughout the years I have known her, she has always been an advocate for people who had no voice." She was admired for speaking her mind, Arakaki said, adding that her presence was keenly felt at the Legislature. "I know for sure that she made a difference on the issues. I think a lot of other people looked to her for leadership as well. She was a real role model. We're really going to miss her." Cox said Lindenberg "was very outspoken. It sometimes got her into hot water, but she went ahead anyway." In 1999, for example, the AARP's regional office fired her from its Hawaii lobbying committee when her views supporting assisted suicide were published in the Star-Bulletin. Supporters denounced the action as a violation of her civil rights. Lindenberg had been an AARP volunteer for about seven years and was named AARP's Volunteer of the Year in Hawaii in January 1999. "We picked her up immediately, and she become president of Kokua Council," Cox said. Lindenberg was born in Eden, N.Y., where she attended a one-room country school and was one of four in her high school graduating class. She earned her bachelor's degree from Oberlin College in 1930 with a sociology major and went to graduate school at the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work. She became a medical social worker in teaching hospitals at the University of Chicago Hospitals and Montifiore Hospital in Pittsburgh, working with patients and families and community programs. She and her husband "Lindy," who died in 1985, moved to Rochester, N.Y., where he directed the Baden Street Settlement House and she directed the Mental Health Council. She later became a tenured professor at Cleveland State University, helping to establish a baccalaureate social work and rehabilitation program. The couple moved here in 1971, and Lindenberg plunged into community activities, including the Welfare and Employment Rights Commission and the AARP State Legislative Committee, serving as state chairwoman in 1992. She also was active in the Legal Aid Society, the Honolulu Community-Media Council, American Civil Liberties Union, Hawaii Coalition for Health and the National Association of Social Workers-Hawaii, which gave her its first Social Worker of the Year Award in 1985. She was "a fixture" at the Legislature, Cox said, testifying on auto insurance reforms, patients' rights and more health coverage for the uninsured. She often expressed her opinions in a column in the Star-Bulletin and frequently wrote letters to the editor on subjects ranging from fluoridation to regulation of health insurance rates. She explained in a recent Star-Bulletin interview that the Kokua Council has changed its focus from seniors to people of all ages because "we realized some issues are intergenerational." Survivors include a daughter, Sue McClelland, of Spokane, Wash.; daughter-in-law Catherine Strachan Lindenberg, of Seattle and Costa Rica; five grandchildren; and two greatgrandchildren. Her son, Marc, who was dean of the Daniel J. Evans School of Public Affairs, University of Washington, died in 2002. She was Episcopalian but did not want a formal funeral, said Cox, a retired United Methodist minister. William "Huddy" Lucas, former executive secretary of the Honolulu Liquor Commission and once a chief government lobbyist for changes to state liquor laws, died Feb. 1, 2004. He was 92. Lucas retired from the liquor commission in April 1976 after 35 years of service. He was executive secretary (now known as administrator) from 1949 to 1976. He was president of the National Association of State Liquor Administrators in 1961. Lucas was born on March 29, 1911. He graduated from McKinley High School in 1929 and joined the commission in 1941, at a time when alcohol wasn't sold on Sundays. "He was one of the nicest, most decent men I've known," said Miliaulani Landgraf, his eldest daughter. "He was my hero." Landgraf said her father lived in Waimanalo from 1944 and was a member of the Outrigger Canoe Club. She said she never heard her father speak ill of anyone and that his one-liners will be sorely missed. John Carroll, chief investigator for the liquor commission, said Lucas was respected by everyone on both sides of the liquor industry. "I was amazed by his knowledge of the industry, and we learned a lot from him," Carroll said. "He was known throughout the country." He is survived by his wife, Frances; daughters, Frances M. Landgraf and Wilma L. Putt; sons, Huddy T. Lucas and Emery Lucas; 12 grandchildren; 16 great-grandchildren; 3 greatgreat-grandchildren; and a sister, Mabel L. Davis. William Huddy Lucas - When William Huddy Lucas joined the Honolulu Liquor Commission staff in 1941, bottled liquor could not be sold on Sundays, and a woman would not enter a bar unless accompanied by a man. When Lucas retired in 1976 after 27 years as administrator of the city office that controls the alcohol industry, he had only just persuaded state legislators to change the last of the "blue" laws to permit liquor sales on election days. The sexual conduct of female employees in bars had grown to one of the major issues for the office that grants liquor licenses and enforces rules. "He

was a large part of the history of the commission, and he talked about how the changing industry reflects the moral attitude of the community," said current Administrator Wally Weatherwax, who conducted a video interview with Lucas for the office archives. Lucas, 92, died Sunday Feb. 1, 2004 at his Waimanalo home. A scrapbook that Lucas left in the office provides a history of the changes in controls and attitudes about the liquor industry. "Blue law" restrictions reflected the national Prohibition, which was repealed in 1933. Martial law was in effect during World War II, with liquor ration cards and a curfew that closed bars before dark. A 1955 story tells of a club in jeopardy of losing its license because an entertainer stripped down to panties and bra. Lucas lobbied for changes in the liquor laws such as ending government price-setting, but he favored government controls on the business. "I don't think there is any doubt that the liquor industry needs special regulating because of the nature of the product," he told the Star-Bulletin in a 1976 interview. "It is a product which is behind one of our nation's major health problems (alcoholism)." "He was a man of great integrity, by the book," said chief liquor investigator John Carroll, who worked with Lucas. "He was very knowledgeable and well respected by people in the industry. And he was a nice human being. We learned a lot from him. I don't recall him every raising his voice." Carroll said Lucas continued his interest for years after retiring, returning to the office to collect data for the Distilled Spirits Council of the United States and attending annual statewide conventions. Lucas belonged to the National Conference of State Liquor Commissions and, when he was elected president in 1961, brought the national convention to Hawaii. "Dad had high moral standards, and that's what he wanted for us," said daughter Miliaulani Landgraf. "He expected it from his staff. He had kolohe people working for him, and he made them toe the line." She recalled her father returning a Christmas gift of fruit because the neighbor who gave it happened to hold a liquor license. "He insisted on paying his way everywhere." Despite frail health in recent years, Lucas never wanted to miss a party invitation and enjoyed time spent at the Outrigger Canoe Club, Landgraf said. He and his wife lived in Waimanalo, where he was a founder of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church and Waimanalo Lions Club. "He was a good storyteller," she said. "He was famous for his one-liners and laughed hardest at his own jokes. It was his wonderful sense of humor that sustained us during his illness." Lucas is survived by wife Frances T., sons Huddy T. and Emery R., daughters Landgraf and Wilma Putt, sister Mabel L. Davis, 12 grandchildren, 16 greatgrandchildren and three great-grandchildren. The cause of death wasn't specified. He worked 41 years with Bank of Hawai'i rising from a trainee to a vice president and regional manager. Lyons retired in 2000. When he wasn't

working, Lyons was involved in at least 16 community groups.
