Russell Reetz, a sailor aboard the USS Ward, which is credited with firing the first U.S. shots of World War II at Pearl Harbor, has died. He was 88. He died Nov. 4 of complications related to lymphoma and heart and lung problems. Reetz was 25 years old when his fellow crew members, including 82 reservists from St. Paul, fired two shots at a Japanese two-man submarine trying to sneak into Pearl Harbor a little more than an hour before the attack on Dec. 7, 1941. One shot sunk the submarine, but it wasn't until two years

ago that the wreckage was found by the Hawai'i Undersea Research Laboratory. Reetz was elated by the discovery, said his daughter, Cindy Tritz. He asked her to write a letter to a skeptical admiral he met, because the admiral told him he didn't think it was possible that the Ward's shells could sink a submarine, she said. "The letter said, 'Have you heard that they found it?" "Tritz said. "He got a very nice response from the admiral that said, 'I'm glad to believe the impossible can happen.' "In his later years, his involvement with the Ward become more important to him, said his widow, Loretta Reetz. "That was what kept him going," she said. He became the secretary-treasurer of the First Shot Naval Vets, a club formed in 1947 by the men of the Ward. The group helped have the gun from the Ward brought in 1958 to St. Paul, where it sits on the Capitol grounds. Born and raised in West St. Paul, Reetz joined the Naval Reserves in 1940. Harry "Pop" Robello, one of the original Waikiki beachboys who worked and played with the likes of Duke Kahanamoku, Chick Daniels and Splash Lyons, died April 26, 2004. He was 86. Robello was born on Aug. 31, 1917, in Honolulu. He attended McKinley High School, but at 14 he ran away from home and wound up on the beach. Robello's life was the beach and chumming up with the rich and famous who could afford to take a vacation in Hawai'i in the 1930s and 1940s. His son, Harry "Didi," said his father was one of the original ambassadors of aloha. "A lot of what they did then is what we do now, but they did it with a lot more grace and style," said Didi Robello, who operates Aloha Beach Services, a concession that Pop Robello started in 1958 at the Moana Hotel. One of Pop Robello's good friends was silent-movie star Dorothy Mackaill, who lived at the Royal Hawaiian Hotel for 35 years. Robello was one of four beachboys who were named in her will. Didi Robello said that on at least three occasions, his father was invited by visitors to spend some time with them on the Mainland. "My dad would tell me that people would come and take them back on the boat. He'd go to a farewell party with just the clothes he was wearing and the next thing you know they were blowing the horn and he says he has to get off, but these people are saying, 'Nah, you're coming with us' and he'd go and spend a few months up there with them. Then they'd ship him back when he was ready to come home," Didi Robello said. Back in the golden days of Waikiki there were just two hotels — the Moana and Royal Hawaiian — and the only contact many visitors had was with the beachboys, Didi Robello said. He credited them as being the "founders" of modern tourism in Hawai'i. "The tourist industry is where it's at today because of the good times that these guys have shown everybody," he said. "If these guys didn't show all these people a good time, we could be like Jamaica or something, growing coffee." Didi Robello, 41, took over the business in 1983 and his father repaired canoes and surfboards in his retirement. Didi Robello said the business continues to thrive and he credits his father for much of that. "He pretty much taught me how to be nice to everybody," Robello said. "You can't make everybody happy, but try to make most of them as best as you can. And he said to make sure everything is clean. Keep

your beach clean, keep your stand clean, keep your boys clean." In addition to his beachboy activities, Robello worked as a stunt man and extra in several Hollywood movies. Peggy Ryan, who had a recurring role on CBS' "Hawaii Five-O" and teamed with dance partner Donald O'Connor in movie musicals, has died at age 80 in Las Vegas. Ryan played Jenny Sherman, secretary to Jack Lord's Steve McGarrett, in the Honolulu police drama "Hawaii Five-O" from 1969 through 1976. She also teamed with O'Connor in such movie musicals as "This Is the Life" and "When Johnny Comes Marching Home." Ryan died Oct. 30, 2004 in Las Vegas' Sunrise Hospital, said hospital spokeswoman Cheryl Smith. The cause was complications from two strokes, friend Dottie Fusch said. Ryan, who had taught tap dancing and produced revues in Las Vegas for the last several years, was teaching and performing until several days before entering the hospital, Fusch said. Ryan danced and acted in more than two dozen films, but her most memorable roles were with O'Connor. The duo was known for high-energy, complex routines in films such as 1943's "Mister Big" and 1944's "Chip Off the Old Block," "The Merry Monahans" and "Bowery to Broadway." Her final movie was "All Ashore" with Mickey Rooney in 1953. Her career covered both sides of the stage lights — as a dance school instructor, a frequent performer, and a choreographer for musicals at Honolulu Community Theatre (which now is Diamond Head Theatre). One of her innovations was the sand dance number in a 1975 Honolulu Community Theatre production of Meredith Willson's "Music Man," which featured John Rampage, current artistic director of the theater group, and attracted the composer of the musical to a performance. Ryan was the ex-wife of Midweek and former Advertiser columnist Eddie Sherman. She was born Margaret O'Rene Ryan on Aug. 28, 1924, in Long Beach, Calif. By age 3, she was dancing professionally in her parents' vaudeville act.
