Solomon Kalapawai Mahoe Jr., a son of the Hawai'i of bygone days, left a small bit of himself in many people, some of whom are scattered to the four corners of the globe. "He had the capacity for being thrilled with all that was going on around him," his daughter Nani Mahoe said. "His friends

probably number in the thousands." However, those who gathered at his Kailua family home Saturday to bid him a fond farewell were an intimate group by Hawaiian standards, only about 150 or so. Even during the planning phase, weeks in advance, his daughter knew it would be an emotional occasion. "Hawaiians have a way of singing and dancing and laughing and crying, a catharsis," she said. Yesterday, in a private family observance, the tapa-decorated urn containing his ashes was sunk in the sea off Kailua Bay that he loved as much as his life on land. About 30 people took part in that ceremony, Nani Mahoe said. The sense of loss, she said, is profound for those who knew him. Even for those who didn't, the Sept. 25, 2004 death of "Uncle Solo" should be noted, his daughter said, because he represented a way of life that is ebbing rapidly. "My father was like an ambassador of good will," Nani Mahoe said. "He took his culture with him and was very engaging. He had that personality so that people were drawn to him." The official records showed Solo Mahoe to have been 90, she said, but he often claimed to be a year older than that. In any case, he was his parents' first-born child and, by tradition, was given to his grandparents to raise. So the customs he learned, the outlook on life, were far older than his years. He was a native speaker of Hawaiian, Nani Mahoe said, and grew up in Maunawili, then a mix of rice fields, banana groves and papaya trees. "Daddy's early years in Hawai'i were idyllic," she said. "He says it was so quiet that he could hear his tutu's whistle to call him home. "Daddy rode his horse everywhere, down to the beach, up over the Pali to town ... everything moved at its own natural pace." Through his life he worked as a Waikiki lifeguard, raised pigs, owned a lunch wagon with his wife, was a civilian public works employee during World War II and a city roadwork foreman thereafter. If such activities constituted his livelihood, fishing was his life. At a Kailua town reunion almost two decades ago, he recalled learning to fish with his grandfather, setting out in a boat on Kawainui Marsh, which in those days was an open lake. Solo's middle name refers to the land, near the beachside shop of the same name, owned by the Mahoe clan for many years. He knew of countless spots for fish, lobster and octopus, Nani Mahoe said. "We are told that our 'aumakua (family god) was the shark, and as such, offerings were made to the mano at a special family shrine close to Kane'ohe Marine Base," she said. A grandnephew, the well-known kumu hula Chinky Mahoe, said "Uncle Solo" would befriend just about anyone he encountered, including the tourists who found their way to Kailua Beach, then considered a remote location. "Today, you don't find people having the aloha that he had," he said. "He just gave freely. There's not too many people that will hang out by the beach and entertain the tourists." He married the former

Mona Park; the couple had three daughters — not counting the many hanai kids adopted into the household. "I remember as a child my father swimming in dark blue ocean with sharks," Nani Mahoe said. "I watched the top fin cut through the water, frightened. Daddy reminded me that I should not be afraid of the shark — they would not hurt us. "However, I told him that I was only half-Hawaiian and maybe the shark would only see the Korean in me." He was widely traveled, bringing his Hawaiian language and culture with him. Nani said he outlived almost all his contemporaries, leaving only a half-brother among his elder 'ohana. His friends at the end of life were largely the children and grandchildren of those befriended decades earlier. "He felt his life was one of fun," she said. At the ceremony at her home on Saturday night, there were many remembrances, song and stories about Solo Mahoe. "Good fun," was a phrase heard many times. "It was good fun," the people who remembered Solo said. "All good fun." At the conclusion of the celebration, Nani performed a hula in memory of her father. The title was "I'll Remember You." Then yesterday, his friends and family took his ashes out onto Kailua Bay. Solo Mahoe had chosen as his final resting place a large ginger jar with tapa print. "He said, 'This is going to be my house.' And he was specific, telling us to attach the lid but not seal it. This is so when he was ready to leave he could get out," Nani said. "He said, 'When I'm ready to leave, I want to frolic in the ocean, tickle the ladies and sun on the beach.'" Born in Kailua. Francis A. McHale Jr., a well-known and innovative marine construction engineer and leader in alternative energy, died June 2 at his home in Honolulu. He was 70. McHale moved to Hawai'i in 1966 and worked for Hawaiian Dredging & Construction Co. for 33 years before retiring in 1999. During that time, he participated in ocean technology projects that wrote him into the history books, according to his peers. "Frank was an original thinker who pushed the limits of every endeavor he undertook, especially in pursuing new energy concepts for Hawai'i," said Tak Yoshihara, a former state energy director. His most groundbreaking work was to assist the state, Lockheed and Dillingham International — Hawaiian Dredging's parent company at the time — in the development of an experimental plant that created thermal energy from a mix of seawater: cold water from the depths, and warm from the surface. McHale was project manager for Mini-OTEC, the world's first successful working ocean thermal energy plant, said John Craven, a top scientist in the federal government's submarine programs in the 1960s and Hawai'i's marine affairs coordinator under Gov. John A. Burns. Craven said when Mini-OTEC was proposed in response to the energy crisis of the early 1970s, he insisted on a single project manager to coordinate the undertaking for all three partners. McHale got the job, and Mini-OTEC successfully created 100 kilowatts of energy. "Eventually," Craven said, "it will be a major, major source of energy." Research and development of the large pipelines needed for ocean thermal energy conversion paved the way for the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawai'i at Keahole on the Big Island. McHale's management at Hawaiian Dredging also advanced the construction of the Clarey Bridge, which spans Pearl Harbor to Ford Island. The floating concrete bridge has the world's longest movable span opening. McHale was a low-key person who had a way of deflecting the spotlight away from himself and toward the project, Yoshihara said. "However significant his contributions were," he said, "I will remember him best for his friendship." McHale loved tugboats, his friends said, and was a member of the team that restored the Navy's USS Hoga. The Hoga had helped to ground the USS Nevada when it was hit during the

attack on Pearl Harbor, keeping the damaged ship from blocking the channel. McHale was born in Providence, R.I. He attended the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and graduated in 1961 from the Cornell University School of Civil Engineering. He was an Air Force veteran. Later, he was a member of the Navy League. McHale is survived by his wife, Sharon McHale of Hono-lulu. He leaves a daughter, Kara Eastwood of Glen Ellyn, Ill., and a son, Christopher J. Barrett Melvin - When the lights first appeared every morning, one man would loudly declare to everyone, "Welcome to the beautiful Leilehua Golf Course." Such announcements stopped years ago and the man behind them, Hawai'i Hall of Fame golfer Barrett Melvin, quietly passed away Monday May 31, 2004 morning at Wahiawa General Hospital. He was 86. Described as a well-mannered man, Melvin is remembered for his golf ethics as much as his respect for others on the course. "He kept telling (our children) 'manners, manners' on the golf course," said Vicki Melvin, his wife of 60 years. "If you whispered or turned your head when someone was putting, he would tell you not to do it again." Tom Hrdlicka, owner of Tom's Golf Shop in Wahiawa, said Melvin "had a lot of respect for the other individuals no matter what kind of game they were playing." Melvin was inducted into the Hawai'i Golf Hall of Fame in 2000, decades after leaving his mark on the local golf scene. Besides winning the PGA of Hawai'i Match Play Championship in 1950 and the inaugural Navy-Marine Open in 1951, he was also a head pro at the Kalakaua and Leilehua courses. Melvin also served as pro and manager at Maui Country Club from 1952 to 1954 and built and operated several local courses and driving ranges. He also held course records at Kalakaua and Fort Shafter. On a national level, Melvin qualified for the U.S. Open 11 times and the PGA Championship from 1948 to 1951. "He loved playing competitive tournament golf with his heart and soul," Vicki said. Born and raised in Pennsylvania, Melvin was the son of a long line of Scottish pros. He learned to make golf clubs at the age of 8 and by the time he was 14, he won a state high school golf championship. He made his first U.S. Open appearance when he was 16. Melvin came to Hawai'i in 1942 as a U.S. Army lieutenant and met Vicki on Kaua'i. She remembered their first meeting when he agreed to stop smoking if she went out with him. They were married in 1944. He then went on to serve in Saipan, Iwo Jima, New Guinea and other places in the Pacific during World War II. Both of his sons, Buzz and Edward, joined the military, but only Buzz, the eldest child, took up golf. "(My father) insisted that it was a really simple game," Buzz said. "You master a few basics of the game, hone your skills and after that, you'll be just fine." Despite retiring in 1987, Melvin continued playing golf. "He had a real good game. He even played up until about eight years ago," Hrdlicka said. Around that time, the death of his best friend and golfing partner, and the theft of his golf bag that included two clubs given by his father took the game from him. "He missed them (clubs) more than anything else," Vicki said. "He searched and looked all over the shops for those two (type of) clubs. He said he'll never buy another set. He knew he was fading." For the past several months, osteoarthritis and

age began taking a toll on Melvin's 6-foot-2 frame. He was confined to his bed and put on a liquid diet. Having difficulty speaking, he would smile or squeeze someone's hand instead. Vicki, who was a foot shorter than her husband, cared for him and recalled a time when she rested her head on his chest. Melvin gently patted her head and whispered, "I'm so sorry mommy." Besides Vicki and his two sons, Melvin is survived by daughters Bari Wynn Ruiz and Heather Melvin, six grandchildren and sister Wilhelmina Russell. A private service is being planned. Gaylord Leslie Mercer - Hawaii's Uncle Sam is being memorialized today with his old red, white and blue uniform and top hat resting on his casket. Burial services for Gaylord Leslie Mercer, who played Uncle Sam in the Kailua Fourth of July Parade for 38 years, are being held today at Borthwick Mortuary. The retired salesman, 88, from Hawaii Kai, died Monday Jan 12, 2004 at the Maunalani Nursing and Rehab Center in Kaimuki. Mercer was "a true patriot, a real trouper, a real soldier, even though he didn't wear a (military) uniform," said retired Army Lt. Col. Darrell Large, a friend and neighbor. Because of an injury, Mercer was unable to serve in the military, but he made up for it, Large said. "He took such pride in this (being Uncle Sam). He would say, 'Whenever I get this Uncle Sam uniform on, I feel like a different person.'" Large drove Mercer on the back of his convertible for a couple of years so he could still be a part of the Fourth of July parade after he broke his thigh bone in 2001. Mercer handed out flags to children, and even grew his own beard because marching in the sun made the fake ones fall off, said his daughter, Lynn Mercer DeFelicis. DeFelicis said her father, born in Springfield, Mo., also appeared at various military and civic events in the community, following his initial appearance as Uncle Sam for the Hawaii Bankers Association to promote savings bonds. Mercer was "very gregarious and always shook people's hand," she said. "He was very sweet, very kind and very generous ... a warmhearted spirit. He was without pretension." DeFelicis said she asked Large to promise her father the day before he died that Large would take over as Uncle Sam so her father would not worry. Large said he did so, but he will not make a full commitment "until I know I can represent Uncle Sam and at least do honor to it," he said. "I don't want to be so far below (what he did). He has big shoes to fill." Mercer gave his support to such organizations as the Hawaii Foodbank, the Boy Scouts and the Hawaii Blood Bank, donating 140 pints of blood throughout his life. He was a lifelong member of Kiwanis International and a member of the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church for more than 40 years. Mercer also was a champion mile runner in college until a severe heel injury ended his running career and made him ineligible for the military. But it did not stop him from running local marathons in his 70s, long-distance swimming and riding his bike up Kaimuki's hills, DeFelicis said. Miller's globe-trotting exploits were once described as the kind of glamorous career that inspired young journalists. The stories he wrote bore datelines from exotic places: Da Nang, Phnom Penh, Burma, Sydney, Tokyo, even Antarctica. "He was a legend, a marvelous, wonderful storyteller," said Eddie Inouye, who worked with Miller in the 1960s and '70s. Miller covered World War II, the Palestine War, the Greek Civil War, the Korean War and the Vietnam War. During World War II, Miller accompanied U.S. Marines when they landed at Guadalcanal. For six weeks, he followed their missions, keeping a diary as he dodged sniper bullets. He also caught malaria. When he returned to the states, newspaper readers got a vivid description of the fighting. Later in the war, in the spring of 1944, Miller was one of 17 survivors of a U.S. ship sunk by a German submarine in the English Channel. They floated in oily water for six hours before they were rescued. But his sister, Shirley McKee of Paso Robles, Calif., said her brother was always lucky. At Verdun, when a piece of shrapnel tore into his right arm, he didn't worry; he was left-handed. Even though he was a civilian, the Army gave him a Purple Heart. His brushes with danger — and his luck — didn't end in Europe. In a 1970 newspaper story, Miller said his interview skills saved his life a few months earlier when he and a photographer were captured by North Vietnamese soldiers in Cambodia. They were held for eight hours, all the while telling their captors they were there to report on their story — which they did. Miller was born in Bound Brook, N.J., on June 10, 1915. He got his start with UPI the day after he graduated from the University of Nevada in 1938, driving all night from Reno to Fresno, Calif., in his Model A for his first day of work. He retired 45 years later, in 1983. Miller spent 16 years as bureau chief in Honolulu. When UPI sent him to head its Sydney bureau in 1980, Gordon Sakamoto took over. Miller knew generals, politicians, movers-and-shakers, Sakamoto said. "My god, there wasn't a place he couldn't go without knowing everybody," Sakamoto said. "Everything he did was at top speed. He was a great newsman. He covered wars, upheavals." In retirement, Miller liked to travel, fish for trout near a home he kept in Whitmore, Calif., and sip vodka gimlets. He spent part of the year in California and part in Hilo with long-time companion Michi Haga. He also had a home in Sydney. McKee said her brother's health was fine until last December, when he suffered the first of several strokes. He was seriously ill for the last six weeks, she said. On Friday, his doctors said

he only had days to live. In a tragic twist, it was also the same day that the Big Island Press Club handed out the journalism scholarship that bears Miller's name, something the organization has done for 30 years. Miller is survived by Michi Haga, who married Miller last Tuesday after a courtship that lasted 54 years. "In the morning I went to ask him what do you want for breakfast," she said. "He said, 'I want to tell you something.' He said, 'I love you.' I said, 'I love you, too.' And he said, 'I want to get married.' " Miller is also survived by his sister, Shirley McKee, two nieces and nephews and nine grand-nieces and nephews. McKee said her brother did not want a funeral service and that the family plans to scatter his ashes in the waters off Hilo. In lieu of a service, they will gather for a meal in his honor and toast him with a gimlet. . [Adv July 27, 2004]

James Sueto Miyake, a 442nd Regimental Combat Team veteran and a retired federal and state education administrator, died July 1 in his hometown of Koloa, Kaua'i. He was 82. Tau Savea Moe, a 2004 Living Treasure and the Odysseus of Hawai'i's steel guitar scene, died Thursday. He was 95 years old. Moe, born in American Samoa in 1909 and raised in La'ie, learned steel guitar in the instrument's infancy and played with Hawaiian legends like M.K. Moke, John Almeida and David Kaili, but was absent from Hawai'i's music scene for most of his life and was only rediscovered here during his old age. Much of the rest of the world got to know him much earlier. The musician and his vocalist wife, Rose, traveled the world from 1928 to 1970, entertaining heads of state, raising their children and, in the late 1930s, sneaking their Jewish friends out of pre-war Germany using a travel pass provided by their admirer, Adolf Hitler. They met Mahatma Ghandi and, while living in India during the war, were performing in East Berlin when the wall went up. They worked alongside many of the top Big Band entertainers of the 1940s and 1950s in Western Europe and Asia and traveled regularly in countries behind the Iron Curtain. "It's the stuff you make movies of," said Ishmael Stagner, Hawaiian music historian and a former professor of Hawaiian Studies at BYU-Hawai'i. "Movies and movie sequels." Stagner, formerly of La'ie, met Moe and his late wife, Rose, through their son, Lani. Lani, who was born in Japan, is now deceased. The couple is survived by their daughter, Dorian Moe-Vineula, who was born in India, and by their nieces and nephews. Lani's talk of childhood memories drew Stagner to question the Moes about their experiences, which they were at first shy about, but able to document with letters, documents, photographs and playbills pulled from an old steamer trunk the couple had carried on their travels. When Rose died and Moe began growing frail, Stagner began working to get the couple recognized in Hawai'i. The Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i named Moe a "Living Treasure" in January. A recording the couple made in 1989 with Bob Brozman, "Remembering the Songs of Our Youth," chronicled the couple's earlier music and sold worldwide. Tau and Rose began the travels of their youth with a group managed by a French University professor called Mme. Riviere's Hawaiians, but later broke off on their own. They traveled in Asia, performing in Japan, China, the Philippines

and many other countries before moving to Europe. They became popular in Germany when Hitler took power, and met him through their performances and charity work, Stagner said. Hitler gave them a pass that allowed them to travel in and out of the country freely. After they saw their landlords murdered by the Nazis, they began using the pass to smuggle Jewish friends to safety, he said. Eventually they were forced to flee Germany themselves, and, when the war broke out, they worked their way across the Middle East in hopes of eventually finding passage back to Hawai'i. That hope died when Japan bombed Pearl Harbor, and travel across the Pacific was restricted. The couple settled in India until the war ended, then began traveling in Western and Eastern Europe. Playbills show the couple performed with Louis Armstrong, Tommy Dorsey and Josephine Baker, among others, Stagner said. At the insistence of their children, who wanted to know more about their Polynesian heritage, the family moved back to La'ie in 1970, Stagner said. Moe's daughter, Dorian, said her father was well loved. "He's gone to his final performance," she said. "And he went out a headliner." Wili Moku - Isle radio personality Wili Moku believed in being himself. Friends say that is how Moku drew listeners to Hawaii's airwaves for more than two decades and drove up ratings at station KQMQ during the 1980s. The celebrity spokesman for the American Diabetes Association of Hawaii was also upfront about the disease that cost him both his legs. "A lot of disc jockeys became disc jockeys because of the kind of person that he was," said longtime friend Kimo Akane. "He was pretty unique. He was himself." Moku, whose real name was Michael Saragosa, died yesterday Jan 29, 2004 at St. Francis Medical Center-West when his heart stopped during a dialysis session and doctors were unable to revive him, said his sister Karen Alcosiba. Moku was 47, and his survivors include an 8-year-old daughter. "He could do it all. He could be wild. He could be charming. He could be funny as hell. It all matched the tempo of the show," said John Matthews, program director for Oldies 107.9, where Moku had been for the past two years on a Sunday show from 6 to 9 p.m. Listening to other deejays during

his years at Waipahu High School inspired Moku to get into radio. "I thought, 'I can do that,'" he told the Star-Bulletin in 2000, the same year that a number of local entertainers put on a benefit concert for the broadcaster to help pay for his medical bills and dialysis treatment. Moku got his radio start in 1975 running errands at KORL. By the end of the year, he had a show of his own. The deejay moved to KKUA AM 690 with Akane in the early 1980s and finally made it to KQMQ, where he put in a 13-year stint and made a show that was consistently top-rated among young listeners. He also co-hosted "AJI Magic City," Japan's No. 1 weekend show. "He loved entertaining people," Alcosiba said. "He loved the radio. ... He loved being Wili Moku." Moku not only introduced music, he played it. In 1982 he wrote and recorded "Palolo Valley Girls," a parody of Frank and Moon Unit Zappa's hit, "Valley Girls." Akane said his friend was a "pretty accomplished" guitar player and singer, who called his style of music "back to the wood." Moku left the islands in the late 1990s. It was while in California that, after years of neglecting his condition, Moku's health finally failed and doctors had to amputate his legs and two of his fingers. Moku was devastated, Alcosiba said. But he returned to Hawaii in 2000 and went public with his disease to bring more awareness to diabetes, she said, adding that he always told her, "There wasn't anything else I could do but tell people to look at me and learn from it." Moku lived with his sister for three years after returning from the mainland. In October he moved into an apartment on his own at a Waipahu facility for people with disabilities. "With everything that he was going through ... he actually told people to look past their problems," Alcosiba said. "With everything he went through, he actually encouraged other people." Word of Moku's death shocked those who knew him, many of whom had recently shared laughs with the deejay. "Our whole staff is reeling because we just had a staff meeting last night, so literally 24 hours ago we were all sitting around the same table, eating pizza and making jokes," Matthews said, adding that he would tell the station's listeners of Moku's death this morning. "It's going to be a real somber thing to have to tell people. Everybody remembers him for being possibly the best afternoon disc jockey Hawaii's ever seen." Moku is also survived by sister Linda Saragosa, brother Michael and daughter Dakota Jane, who lives with Moku's ex-wife in California. Services are pending. [SB 30/01/2004]
