Emmett Anthony Cahill, the author of several books on Hawaiian history and an activist in social causes, died Sunday Sep. 19, 2004 at his home in Volcano on the Big Island. He was 90. Cahill is best known for his books, including "Yesterday at Kalaupapa," relating 125 years of the leprosy settlement, as well as a history of Hawaiian postage stamps, a biography of the early Hawaii settler John Young, illustrated by artist Herb Kane, and a history of the landowning Shipman family of East Hawaii. Barbara Anderson, a Shipman family member, said she visited Cahill at his home on Saturday, the day before he died. Cahill was "interviewing" the caregiver for Anderson's father, Roy Shipman Blackshear, she said. "Emmett had a ball" talking to his old friend, her father, Anderson said. "Emmett was bright right to the very end." Two Cahill books are ready for publication next year, one on royal mausoleums and another on the persecution of Catholics in Hawaii in 1829-1839, said his son Jeremiah in Madison, Wis. Playwright Peter Charlot described how he and author Scott Stone met periodically with Cahill for sessions they called, with tongue in cheek, "tea and prayers."

Cahill had an affection for liberal Catholic subjects, which he combined with an Irish sense of humor, Charlot said. After retiring from the Hawaiian Telephone Co. in 1968, Cahill became active in a series of social causes. He led opposition to a plan to move a state prison from Oahu to Maui, and he served as the Hawaii executive of the John Howard Association, a nonprofit prisoner aid organization. In the early 1970s, when labor organizer Cesar Chavez was working with migrant agricultural workers in California, Cahill and the late Fumie Ige set up a support group in Hawaii called the United Farmworkers Hawaii Grape Boycott Committee, his son said. He pushed to make Kalaupapa a national historical park, which he accomplished with the aid of U.S. Rep. Patsy Mink. Born in Kenmore, N.Y., he spent his early years in that state until serving in World War II in the Pacific in an artillery unit. He and his wife, Bernice, moved to Honolulu in 1946, where he worked for the Mutual Telephone Co. Bernice died in 1999. Emmett Anthony Cahill, a community activist and historian who chronicled little-known threads of Hawai'i history, died Sunday Sep. 26, 2004 at his home in Volcano. He was 90. Cahill's books include "The Life and Times of John Young," the story of a young boatswain who became a trusted lieutenant of Kamehameha the Great; and "The Shipmans of East Hawai'i," an authorized history of the noted Big Island family that bought vast tracts of land from the Lunalilo trust in the late 1800s. Two more of his books will be published later this year and early next year, including a history of the persecution of Catholics in early Hawai'i, and a history of the Royal Mausoleum. Born in Kenmore, N.Y., in 1913, Cahill served in the Pacific campaigns of World War II, moving to Honolulu with his wife, Bernice, in 1946. He worked for 22 years for Hawaiian Telephone Co. before retiring in 1968, when he headed the John Howard Association, a nonprofit established to help prisoners. He led the opposition in the late 1960s to a plan to move the Hawai'i State Prison from O'ahu to Maui. the late 1970s, Cahill was co-chariman of the United Farm Workers Hawai'i Grape Boycott Committee to support farm workers. He was a longtime supporter of liberal political candidates and causes. Cahill had an interest in the work of Father Damien at Kalaupapa, Moloka'i, and lobbied for legislation to create a national historic park there, a goal accomplished in 1980. He also wrote a book about the settlement, "Yesterday at Kalaupapa," published in 1990. He is survived by sons Jeremiah of Madison, Wis., and Timothy of Miloli'i; daughter Winifred of Flagstaff, Ariz.; and two grandsons. Liu Chi, the spiritual leader and president of Kuan Yin Temple in Honolulu for more than 40 years, died Thursday Aug 5, 2004. She was 94. Liu then spearheaded a fund-raising effort in Hawai'i that resulted in the construction in 1960 of the Kuan Yin Temple that now stands on Vineyard Boulevard next to Foster Botanical Garden. Since then, she dedicated her life to teaching Buddhism as taught by the Kuan Yin Bodhisattva, promoting vegetarianism, meditation and the need to follow the right path to enlightenment. Walter D. "Dudley" Child Jr., a resort executive whose Inter-Island Resort Corp. fostered the growth of neighbor island tourism as Hawaii grew with statehood, died Sunday at his Waimea home on the Big Island. He was 73. Although Inter-Island was dissolved in the 1980s, its many hotels remain, such as the four "Surf" resorts on Kauai and Maui and in Kona and Hilo. "He was also a very gentle businessman," said marketing company owner Priscilla Texeira. "He championed giving local folks management positions." Describing herself as "a little girl who started out in the cane fields" on Kauai, Texeira said that Child allowed her to rise to the position

of sales director for the company. Others used management skills learned with Inter-Island to become government leaders, she said. Besides growing his company, Child recognized the need for public facilities to grow, said former Inter-island executive Bill Mielke. Child ensured that Mielke had time in the 1960s to work on the creation of the airport at Keahole, North Kona, and development of Queen Kaahumanu Highway, now the gateway to most West Hawaii resorts. Child's father, Walter Sr., had entered the hotel business by buying the Blaisdell Hotel in downtown Honolulu in the 1930s. Child attended Cornell University in New York in the 1950s but returned to run the company after his father had a stroke, said Rep. Bob Herkes, a former company executive. In 1960 the company opened the Kona Surf, so opulent that it was the first neighbor island hotel to have an elevator, Herkes said. It was so large for its day, 104 rooms, that Child worried about whether the DC-3 interisland airplanes could carry enough guests. While Child developed the five-star Surf resorts, he also pioneered the budget-priced Interisland Inns, said Richard Kelley, whose Outrigger resorts focused on Waikiki while Child concentrated on the neighbor islands. Child enjoyed a range of activities outside of business. He was a pole-vaulter at Punahou, said Star-Bulletin columnist Ben Wood, who attended Lincoln (Elementary) School with him. Herkes remembers hunting and fishing with Child, who also liked to ride a motorcycle, sail with his family and pilot his own plane. "He was a great family man," Kelley said. Herbert Young Cho Choy - Federal appellate Judge Herbert Choy, the first Asian federal judge in the United States, worked his way from humble beginnings to the top of his field. The son of poor immigrant plantation workers, Choy was the only Asian in his class at Harvard Law School when there were no affirmative-action programs and few scholarships. If there was anything the self-effacing man was proud of, his Harvard education was it, Choy told the Star-Bulletin during an interview last year. Choy, 88, the first Korean-American lawyer in the country, died in his sleep last night March 11, 2004 at the Queen's Medical Center. Judge Richard Clifton, who succeeded Choy on the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in 2000, said that although the semiretired judge was a role model and a "historic figure," he never held himself up as an example to follow. Choy was "personally humble and reticent" about his accomplishments, Clifton said. Choy once said about his career, "You always have the feeling that you are a role model, but it didn't make any difference in the way I performed my role." To his "federal family" of more than 70 law clerks, "he had an enormous effect on all of us," according to Clifton, former clerk. Last year, the clerks commissioned a portrait, by renowned artist Anne Mackintosh, that hangs in the headquarters of the 9th U.S Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco. Choy was born in Makaweli, Kauai. "I came from a small town in a small state" and had to work to support himself through school, he once told the Star-Bulletin. His family believed in education as the steppingstone to realizing the American Dream, he added. Following law school, Choy served in the Hawaii Territorial Guard for two years, then with the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps during World War II from 1942 to 1946. He practiced law privately in Honolulu until his appointment to the Circuit Court in 1971. Choy said the amount of work in the 9th was enormous. He said he felt he accomplished more as a federal appellate judge than in any other position. He was given "senior status" in 1984, continuing to work from home part time. Clifton said the most meaningful lesson he learned from Choy was "a fundamental respect for each person's (plaintiff's) day in court, because that's his day of being heard, of being considered." Choy "took every case very seriously," Clifton said. "He read every brief and considered every argument. Given the volume of (a federal judge's) caseload, there is an enormous temptation to see some cases as more important that others, but he saw it as the day in court for that person. ... He worked very, very hard, and I try to do the same." He added: "He was quite a person. ... He had a unique ability to engender that respect in everyone he met, and they liked him, too." Choy is survived by his wife of 59 years, Helen Shular. Funeral arrangements are pending. [SB 12/03/2004]

Walter Christie stuck with his passions. Write-ups on the latest planes, the latest movies and the latest in Honolulu nightlife litter the former editor's 30-year career at the Star-Bulletin. And his portfolio -- which includes several pieces in the show business publication Variety -- is sprinkled with far-off datelines, from Mexico City to Oslo. "He was a real firecracker," said Christie's great-nephew, Jeff Mareck. "He liked what he did ... (and so) made it a profession." Christie, who enjoyed traveling, good entertainment and "getting the dirt on everybody," died yesterday March 24, 2004 in Honolulu, Mareck said. The Honolulu resident was 89. "He knew the islands," said Charles Frankel, a former editor at the Star-Bulletin who worked with Christie for more than a decade. "He knew people." Christie

was born in California. He attended the University of California at Berkeley, where his father was a well-known track coach, as the Great Depression was in full swing. He graduated with a degree in journalism and went to work for the Hanford Daily Sentinel, where he stayed until taking a position in 1942 as a Star-Bulletin telegraph editor. From the late '40s to the early '70s, Christie's byline appeared on dozens of Star-Bulletin editorials and entertainment features. He was aboard United Airlines' inaugural flight from Honolulu to San Francisco in 1947, and wrote in his subsequent story that the "sky monarch exhibited all the aspects of a flying country club." In the 1950s, Christie started a column called "The Moviegoer," and became a critic of Hollywood's latest productions as he was also diving into the local entertainment scene. His stories, on everything from theater and culture to modern air travel, took him to Asia and Europe. He also wrote features for Variety and several national travel magazines that centered on his hobbies, including weight lifting and swimming. Christie's physique was featured in a 1950 issue of Muscle magazine, published in Belgium. By the 1970s, Christie had moved to the newspaper's copy desk. He retired from the Star-Bulletin in 1974, the same year he was diagnosed with a fast-spreading skin cancer that would require several reconstructive face surgeries. Christie kept positive, but the combination of a misshapen profile and the loss of his longtime companion drove him to drink, said caretaker and friend John Peinert. Finally, at 84, Christie overcame his decades-old alcohol addiction. He celebrated his fifth year of sobriety last October. "It was such an inspiration," Peinert said. "He was just a great example of a human being." Christie is also survived by cousin Faith Mareck-Kuhn of Honolulu. A private ceremony for Christie will be held next month at Kaimana Beach. Augie Colon, percussionist and the voice behind the exotic, jungle sounds of Martin Denny's 1956 hit song, "Quiet Village," died Friday, June 4, 2004 in Honolulu. He was 76. "This marks the passing of a giant, as far as I'm concerned," Denny said last night of the talented, charismatic man who walked into his life nearly 50 years ago. Phyllis Uilani Kaahanui, Colon's wife of 30 years, said Colon died at The Queen's Medical Center of complications from diabetes. "He did it his way," she said. He was joking with the nurses until the end, she said. His family was gathering at the hospital to be with him, but his son, August B. Lopaka Colon, had a performance that night with Cecilio and Kapono. Lopaka, also a percussionist, wanted to cancel. His father said no, he wanted him to attend the concert. "That was his last wish for Lopaka," Kaahanui said. "Lopaka did what he was supposed to do. When their father asked them to do something, my kids did it to the hilt." Colon took his last breath shortly before Lopaka returned to the hospital. Another son, Kaika Colon, an Army sergeant, is on his way back from Afghanistan, she said. At first, the jazz band used Colon only when they did Latin tunes. The jungle noises and bird calls, Denny said, were inspired by a group of frogs that hung out by a pool at the Shell and seemed to enjoy joining in with the music. The band started trying out various nature calls one night as a gag, Denny said. Colon, a boar hunter, knew all the bird calls, Denny said. He could purse his lips together and make a sound like a buzzing fly. The exotic sounds added a new element to the music, and when Denny got a gold record for "Quiet Village," which incorporated them, Colon was part of the talent behind it. Stephen Cooney - Professional surfer Stephen Cooney was known in surfing magazines for his amazing aerial maneuvers. His friends knew him also as a person with a "big heart" and a good disposition. Cooney, 30, died after the pickup he was driving went out of control, struck an embankment and rolled over along Kaupakalua Road at about 1:24 a.m. yesterday Nov. 4, 2004. Cooney, who was not wearing a seat belt, was partially thrown from the vehicle and pinned under it. Police are investigating whether speed, alcohol or drugs may have contributed to the crash. Professional surfer Tom Dosland, who grew up as a teenager surfing at Hookipa, said Cooney was a good role model for younger surfers, including himself. "He's one of my really good friends," said Dosland, the 2004 winner in the Hansen's Energy Pro at Banzai Pipeline on Oahu's North Shore. "I used to look up to him a lot. He's always positive." Friends recalled Cooney won a number of professional surfing competitions, including the Quiksilver Air Show in Costa Rica in 2000. On Maui, with cars and trucks parked two deep in some places along the driveway at Hookipa Beach Park, more than 100 friends gathered in the afternoon to mourn Cooney's death and console each other. Jan Roberson, the head of the Maui Chapter of the Surfrider Foundation, said Cooney was an "all-around good guy" who worked as a volunteer with the group and helped in beach cleanups and native planting projects. Kekoa Amadeo, a friend, said Cooney would bring T-shirts and sunglasses from sponsors to the beach and hand them out to surfers for free. "He had the biggest heart," Amadeo said. Chris Simpson said the surfers at Hookipa respected Cooney's talent and ability to ride all kinds of waves, including 15- to 20-foot waves at Jaws. But Simpson said Cooney wasn't the type to muscle his way into waves. "He'd just go with the rhythm of the ocean," Simpson said. Randolph A. Crossley, the long-time Honolulu Republican and self-made millionaire who tried three times to become Hawai'i's governor, died Monday Feb 23, 2004 at a retirement home in Monterey, Calif. He was 99. Crossley was born in Cupertino, Calif., in July 1904. He and his wife, Florence, moved to Hawai'i in 1929 and founded the first of many businesses, Crossley Advertising. From 1930 to 1934, he was head of the Hawaiian Tuna Packers, but went broke during the Depression. He then switched to farming on Kaua'i, where he helped pineapple processors and headed the Hawaiian Fruit Packers cannery firm. Other business ventures included Crossley Construction, Aloha Stamp Co., Crossley Flowers and Pacific Savings and Loan. Crossley was said to be a conservative Republican who believed in traditional values such as hard work, ambition and respect for one's elders. Even though he often told people to "call me Randy," his approach was usually business-like. Crossley's first chance to become governor came in 1953, when recently elected President Eisenhower nominated him to lead the Territory of Hawai'i. But political infighting in the Senate forced his nomination to be withdrawn. Crossley ran again in 1966 and came within 3,500 votes of defeating the Democratic team of John

A. Burns and Thomas P. Gill. He did, however, win on O'ahu. In May 1974, Crossley stepped forward when the Republican Party had no other candidates for governor. Crossley was 70 at the time, an age some considered a liability. He ran with Ben F. Dillingham, but lost to George Ariyoshi. Former U.S. Rep. Pat Saiki, a longtime Republican, said Crossley ran campaigns that made the Democrats pay attention. She said he left politics "very disappointed." "To Randy Crossley, anything was do-able," Saiki said. "He was confident of himself. He knew what he was doing. And he was not exactly what you would call the warm-and-fuzzy type. He was precise and logical." Crossley held other elected offices and political posts through the years. He represented Kaua'i in the Hawaiian House of Representatives from 1943 to 1945. He led the Republican Party and served as a state senator from 1959 to 1964. He also was a delegate to the first state Constitutional Convention in 1950. Crossley retired to Pebble Beach, Calif., in 1977 after the bankruptcy of The Hawaii Corp., a business he led. Crossley's only child, Meredith Young of Aloha, Oregon, said her father never lost his love for Hawai'i even though he was retired and living on the Mainland. He would often lecture to community groups about Hawaiian history, she said. "When he died, he was writing about the Hawai'i monarchs," she said. "He loved the Hawaiian people, and he loved Hawaii." She said her father's interest in the governorship stemmed from the failed Eisenhower appointment. But her mother didn't approve. "He ran for governor a couple of times and came close, but my mother's heart was never in that, so he finally let it go," Young said. "She supported him, but she was never a political wife like you see now." Crossley's mind remained sharp almost until the end, Young said. "He was very alert and remembered many details," she said. "He once said, 'I'm already 100 because I was nine months in my mother's womb.' " In addition to his daughter, Crossley is survived by two granddaughters and four great-granddaughters.
