He was twice elected chief of staff at the Queen's Medical Center, serving from 1981 to 1988. He retired in 1993 at age 75. Dr. Richard Y. Sakimoto, 98, a pioneering Hawaii obstetrician and gynecologist who delivered 12,000 babies before he stopped counting in 1989, died April 26, 2004. He was Hawaii's first board-qualified OB-GYN when he began practice in 1938 and was the founding fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. "He was a living legend in obstetrics and gynecology in Hawaii," said Dr. H. Lorrin Lau, an OB-GYN and longtime associate and friend of Sakimoto. Sakimoto's parents

lived in Hawaii, but he was born in Japan in February 1906 while his mother, Maki, was visiting her mother after the Russo-Japanese War. She left him and his 3-year-old sister with their paternal grandparents, and they were sent to Hawaii when he was 5. He attended Royal School, then McKinley High School, which was "truly amazing" because children in those days were expected to work instead of go to school, said Lau, whose mother was one of Sakimoto's classmates. Sakimoto once wrote that McKinley's principal and teachers in four years gave him "valuable guidance and inspiration to seek high things," Lau said. He was a charter member of the McKinley Chapter of the National Honor Society, student body president and a colonel in the ROTC. He attended the University of Hawaii and in 1929 was accepted to Washington University's School of Medicine in St. Louis. He spent 10 years there for his internship and residency training. Returning to Hawaii, he "overcame a myriad of difficulties" in establishing his practice, said his son, Richard. His father often took no money from his patients, he said, describing how one returned years later, paid him and said, "Now they are officially my kids." "He was a generous, really nice, good guy," Rick Sakimoto said. "He was very nonpretentious." Sakimoto built the landmark Medical Arts Building, opening it in December 1949 with his office on the ground floor. Sakimoto was chief of OB-GYN service at the Queen's Medical Center from 1949 to 1964, an associate clinical professor at the UH John Burns School of Medicine and a member of the UH Alumni Association Board of Governors and the UH Foundation's President's Club. He was a past president of the UH Alumni Association, and he received the association's 50 Years of Distinguished Service Award. He also was honored with a Special Citation for Distinguished Service in 1983 by Washington University, where he was known as "Hawaiian Dean of Medicine." Aside from medicine, Sakimoto was Honolulu police commissioner from 1960-65 and owner of the local Asahi Baseball Team for one or two seasons. He loved sportfishing and giving away his catches, his son said. He was captain of the 55-foot sport fishing cruiser Kamome, which he built and kept at Kewalo Basin. He was a founder of the Hawaiian International Billfish Tournament, which he often entered and won. "He was a tough fisherman," his son said, recalling a trip when he was about 11. "Fish smell and blood were everywhere. ... Then my dad hands me this sandwich he just made, and it's just covered in fish scales." Lau recalled meeting the Kamome when it came into Kewalo Basin during a hurricane in 1982. "Everybody on the boat was leaning over the side vomiting. There was Sakimoto standing eating saimin as though nothing happened." Sakimoto was a scholar and author and was involved in politics, working with former Gov. William Quinn and

community leaders to foster business between Hawaii and Japan after statehood, Lau said. He continued his medical practice until age 92 and was mentally sharp and physically active until his death, Lau said. "He lived right and was tough to the end." Louis "Koko" Santos, whose basketball coaching career spanned four decades and was highlighted by a state championship at Kailua High School, died early yesterday March 29, 2004 of prostate cancer. He was 77. The Surfriders won their last basketball state title in 1982 as Kailua beat Maryknoll 47-42. Tony Sellitto, his opposing coach in that game, said Santos was respected throughout the state. "When you play against a coach who knows what he's doing, it makes the game a lot more exciting," Sellitto said. "I knew that when we played Koko's teams they would always be well-

conditioned and well-prepared. I always looked forward to playing them because I knew my kids would get a great run and we would learn something." Santos also was the first basketball coach at Hawaii Loa College, an NAIA school that was later absorbed by Hawaii Pacific University. His son, Rex, played for him there. "He always believed no player was without talent, that he could get something out of anyone," Rex Santos said. "A lot of time was spent on fundamentals and the mental part of the game. One of his big things was that regardless of your position, you should know not just your position, but your teammates' too. And to take it a step further, you should know what the opponents are doing." Louis Santos lettered in swimming, track, football, basketball and baseball at McKinley High School. He was drafted by the Army in 1945, and later went to the University of Oregon on a swimming scholarship. In 1953, Santos became a teacher at Honokaa High School, and the Dragons won their first Big Island Interscholastic Federation basketball championship in his first season as coach in 1954. He returned to McKinley to teach and coach at his alma mater, and then went to Kailua in 1958. Santos was also athletic director at Kailua, and later a vice principal at Kalaheo. He was also an outreach counselor for the Windward District. His coaching record with the Surfriders also included three league championships. Santos was diagnosed with prostate cancer three years ago. The cancer went into remission, but returned last year. Roy G. Sapp, senior pastor at First Assembly of God in Honolulu from 1976 to 1994, died Friday May 14, 2004. He was 75. "He was the greatest example for Jesus Christ I have ever known in my life," said Janet Kusuhara, pastor of First Assembly of God. "He was a pastor's pastor. He allowed us to dream. Kobe Shoji, the father of University of Hawai'i women's volleyball coach Dave Shoji, died Saturday night Nov. 13, 2004. Shoji, 84, passed away while son Dave's team was in the midst of a memorable comeback against Nevada. "I thought about that," said Dave, whose second-ranked unbeaten team lost the first two games. "I said to myself, 'We've got to win this.' " Kobe Shoji had battled lung cancer and Parkinson's disease the past year. He entered Queen's Medical Center Oct. 23 with fluid in his lungs and died of natural causes, according to the family. Shoji was a member of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team. He met wife Chiz at a relocation camp in Arizona. Along with Chiz, he leaves behind six grandchildren, three daughters-in-law and three sports-minded sons — Dave, Tom and Kelvin — who are the first to tell you they were never a match for their father. "I would say my dad was the best and toughest of all of us," said Tom, who coaches volleyball at the University of Southern Colorado. "He had four front teeth knocked out in a football game in college and kept playing. He goes to Germany, fights in the war, is wounded twice and comes back and never talks about it. He was a leader in the war, people looked up to him. Then he comes back and has to fight discrimination and he never complained one bit to us." Kobe Shoji was described by a family friend as a "sweet bear" for the formidable presence that disguised an exceptionally kind and generous spirit. He also had a gift for every passion he pursued. His

father, who was 104 when he died, came from Japan and had a lemon farm in Upland, Calif., where Kobe worked and grew to love sports. He long jumped 24 feet in the 1930s and was a single-wing tailback at Chaffey JC and Pomona College. It was during his junior year at Pomona that the evacuation order came. Kobe chose to go with his family "with nothing more than what we could put in a suitcase" to the internment camp. He enlisted the next year. When he returned to complete his studies in 1946, he recalled being treated "like nothing happened ... except we were all much more mature due to the wartime experience. We all had the feeling we must do something to make the world a better place to live." Kobe was a brilliant scholar, earning his Ph.D. in plant physiology from UCLA in 1950. He moved here soon after to teach botany and plant physiology at UH for a decade. That was the start of his enthusiastic support of Rainbow sports, particularly the volleyball program his oldest son has coached for 30 years. From 1960 until his retirement in the late 1980s, Shoji worked for C. Brewer and Alexander & Baldwin as a respected agriculturalist. He traveled around the world — living in Iran and Puerto Rico — teaching people how to grow sugar cane. He retired to spend more time beating his sons and grandsons on the golf course and watching as many UH sports as possible. Kobe died with Chiz beside him, as always, watching the Rainbows. He missed the end of Hawai'i's latest, greatest comeback, but his family figured he had the best seat in the house anyway. From his vantage point, he could also see grandson Erik win a state high school volleyball championship in Hilo. Dave knew the end was near for his father and was nearly in tears as he listened to Hawai'i Pono'i before the match. "Every waking moment I'm thinking about him," he had said Friday. Under Kobe's orders, Dave coached to the final point, then rushed to the hospital. "Besides being a scholar and athlete he was a loving husband to my mom for over 60 years and a great father and grandfather," Dave Shoji said. "That's the best thing about him. In his own right he was a great man. He accomplished a lot in his life. Everything he did, he did with a lot of enthusiasm and skill." Services will be 6 p.m. next Monday at Nu'uuanu Memorial Park. Edd Shonk - When Rene Paulo talks about Edd Shonk, he tells of a gentle giant of a man who was untouchable as a stand-up bass musician and arranger. For more than 20 years, Shonk performed with Paulo's quartet in countless gigs at such clubs as Keone's Lounge, the Kahala Hilton's Maile Lounge, Canlis Restaurant and the Ilikai Hotel's Opus One. The foursome darted from venue to venue from the 1960s through the mid-'80s. Edward McKinley Shonk, whose musical career included stints with Louis Armstrong in New Orleans, died July 18 at Castle Medical Center. He was 70. "I consider him one of the best bass players Hawai'i ever produced," said Paulo, a pianist. "Edd and I had such a rapport that he could follow whatever I did, and I could anticipate whatever thoughts he had in his mind. It was uncanny." "We saw him at the hospital a few weeks back, and he had lost so much weight and shaved off his beard," said Akemi Paulo, wife of the pianist and the featured singer in the Paulo group. "He told Rene, 'Pops, maybe we can play some songs' " for the patients. Vocalist Jimmy Borges said Shonk had a manner that put everyone at ease. "He had such a warm way of connecting with musicians and singers," Borges said. "He knew how to say things in a nice way, always making everyone comfortable." Shonk was the musical director and principal arranger for Borges' "Honolulu Lady" album, produced by Bob Nagatani, "and Edd was so easy to work with. With the bass in his paws, it almost looked like he was playing an 'ukulele; the way he handled it, the way he played it, he produced a beautiful and precise sound." While his deteriorating health prevented Shonk from active performances, he was still involved in producing, with Nagatani, a posthumous album release by the late Alan Naluai, the one-time member of

The Surfers group. "That album will be my father's last project," said Edward Andrew Kalani Shonk. "He was always supportive of everyone." Shonk was born in Honolulu on Sept. 29, 1933. After graduating from Roosevelt High School in 1952, he studied music for two years at the University of Hawai'i-Manoa. His stellar musicianship became evident when he joined the Joe Castro Trio early in his career and supported the likes Armstrong in a Basin Street gig in New Orleans. With Paulo, he embarked on regular tours. And in Island engagements, he played with a number of local favorites, from the late Ethel Azama to Azure McCall, providing his inimitable bass flavor in jazz-tinged arrangements. Shonk had other little-known passions: stock car racing in his souped-up Bonneville in Kahuku, learning to fly an airplane at Mokule'ia and earning his pilot's license. Besides his son, Shonk is survived by a daughter, Theresa Lynn Ku'uipolani Dickerson of Indiana; sisters Lois Saunders, Betty Snow and Gladys Frasier; and three grandchildren. Catherine Sofos - Services will be held 10 a.m. Oct. 22 at the Sts. Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Pacific for real estate developer Catherine Sofos, who built the first ridge homes in East Oahu. Sofos died of complications from pneumonia Sept. 29, 2004 at her Honolulu home. She was 82. Sofos and her late husband, Thomas, who started Tasco Realty in 1948, built 257 of the 750 original Waialae Kahala homes and the first 100 homes on Hale Koa Ridge. Sofos was born in St. Louis on Sept. 11, 1922, to Greek parents. Her father was a naturalized American citizen and fought for the United States in World War I, where he was hit with mustard gas. He later died. Sofos returned to Greece after her father's death but moved back to the United States after the Nazis invaded the country. She had dual citizenship. Sofos moved to Reno, Nev., where she worked as a dealer in the casinos. "I never could beat her at poker," said daughter Stephany Sofos, a local real estate analyst. But Catherine Sofos, trained as an accountant, had higher aspirations, so she moved to Hawaii in 1943 to take a job with the Navy as an auditor. "She said when she saw the Waianae Coast, she knew she was home," Stephany Sofos said, adding that her mother also apparently felt the same way about her husband of 53 years. "She met my dad at a cocktail party on Feb. 6, got engaged on Feb. 14 and married him March 1," she said. "I guess she knew what she wanted." The couple, who had a long career in Hawaii real estate, started the popular ridge home development in East Oahu. They hired then-unknown architect Val

Ossipoff to design the homes and built them on speculation. They also built the Sofos building on Kalakaua Avenue, which is still a Waikiki landmark, renting out the bottom as retail space and living on the top. In 1954 they sold the building and moved to Kahala. The couple is also known for starting Oahu's only Greek church, the Sts. Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Cathedral, along with four other families. The church, established in the 1960s, was named in part for Thomas' mother, Helen. Catherine Sofos served as the first president of the women's auxiliary at the church and participated in numerous charities. In her later years she worked as a tax accountant. Thomas Sofos died in 1998. Two of the couple's surviving children, Steven and Stephany, have continued their real estate work. Sofos also is survived by sons Tom and Nicholas and a grandchild. Catherine Bassilika Sofos -- The matriarch of the local Sofos family that helped shape decades of real estate development in Hawai'i died late last month Sep. 2004 after a long illness. Catherine Bassilika Sofos, who died Sept. 29 from complications of pneumonia at 82 in Honolulu, was a fixture at Island construction sites in the 1950s as she helped her husband, Thomas, develop 257 of 750 homes in Kahala. Catherine Sofos, who oversaw accounting and construction site work for the family firm Tasco Realty, helped build the first 100 homes on Wai'alaie Nui Ridge above Kahala. "They were the first ridge developers in East O'ahu," daughter Stephany Sofos, said. "They hired an unknown architect at the time named (Vladimir) Ossipoff. A lot of the old ranch homes with brick are standing today." The daughter of Greek parents, Catherine Sofos also helped establish the Sts. Constantine & Helen Greek Orthodox Cathedral of the Pacific in Honolulu. She was born in St. Louis and moved to Hawai'i in 1943 and worked as an auditor for the Navy. In 1948, Sofos and her husband started Tasco and developed a two-story commercial building with six residential apartments on Kalakaua Avenue in Waikiki that still bears the Sofos name. After the Wai'alaie-Kahala projects, Tasco helped arrange development of the Diamond Head Sands condo on Monsarrat Avenue, then got out of the business. Thomas Sofos died in 1998. Stephany Sofos, a local real estate consultant, said her mother inspired her to get into the business by encouraging her to do whatever she wanted. Her sibling Steve Sofos is president of his own commercial real estate brokerage and management company Sofos Realty in Honolulu. Survivors also include sons Tom and Nicholas and a granddaughter. John Spierling was from the old school. As chairman of the Honolulu Liquor Commission, he had a few simple rules: don't be late, don't talk out of turn, be polite, and don't chew gum. But Spierling also had a soft side and often joked with fellow commissioners as well as those who appeared before the panel. He was active in community affairs and enjoyed much of his spare time with his friends. Spierling, a former Navy officer who developed projects like the Kahala Hilton, and also served on many government boards and commissions, died Saturday in his sleep while on a business trip in San Francisco. He was 74. Spierling had been in good health and his death shocked his friends and colleagues. He was in New Orleans last week for a national conference of liquor commissioners and stopped in San Francisco on his way home. "He was a good friend. He was a man of great integrity, a very thoughtful person," said promoter and longtime friend Tom Moffat, who had a weekly backgammon game with Spierling. "It's a sad time. He was in good health." Liquor Commission administrator Wally Weatherwax said he can't remember Spierling missing a meeting. He said Spierling ran a tight ship, but always had time for a joke. "He wanted to give everybody their say, but he wanted a sense of civility and decorum. And yet, there was a levity that existed," said Weatherwax. "Even though it was very serious business, he knew you had to sometimes take things with a little grain of salt and see that sometimes there are, besides the focus on the particular problem of the day, greater things at hand." Spierling was born on Nov. 20, 1929, in Erie, Pa. He attended the Culver Military Academy and earned a business degree from the University of Pennsylvania. Spierling served in the Navy from 1952 to 1959 and was assigned to mine sweepers. After leaving the service, he came to Hawai'i where he began a long career as a real-estate developer and public servant. Spierling was a general partner of Associates Four, which built and owned the Kahala Hilton, the Regent of Fiji and the Mark Hopkins Hotel in San Francisco. He also was the chairman of the Hawai'i Housing Authority and was a member of the Public Utilities Commission. Spierling was a life member of the Navy League, president of the Admiral Thomas Condo Association, and a Silver Beaver holder in the Aloha Council of the Boy Scouts. In 1997, Spierling was appointed to the Honolulu Liquor Commission which regulates liquor sales and licenses for hundreds of bars,

restaurants and retail outlets. He later became its chairman. Commissioner Dennis Enomoto said he learned a lot from Spierling since joining the panel in 2001. "We will miss his leadership. We don't always agree, but he's been fair and he's always trying to move the commission forward," Enomoto said. "I liked having some discipline. It was a good way to learn and he was a good guy to learn under." Weatherwax agreed. "He'll be missed very much by the commissioners, the staff and the licensing community who knew that the commission, under his leadership, was a fair one," he said. Libby is one of the founders of the Women's Auxiliary. "She was a wonderful and remarkable woman and her husband is a very dedicated person too," Libby said. "She was an incredibly dedicated person and you could ask her to do almost anything and she'd be willing to help." In addition to her work with the Salvation Army, Stillwell served with Goodwill Industries and Soroptimist International. She was the president of the Honolulu Chapter of Women in Communication and was a member of the Metropolitan Rotary Club. The Soroptimist Club of Windward O'ahu honored her by naming a perpetual award given to a community volunteer each year the "Bette Stillwell Distinguished Service Award."
