Carl Williams wasn't a golfer, and not necessarily because he didn't like the sport. "He didn't have time to do all those things," said Dudley Pratt, longtime friend and Williams' successor as president of Hawaiian Electric Co. "He was one of those guys who was really all business," Pratt added. "He really applied himself totally to the company." Williams, who was at Hawaiian Electric's helm for nine years beginning in 1972, died Dec. 6, 2004 at Straub Clinic & Hospital. He was 89. Williams started at HECO in 1945 as an engineer and worked his way up the company's hierarchy. During his time as vice president of planning in the 1960s, he oversaw the company's first rate increase in nearly 20 years. Born in Georgia, Williams was raised in Miami and attended the University of Florida and Georgia Technical University. After graduating with a bachelor's degree in 1939, Williams joined the Army and later fought in World War II. In 1944, he received the Legion of Merit for his service in Okinawa and Guadalcanal. A year later, Williams was honorably discharged while based in Hawaii as a lieutenant colonel. Shortly after taking a mechanical electrical engineering position at HECO, Williams became a manager. Pratt, who would serve as the company's president for a decade after taking the reins from Williams, remembered his former employer as an administrator who was "dedicated to promoting the betterment" of Hawaiian Electric. Williams developed a mathematical model -- which is still in use -- to determine how to most cost effectively expand HECO's service to other parts of the island, Pratt said. He said the formula would factor in the terrain of a given area, and whether to put in wood or steel poles. Pratt said Williams was also instrumental after Hawaii's statehood in meeting the needs of a growing population. "Statehood ... really put on strain on the financial situation of the company," Pratt said. "It was a completely different situation than the company had ever faced ... Norman Sidney Wilson - Norman Sidney Wilson's persistence paid off in February 1994 when he received the money and state approval to implement an automatic external defibrillator program for the Honolulu Fire Department. His legacy is that since 1994, firefighters have used the equipment to save 75 lives, said Fire Chief Attilio Leonardi. Wilson, who retired as an assistant fire chief in December 1994 after 37 years with HFD, died Aug. 21 in Honolulu. In his pursuit to have firefighters trained and equipped to use automatic external defibrillators, Wilson argued in 1991 that advanced cardiac life support service could have saved lives in 39 percent of 74 heart attack cases that year because, as first responders, firefighters could have applied defibrillation within one minute of cardiac arrest. The average response time for ambulances was 8-12 minutes as compared to 3-4 minutes for fire companies, he said. Convincing the state was not an easy task, recalled Leonardi. "He had to go in and get the state to change the law because it didn't allow firefighters to do medical work," Leonardi said. "He failed two times. But he learned the process of how to do it and got it done. "In the early years, we did 4,000 medical responses a year; now we do over 20,000 a year," the chief said. Wilson also served as president of the Hawai'i Fire Chiefs Association. In retirement, he enjoyed making 'ukuleles and playing golf. He began his career with Ka'anapali Development Corp.'s parent company, Amfac Inc., in 1988, serving as a field engineer for O'ahu Sugar. plantation sugar administration for Amfac Sugar Kaua'i. He returned to O'ahu Sugar in 1997 and moved to Maui in June 2000 to assume his post with Ka'anapali Development Corp. Months before, the company, after admitting it erred in previous West Maui developments, had convened a planning conference and enlisted about 100 community volunteers to help devise the Ka'anapali 2020 Project Development Area Plan. The plan includes 2,810 housing units, a golf course, school, hospital and other facilities on 1,154 acres of former canefields above the resort. One of those volunteers, Buck Buchanan of Lahaina, said yesterday that Wriston came on board and made sure the public stayed involved in the process. "He was an honest-to-god, Hawaiian-born, polite guy who listened to everybody," Buchanan said. "He worked at getting the input from the people who were volunteering like myself and made sure people were alerted to the meetings." In addition to development projects, Wriston recently was spearheading community discussions on the company's efforts to preserve coffee cultivation in West Maui and to develop a plan for demolition of the Pioneer Mill without destroying the towering smokestack that has become a Lahaina landmark. "He gave heart and soul, striving to ensure that our projects blended with the community's wishes," said Ka'anapali Development Corp. Executive Vice President Stephen Lovelette in a statement. Wriston also was involved in numerous community groups such as the West Maui Taxpayers Association, the LahainaTown Action Committee, the Rotary Club of Lahaina, the Lahaina Restoration Foundation, the Maui Chamber of Commerce, the Maui Hotel Association and the Maui Historical Society. He was president of the Ka'anapali Golf Estates Community Association. His father said that he loved the outdoors and that deep-sea fishing was his passion.
