He was also an R.O.T.C. instructor. He had worked security at the Hilton Waikoloa Village on the Kohala Coast before going to Iraq this year. "He loved his family very much, his wife and his daughter," Batalona's older sister, Uilani Shibata, told the Star-Bulletin earlier this month. Friends and family say Batalona loved to fish, browse the Internet and tell stories. "I admired him because for a local boy, he has such high hopes and dreams," Batalona's sister-in-law Darla Baquiring told the Associated Press. "And with him being over there, it shows he followed through with them." **Joseph Becker**, one of the founders of Chaminade University of Honolulu who co-wrote a book on the history of Catholic Marianists in Hawai'i, died yesterday Sep. 24, 2004 of cancer. He was 93. Becker was an English professor who enjoyed poetry and painting and wrote the lyrics to the university's alma mater. He was also an author of "New Wars: The History of the Brothers of Mary in Hawai'i 1883-1958," which documented the Marianist experience in the Islands in the years before Chaminade. "The entire Chaminade University community expresses their profound regrets at Brother Becker's passing," said Sue Wesselkamper, the university's president. Becker, who was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., died yesterday morning at St. Francis Hospice after what the university described as a long bout with cancer. Earlier this year, he said he felt that God had called him when he was 13 to become a Marianist brother. Becker was assigned to Hawai'i in 1955 to help establish Saint Louis Junior College, which grew out of the popular Saint Louis School the Marianists have led here since the late 1880s. Two years later, in 1957, the junior college was expanded into a four-year college and renamed for the founder of the Society of Mary, Father William Joseph Chaminade. Becker, one of the school's five founders, was highly regarded as the chairman of the English department but was also known for his art and humor, dressing up as Santa Claus for his students and writing skits and poems for the Marianist Christmas pageant. He told *The Advertiser* in 1967 that he just sort of assumed the role of Santa the first Christmas after he arrived. "That Christmas morning, one of the brothers decided we needed a Santa," he said. "I don't know why they chose me, except that I'm a ham and like to dramatize." Linda Iwamoto, a Chaminade English professor hired by Becker, said she will remember his humility and his deep, moving voice. A student of British literature, Becker wrote about the "Images of Light in the Poet's Romantic Verses" in his doctoral dissertation. "He was fluent in middle English. He would come into class and read Chaucer in middle English," she said. "He was really a renaissance man. "He was very, very sharp and had a droll sense of humor. He was also very humble. There was this great sense of peace about him." Becker obtained his B.A. from the University of Dayton in Ohio, his M.A. from Dominican College in California, and his Ph.D in English at what is now Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. He also worked as the principal at St. Joseph's High School in California. Father Bill O'Connell, director of the Marianist Hall Community, said Becker was an excellent professor who seemed pleased at the way Chaminade has grown. At the start, the junior college had only 31 male students, and Becker wrote at the

time that the Islands needed a four-year school open to both men and women. The Kaimuki school now has more than 2,800 students. "I do get the sense that he was proud of it," O'Connell said. **Brother Karl Canisius Berndlmaier** - The students called him "Brother B" for short. Or "the man in black" because of his fondness for clothes of that color. He was their teacher, counselor, morale booster, confidant. He taped ankles and wrists for the football team — and their opponents — and put ice on the injuries. He would interrupt a class to open the locker of a kid who had forgotten his key, with never a chiding word. He talked faith, feelings and futures, and he had a pat on the back or a kind ear for hundreds of students who have passed through Damien Memorial School in the decade he taught there. On Sunday, Brother Karl Canisius Berndlmaier, 64, collapsed of a heart attack during a school retreat. It happened just as the assemblage was setting up for spiritual prayer circles in which participants shared troubles in small groups, with lighted candles flickering in the center of each. He died an hour later at Wahiawa General Hospital, after telling everyone not to worry, that he would be all right. Tomorrow morning, 550 students from the Catholic boy's school on Houghtailing Street will mourn



his passing with a solemn march between the school and St. Theresa's Co-Cathedral, with five students and the camp rector serving as pallbearers for the service that follows. "He was a cool teacher, a cool guy," said senior Michael Ah Chong, one of the student pallbearers and one of the students attending the retreat weekend when Berndlmaier collapsed. "He always helped everybody." "He was actually down at our level, more of a friend than a teacher," said Lance Powell, another senior who will serve as a pallbearer. "He was everywhere," said Powell. "Our teacher, our college counselor. He also went to plenty sporting events as a trainer and to help tape. When there was a long line to get taped he'd just start helping." Even students who have left Damien remember Berndlmaier fondly. Yesterday, a letter of condolence for the Catholic brothers arrived from Nick Zieser, who graduated last year and is studying at the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. "His countless hours devoted to everyone but himself is truly an inspiration," wrote Zieser of his former teacher. "He truly was a great man and he will be missed." Berndlmaier was a life-long teacher and learner who entered the Catholic brotherhood right out of high school in New York. He spent a lifetime guiding students and adding credentials to his name. During his years teaching he earned three master's degrees at night school and innumerable certificates. Counselor, licensed clinician, marriage and family therapist, addictions counselor, career counselor. "He had a tremendous insight into the fact that one size does not fit all," said Brother Greg O'Donnell, Damien school president. "He was always trying to figure out what it was that each kid needed for that young man to succeed. He was constantly counseling one kid one way and another another." He also had eight certificates for first aid training. On Mother's Day 1999, when the cliffs behind Sacred Falls collapsed into the popular pool that was crowded with Hawai'i families and tourists, Berndlmaier was one of the first to respond, called in by the Red Cross. "He was one of those who provided a lot of grief counseling for a lot of the victims," said Brent Limos, Damien campus minister. "He was CPR- and first aid-certified and probably doing a lot of that, too." Always game to try something new, Berndlmaier pitched in where there was a need. He scavenged for soda cans in the school rubbish bins, recycled them and gave the money to Catholic charities. He took it upon himself to be in charge of collecting spare change during religion classes to send to missions in Peru. And when elderly immigrants needed help with English in order to pass the citizenship exam, he held classes in his office. "He would start dinner at 6 p.m. and be done at 6:15 and be walking out the door so he could teach these elderly people English," said O'Donnell. "We put a note on the door 'We regret to inform you that Brother

Berndlmaier passed away,' and an elderly Asian lady was standing outside his door just crying." His personal office was messy, his desk cluttered, but it was his outer office, with the big table, where students gathered for help with homework, and where he liked to work. "If the job needed to be done, he'd go and do it," said O'Donnell. "If he didn't know something, he'd read a book and find out. Once he was coaching tennis and I said, 'I don't think you know much about tennis,' and his answer was, 'Not yet, but I'll get there.' " Student Powell remembers getting help with his search for colleges, and the way Berndlmaier gathered a list of suitable options that fit his criteria — inexpensive, small and a place where his grades would fit. "He would go the extra mile," said Powell. "He would never say no." [Adv Dec. 1, 2004]

**Clayton Bertelmann** - Hawaiian Homes rancher Clayton Bertelmann, a crewman on the Polynesian voyaging canoe Hokule'a, who went on to guide the construction of the Big Island's own voyaging canoe Makali'i, died yesterday Jan 6, 2004 at North Hawaii Community Hospital. He was 57. "With virtually no resources, he built the Makali'i," said Hawaiian navigator Nainoa Thompson. "His legacy is in that canoe." Thousands of youths have trained and sailed on the Makali'i. "He used it as a floating classroom," said Danny "Kaniala" Akaka, cultural affairs director at the Mauna Lani Resort. "He was driven to bring back our culture, to get kids off drugs, that was his big thing," Akaka said. "With his gruff exterior, he tried to hide his soft heart. None of the kids were fooled," said Noe Noe Wong-Wilson, a member of the ohana, or family, that aided the Makali'i. Waimea veterinarian Billy Bergin remembered Bertelmann, growing up across the street in the 1950s on a small Hawaiian Homes ranch. Bertelmann joined the Air Force and worked on aircraft, Bergin said. "Clay is a complex man, very technically smart, but he loves the outdoors and cattle," Bergin said. Although Bertelmann worked for Parker Ranch as a cowboy, he was also involved with the sea from an early age as a fisherman and diver, Thompson

said. "On the ocean side (of his experiences) he came to terms with a deeper calling," he said. Following the example of his brother Shorty, who sailed on the original voyage of Hokule'a to Tahiti in 1976, Bertelmann joined the 1985 voyage of Hokule'a and sailed to Tahiti and other islands in Polynesia. By the 1992 voyage to Rarotonga, he had become captain of the ship. In 1994, he began efforts to build the Makali'i so the Big Island would have its own canoe. "They had virtually nothing in terms of resources. Voyaging is not something cheap to do," said Thompson. They got money with grassroots methods, like the "dollar, dollar campaign," in which schoolchildren contributed their dollars for the project, said Wong-Wilson. With spruce logs from Alaska because there were no koa trees big enough for the giant canoe hulls, they completed the project in 1995. And they did it with respect for proper cultural practices. Bertelmann asked Keli'i Tau'a, a kahuna pule, or priest in charge of the prayers, to say chants at every stage of construction of Makali'i. When the canoe was launched, an unusual rainbow was seen shooting straight up into the sky, a sign associated with Kamehameha, Tau'a said. Bertelmann died at noon, Akaka said, a significant time when a person's mana, or power, is strong in his body. Bertelmann is survived by his wife Deedee, five children, and six grandchildren. **Robert T. Bobilin**, long-time church activist, scholar and champion of nonviolence, died Dec. 22, 2004 at his Honolulu home. He was 80. Bobilin, born in Brooklyn, N.Y., was a founding director of the Institute for Peace at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa and chairman of the Department of Religion for nine years. During this time he helped institute a graduate

program and a series of conferences and publications on the Buddhist-Christian dialogue. He also served as an adviser to the Hawai'i Association of International Buddhists and was a visiting professor at Kansai Gakuen in Nishinomiya, Japan, and in Bangkok, Thailand. Before coming to UH in 1967 he taught at Whittier College in California, Hamline University in Minnesota and the University of Kansas. Early in his career Bobilin worked with the poor in East Los Angeles, started a "store-front church" in an abandoned ceramics factory and helped residents of the Aliso Village public housing development gain access to government services. In 1988 Bobilin authored the book "Revolution from Below: Buddhist and Christian Movement for Economic Justice," a book that was an outgrowth of his interest in the interaction between Christianity and Buddhism in Southeast Asia. Bobilin was extensively involved in the Hawai'i political and religious community and during the last years of the Vietnam War chaired the American Friends Service Committee in Honolulu. An ordained Methodist minister, he was also on the board of the Hawai'i Institute for Theological Studies and was very active in continuing education for clergy and laymen. Several times he also served as a delegate to the state Democratic Party Convention. In recent years Bobilin and his wife, Dorothy, were actively involved in the Hawai'i Coalition Against Legalized Gambling, fighting to prevent gambling from coming to Hawai'i. The son of a Methodist minister, Bobilin graduated from Adrian College in Michigan and received his Master's of Theology and Doctorate of Philosophy degrees from the University of Southern California. He was a post-doctoral fellow at Harvard University doing research in Southeast Asia supported by the Hazen Foundation. Bobilin is survived by his wife of 50 years, Dorothy Bobilin; two daughters, Cynthia Easley of Gig Harbor, Wash., and Noel "Zaff" Bobilin Furer of Honolulu; a son, Steven Bobilin of Honolulu; a brother, Theodore C. "He was a very unselfish man," said friend Donna Ting. "All I can say is, God bless him. To the end he made a difference." Bodden, 58, died Monday Feb 9, 2004 in his Wailuku home under hospice care. Bodden was honored by two professional associations on Maui last year. He was named "Lawyer of the Year 2002" by the Maui County Bar Association and also received special recognition from the Realtors Association of Maui at an installation luncheon in October. Real estate agent Gerri DeBeer said Bodden conducted himself as a gentleman, "always smiling and upbeat." "That's what I'll miss," she said. Bodden, born in Lafayette, Ind., on Dec. 18, 1945, wrote a weekly newspaper column on the Valley Isle for 23 years and had been on numerous volunteer boards, including past service as president of the Hawaii Association of Realtors and the Kihei Community Association. **Thelma Kaululehuao'aiku Sproat Bugbee**, a part-Hawaiian kupuna who was the second female police officer in the Honolulu Police Department and a retired teacher, died in Nuuanu on July 26. She was 93. Bugbee, a native Hawaiian speaker, also co-wrote two songs, "Ka Waimea Swing," a song of her memories of the cowboys in Waimea, and "Hana no e ka 'oi," with her best friend, Irmgard 'Aluli. Bugbee appeared in a documentary about Queen Lili'uokalani that aired on television in 1997 called "Hawaii's Last Queen." In the documentary, Bugbee said, "If you can imagine something within your own culture that is tremendously important to you, that is suddenly done away with -- just totally ripped out and gone -- that's what we went through." She remained active in perpetuating Hawaiian culture by joining the Hawaiian language professional organization Ahahui 'Olelo Hawaii and the Honolulu chapter of the Hale o na ali'i o Hawaii. Bugbee was born on the Big Island in Waimea and grew up in Kohala, where she and her family spoke Hawaiian. Her family moved to Oahu, where she graduated from Kamehameha Schools and the University of Hawaii in social work. Bugbee started her career as a social worker at the Palama Settlement, but in 1940, she was appointed as a police officer in the Juvenile Division, the second woman in the Honolulu Police Department. Bugbee left the department three years later because she couldn't counsel and help the children, but only could arrest them, said her daughter, L. Pua'ala Fisher. She wanted to help people instead and became the head of the psychiatric social workers at the

territorial mental hospital. Bugbee went into teaching after substituting for a friend at Waimanalo Intermediate School, where she began the Hawaiian studies program as a way to reach out to students who had a difficult time absorbing Western learning methods, Fisher said. Bugbee retired from Kailua Intermediate School over 30 years ago. "I will always remember Auntie Thelma for her open-arm aloha," said Hailama Farden, president of 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawaii. "She was always concerned about you and your family in the real Hawaiian way." She is also survived by daughter Grace Lehua Bacon, son Alvin Bugbee, brothers William and Emanuel Sproat, five grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. **Thelma Kaululehuao'aiku Sproat Bugbee**, a songwriter as well as a retired teacher and social worker, died Monday, July 26, 2004 in Honolulu. She was 93. "Auntie Thelma" — who co-wrote songs with her close friend, the late "Auntie" Irmgard 'Aluli — also was one of the few remaining "manaleo," or native speakers of Hawaiian. Her love of her culture spotlighted her in oral histories and as an interview subject in documentaries. One was a 1996 film on the overthrow of the monarchy; the following year, she appeared in a documentary on the "paniolo" cowboys of the Big Island, said her daughter, L. Pua'ala Fisher. Her career spanned positions as head of psychiatric social work at what was then the territorial mental hospital to teaching at Waimanalo Elementary and Intermediate School, where members of the musical Pahinui clan were among her students. She pioneered an early form of what became the Hawaiian studies program to reach students culturally estranged from Western teaching methods, Fisher said. She was active with the fledgling Democratic Party 50 years ago and as a legislative liaison for the teachers' union. She also was a lifelong friend of 'Aluli who, only months before she died in October 2001, wrote her last composition in Bugbee's honor. 'Aluli spent many of her final evenings playing cards with her "best friend," said 'Aluli's daughter, Mihana Souza. The two co-wrote "Hana No E Ka 'Oi" and "Ka Waimea Swing." Bugbee was a member of 'Ahahui 'Olelo Hawai'i, the Hawaiian language professional organization, said Hailama Farden, the group's president. "Every death of a native speaker is a serious blow," Farden said. Souza said she'll cherish memories of a woman so close to her own mother. "She and

my mother would practice talking their Hawaiian," Souza said. "She was just the dearest. She's in heaven with my mother, playing cards." She is also survived by her daughter, Grace Lehua Bacon; son, Alvin Dewain Kamaikalani Bugbee; brothers, William K. Sproat and Emanuel N. Sproat; five grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.
