**Mort Feldman**, founder and chairman of apparel manufacturer Tori Richard Ltd., was considered by contemporaries as one of the most talented print designers that Hawaii has ever had in the apparel industry. The company, started in 1956 by Feldman and his future wife Janice Moody, was named for her daughter Victoria and his son Richard and specialized in sophisticated women's resort wear. It branched out into men's wear and grew to become one of Hawaii's best-known sportswear labels. Feldman died Monday Nov. 8, 2004 in Honolulu at age 83. "Mort Feldman was a genius with an incredible eye for style and panache," said friend and business colleague Jim Romig, chairman of the board of Hilo Hattie Inc. "Nobody

came close to him, and the success of Tori Richard is evidence of his unique talent." Josh Feldman, the president and chief executive of Tori Richard, described his father as a prolific artist, entrepreneur and boss. "He viewed every day as an opportunity to teach by example," Josh said. "That we have many employees that have been with the company for over 30 and even 40 years is testament to the kind of person he was and the way he conducted business. He laid the groundwork for current success and longevity in our nearly 50 years of business. We will all miss him greatly." The company, based in Hawaii with offices throughout the country, employs 130 people. Tori Richard will celebrate the grand opening of its flagship store at Ala Moana Center on Sunday night. Former Congressman and broadcast executive Cec Heftel, who was elected to the state Board of Education earlier this month, said Feldman was a great supporter of Hawaii. "He gave me many good insights into how I could build some struggling radio and television stations into viable businesses," Heftel said. "Whatever he undertook, he did so to a great degree of success." Feldman developed a number of real estate projects in urban Honolulu and Waikiki, including one of Hawaii's first condominium complexes, Marina Towers; the renovation and restoration of the old Primo Brewery on Cooke Street, which served as Tori Richard offices for a time; and other early Kakaako redevelopment projects through Cooke Street Land Co., which he founded with Bob Cosco. "The renovation of the old brewery building was a remarkable achievement," said friend Joe Nicolai, president of JN Automotive. "It was an old concrete, totally 'out-of-code' structure that most developers would have torn down. But Mort respected its history and architectural integrity and went the extra mile to restore it and turn it into a useful structure." Feldman also was noted for his generosity. An avid collector of Asian and oceanic art, he donated pieces of his collection to the Honolulu Academy of Arts over the years. He also was charitable in other ways. A year ago, Feldman saw a news report about vandalized shuttle buses used by a local charity to service seniors. The organization did not have the resources to repair the vehicles. Feldman contacted the reporter, tracked down the agency and asked that the repair bills be sent to him, which they were. "He was generous and caring to a fault, but he never liked recognition or publicity about the many ways he helped people," Nicolai said. "He did it very much behind the scenes and under the radar. "That's the kind of guy he was. If you were in the Army and you had to have a buddy watch over you in the foxhole, that buddy would be Mort Feldman," Nicolai said. Feldman, who was born in Boston and came to Hawaii in 1953, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II. Feldman is survived by partner and companion

Darnette Narvaez; children Lisa, Jerrold, Richard and Joshua Feldman; hanai daughter Tori Wickland; and grandchildren Jake, Maya, Noah, Tyler, Morgan and Caroline. **Richard I. Fiske**, a World War II veteran who survived the attack on Pearl Harbor and the battle of Iwo Jima, died Friday April 2, 2004 in his home. He was 82 years old. Fiske's son, Richard E. Fiske, said yesterday his father was ill for a few weeks and died quickly and peacefully at his Mo'ili'ili home. The elder Fiske, born in Boston, was the son of a career military man and had begun his military career as a Marine. He was 19 years old in 1941 and a bugler serving his first assignment after boot camp and field music school aboard the USS West Virginia in Pearl Harbor. He was on the quarterdeck the morning of Dec. 7, the day nine Japanese torpedoes and two aerial bombs crashed into the battleship. At his battle station, Fiske saw his captain killed. When the order came to abandon ship, he swam to Ford Island. The West Virginia sank in 12 minutes. Fiske was later promoted to Field Music Sergeant and was transferred to the 5th Marine Division. His

bugle was taken away and he was made an assistant platoon leader. He was with the 5th Marine Division in February 1945 in the battle for Iwo Jima, an 8-square-mile Pacific island. The fighting went on for 36 days and exacted a huge human toll: 6,800 Americans dead and more than 19,000 wounded. Of 20,000 Japanese defenders, only 1,083 survived. Fiske once described Iwo Jima as "36 straight days of Pearl Harbor." After the war, Fiske enlisted in the newly established U.S. Air Force in 1948 after completing aircraft and engine school and also receiving his private pilot's certificate. He also served during the Korean and Vietnam wars as a crew chief on KC-97 and KC-135 aircraft. Sgt. Fiske retired from the Air Force in 1973 as a master sergeant. Fiske had been a volunteer at the Arizona Memorial since 1982. In January, he was among 10 volunteers honored by U.S. Interior Secretary Gale Norton and Hawai'i Gov. Linda Lingle for contributing more than 3,000 hours of his time to the memorial. Before his death, Fiske made peace with the enemy of his youth, becoming friends with Zenji Abe, a Japanese dive-bomber pilot who had participated in the second wave of attacks on Pearl Harbor and the bombing of the West Virginia. Abe, too, had made a career of the military, retiring as an admiral. In 1991, on Abe's third trip to Pearl Harbor and the Arizona, he gave Fiske \$300 and asked him to lay two roses at the memorial each month, one for him and one for Fiske. He also asked Fiske to play taps. Fiske promised to continue the tribute for as long as he lived. He kept his word, his son said. In addition to his son, Fiske is survived by his wife of 58 years, Carmen Fiske; his daughters, Peggy Bundek and Ginny Kawamura; and a granddaughter and a grandson. Funeral services are pending. **Col. Andrew Fitzurka**, USAF (Ret.) October 26, 1918 - November 11, 2004 Col. Andrew Fitzurka, SAAF/USAF/USMLM, patriotically passed away on Veteran's Day, November 11th, 2004, at the age of 86 in Kaneohe, Oahu. Born in Linhart, PA, on October 26, 1918, to parents Andrew and Anna Fitzurka, "Andy" attended both English and Russian based schools becoming fluent in both languages. Andy was an accomplished right tackle football player, and an award-winning swimmer. He caddied in the summers for a local Pittsburgh golf course. He graduated with honors from Taylor

Alderdice High School in 1937. After high school, he worked at United States Steel Corporation Homestead Works as a pulpit operator processing armour plate. He was hand selected by a US Steel foreman because of his robust and strong nature - despite strong competition from a line of men all eagerly wanting jobs following the depression. At this time, he started his studies in Architecture at Carnegie Technical University. Later in the 1950s, he continued his studies at The University of Maryland where he majored in Military Science and minored in Soviet Studies. In March 1942, Andy joined the Army Air Force as an Aviation Cadet and in March 1943 was commissioned 2nd Lieutenant Air Officer - Navigator. During WWII, he served in the Pacific Theatre as a 1st Lieutenant in the 7th Air Force - based out of Hamilton AFB, San Francisco. As Master Navigator, Andy flew over 400 combat hours aboard B-25s, B-24s, LB-30s and C-87s. He lost many friends during the war and in particular during the battle for Tarawa. He often wondered why his life was spared and so many good men died. But he NEVER forgot these men. He fought on for them and his country throughout his distinguished military career. In the latter part of his life, reflecting upon memories of a time he never forgot, he was often heard saying: "I was there at Tarawa, I was there! And it was hell." He NEVER wanted these men to be forgotten by our generation. And as long as he was alive, they would remain alive in the stories he would tell of their bravery. Andy was at Iwo Jima the day the Marines graced the Islands with the American Flag. He flew in just before the final historical photograph of the Marines was taken. He loved recounting the story about how proud he felt when the Marine's marked the hilltop with the American Flag. And he was there!! He earned the Bronze Three Leaf Oak Cluster for flying over enemy held positions in the Pacific Theatre. Major General Clay, USAF, state in an official proclamation: "Your [Andy's] combat record during WWII is particularly significant and is indicative of the honorable and devoted service you have rendered." In 1946, 1st Lieutenant Fitzurka, was posted to Germany as a Foreign Liaison Officer with the 7827 Military Intelligence Company. Andy maintained liaison activities with the Soviets on the demarcation line between the East and West Zone of Germany, coordinating security matters. Andy, now known as "The Bear," transferred to the 14th Troop Carrier Squadron, Frankfurt, Germany, when the USAAF converted to the USAF. Beginning in May 1948, he flew one of the first C-47s into Berlin with OPERATIONS VITTLES - bringing food and provisions into Berlin, five days after the Soviets cut off all shipments to the besieged city. Andy was awarded the Air Force Expeditionary Medal for his numerous flights into Berlin. On one trip, he even brought in bananas - a special request made by some German

children that he fulfilled. Later in 1948, The Bear was the first USAF officer assigned to the (USMLM) United States Military Liaison Mission to the Commander in Chief Group Soviet Forces Germany, in Potsdam, Germany. As a Foreign Liaison Officer, he conducted field activities with the British and the French, and helped recover downed C-47/C-54's that were participating in The Berlin Airlift. He is regarded by his fellow "Missionaries" as the man who helped design a new "tour" car specially equipped to handle off road driving at high speeds. He single handedly was able to organize the vehicle's shipment from the US to Berlin via a C-47, surprising even the Chief of the USMLM with his ingenuity. Andy responded to a SAC emergency requisition of all navigators in Europe, and in 1949 was assigned to the 43rd Bombardment Wing (SAC) in Tuscon, Arizona. Aboard B-29s and B-50s, he acted as an Evasion/Escape Officer and Assistant Intelligence Officer. In 1952, Captain Fitzurka was assigned to the newly formed KC-97 refueling unit at March, AFB, California. As a member of the 22nd Bombardment Wing, he supported SAC bombardment (B-47) aircraft all over the world through aerial refueling missions. He was the lead navigator in the tanker formation near Midway Island - which resulted in the first B-47 non-stop flight from California to Japan. During the late 1950s, The Bear, now an Evasion/Escape Officer and Observer with the 47th Bombardment Wing (USAFE) organized and monitored field activities with the British RAF, in Norfolk, English. He also flew aboard the Soviet Aeroflot TU-104 flights from London to New York City as a Technical Advisor. After being based out of Langley AFB, Virginia as a Squadron Navigator of the KB-50 refueling unit, Major Fitzurka returned as an Operations/Intelligence Officer to the USMLM in Potsdam, Germany, for a three-year tour. The Bear acted as an Official Observer - the eyes and ears of the US government - on Soviet military activities in East Germany, in accordance with Yalta. During this time frame, the Berlin Wall was constructed and divided Berlin into East and West Zones. Based out of the East Zone, at the Potsdam Mission House, Major Fitzurka conducted Soviet liaison duties for the USMLM Chief and the Air Team. He designed and monitored several joint allied projects and liaison meetings with the British and French. He participated in field activities with the French and the British, with for-you-eyes only status. Both the USAF and US Army officially cited him for outstanding performance. In 1966, Col. Fitzurka retired after 23 years of distinguished service to his country. His official duties carried him to numerous countries including: The Pacific Islands, East and West Germany, Denmark, France, English, Italy, Greece, Morocco, Libya, Iceland, Greenland and Canada. And he received numerous military

decorations and honors. When he retired, Major Gen. Clay wrote: "The command and high level assignments you have occupied within the United States Air Force in Europe and Tactical Air Command clearly reflect the confidence the service has had in your ability, loyalty and devotion to duty and country. The fine job you have done in many highly difficult and sensitive positions shows this confidence has been misplaced." His military career propelled him forward to continue in Intelligence work with McDonnell Douglas (now Boeing) as an Intelligence Engineer in St. Louis. His expertise in Soviet military technologies and language helped McDonnell Douglas during the final stages of the Cold War defense strategies. When a Soviet envoy of diplomats and technical experts came to the US in 1973 for a "friendly" tour, the Bear was called into act as an interpreter and to be the eyes and ears for the US government. In 1985, Col. Fitzurka retired from McDonnell Douglas and entered retirement with a heavy sigh of contentment. On May 13, 1999, The Mayor of Berlin, Germany, honored nearly a thousand "Vittles Veterans," during the 50th Anniversary of the Lifting of the Berlin Blockade in Munich, Germany. Col. Fitzurka, the oldest living pilot from the Berlin Airlift, was given a special commendation watch for his service. He was also the oldest living USMLM "Missionary" member, which is commemorated on their website. Col. Fitz was also a member of The Association of Former Intelligence Officers and supported the AFIO Scholarship Program that enables future generations of "Old Spooks" to pursue careers in intelligence: [www.afio.org](http://www.afio.org). The Bear resided in St. Louis, Missouri until 2002, when he moved to Makani Kai Marina, Kaneohe, Hawaii and lived with his daughter, Anne-Marie. In May, 2004 he moved into Pohai Nani Senior Residence - which he said: "Felt like heaven." And now he really knows what Heaven feels like. Good job, Papa Bear - you made it!! His eccentric and charismatic charm brought to light many new friendships while he lived in Hawaii. He touched many people's lives. He was renowned for his generosity, handing out cookies, coffee, Blue Angel hats and T-shirts to friends and strangers. And he never let a kind gesture go without being rewarded. He lived a very spiritual life as a devout Catholic, and his faith was the center of this life, his personal integrity, strength and compassion. The Col. lived a good life, one that even Ernest Hemingway would approve. During the last years, as throughout most of his life, he was a man content with his life, and at peace with himself and those around him. His warm smile and bright blue eyes will never fade from our hearts or our memories. God bless you, Dad. May you have everlasting Peace. Col. Fitzurka is survived by four of his five children: Robert Andrew, Sweden; Andrea Elizabeth, England; John Lawrence, Austria, and Anne-

Marie, Kaneohe, Oahu. He is also survived by Angelika Fitzurka (wife of John Fitzurka), and his nephews and niece, George, Richie and Marleen Fitzurka, Pittsburgh, PA. In 1994, his beloved wife, Lorraine (Lori) Fitzurka passed away after 51 years of marriage. His youngest son, William Stephen, passed away last year. **Hiram Leong Fong** - At 97, former U.S. Sen. Hiram Leong Fong, with the aid of a walker, still went to work in the Bishop Street offices of Finance Factors every day. Even this summer, after he had been hospitalized in intensive care at St. Francis Medical Center, Fong still kept a hand in business affairs, participating in board meetings by telephone from his hospital bed. Saturday, doctors sent the senator home to Alewa Heights Drive to be with his family. At 1 a.m. yesterday Wednesday, Aug 18, 2004, Fong died with his daughter, Merie-Ellen Gushi, at his side and his wife, Ellyn, nearby, according to family and friends. Yesterday, as state flags flew at half staff in his honor, longtime friends and political associates fondly remembered the first U.S. senator of Asian ancestry as a tough fighter who worked his way from the streets of Kalihi to graduate from Harvard Law School, serve as a Republican in the Senate for 18 years and build a financial empire that made and lost him millions over the years. U.S. Congressman Neil Abercrombie and others likened the arc of Fong's life to the transformation of Hawaii to a modern state and society. In a written statement, Abercrombie said: "Born of immigrant parents into modest circumstances, Sen. Fong worked hard and achieved great success in the fields of business and politics." Ronald T.Y. Moon, chief justice of the Supreme Court of Hawaii, said, "The man's life is legendary. No other Asian American has done so much for his country and state in developing positive relations between Asia and the United States. His life's story is a model for all young minorities who strive for the American dream." Gov. Linda Lingle, who made Fong an honorary chairman of her 1998 gubernatorial campaign, said yesterday that he was successful "because he had been able

to talk to average people, he was able to talk to people of high social position and everyone in between and treat them all the same way. "He stood up on this little rise of land to address the crowd, and it was the most inspiring, motivational speech that I have ever heard a politician make and you could feel the crowd responding to him." She said, "I think that was really the secret to his success: He never forgot his own beginnings." Fong was born on Oct. 15, 1906, the seventh of 11 children of immigrants from Kwangtang province in China. Fong's father had emigrated to Hawaii at the age of 15 to work in the sugar cane fields, and his mother was a maidservant. His parents named him Yau Leong Fong, but he later changed his name to Hiram. As a child growing up in Kalihi, Fong shined shoes and sold newspapers on the street. He also caught and sold fish, delivered poi and charged 25 cents to caddy a nine-hole round of golf. Fong graduated from McKinley High School and worked his way through the University of Hawaii at Manoa in jobs ranging from bill collecting to guiding tourists. He graduated from Harvard Law in 1935. For the next three years, Fong was a deputy attorney for the city and county of Honolulu. In 1938 he set out on a 14-year career in the legislature of the Territory of Hawaii. He served four years as vice speaker (1944-1948) and six years as speaker (1948 to 1954). During World War II, Fong joined the U.S. Army Air Corps and rose from first lieutenant to judge advocate of the 7th Fighter Command of the 7th Air Force. After the war, Fong helped found the law firm of Fong, Miho, Choy & Robinson. In 1946, Fong pooled money with the Chang and Chun families to buy a potato field in Kapahulu they transformed into the Market City Shopping Center. The shopping center, which was anchored by the first Foodland, became a profitable business and the financial foundation for other enterprises. In 1952, Finance Factors Ltd. and the Finance Factor family of businesses was founded with five other partners. Finance Factors Chairman Daniel Lau, one of the original founders, said yesterday, "I am saddened by the loss of such a great man and close friend." On July 28, 1959, Fong, who referred to himself as "the titular head of the Republican Party" in Hawaii, was elected to the U.S. Senate. Fong often told friends that he was proud of his part in supporting civil rights legislation during the 1960s and his support of the Immigration Reform Act of 1965, which attempted to eliminate racial discrimination in U.S. immigration law. U.S. Sen. Daniel Akaka praised Fong yesterday for being "a compassionate advocate for civil rights and workers' rights." Akaka said Fong "personified the spirit of bipartisan cooperation as he worked with Republican and Democratic colleagues and administrations to enact landmark civil rights legislation." Fong was re-elected in 1964 with 53 percent of the vote, despite

a Democratic presidential landslide in the state for Lyndon Johnson. By the 1970 campaign, Fong had lost votes because of his support for President Richard Nixon and the American role in the Vietnam War. He was narrowly re-elected that year, defeating political newcomer Cec Heftel. In 1977, Fong retired to focus on his business interests. U.S. District Judge Samuel King, who was appointed to the bench by Nixon at the urging of Fong, said yesterday: "We did a lot of politics together. One of his favorite questions was, 'Do you have the votes?'" King, who considered Fong a friend and owed his judgeship to him, said: "Hiram Fong was an absolutely honorable man. His word was as good as gold, and he never went back on it." For the last 10 years, Fong's finances and family have been torn apart by various disputes and court fights among family members and shareholder factions involving the founding families of Market City. In a fight for control of Market City, Fong's youngest son, Marvin, and his wife, Sandra, sued Fong and his wife. In March 2003, Hiram Fong and his wife filed for bankruptcy, citing more than \$10 million in debts to four local banks, business associates and family members. In a written statement issued at the time, Fong said he was filing bankruptcy because the actions of his son Marvin and Sandra had "left me with no other options." Fong's statement said: "After suing his mother and me, they have refused to settle the differences between us. It is most unfortunate when people 'bite the hand that feeds them,' especially when it is your own son and his wife." Family members say that Marvin had not spoken with his father for four years. But yesterday, Marvin issued a press release through a public relations firm saying that he met with his father Friday and that "my father and I made peace before his death." Fong's other children - Hiram Jr., Rodney and Merie-Ellen - could not be reached for comment. Late yesterday, there were no confirmed details about services, which are being handled by Nuuanu Memorial Park and Mortuary. [SB Aug 19, 2004]

**Harold Victor "Hal" Frazier**, a noted engineer whose dredging crews provided assistance in the aftermath of the attack on Pearl Harbor, died March 15. He was 91. Frazier, of Lihu'e, was working with a consortium of engineering and construction firms making improvements to the harbor when the Japanese attacked on Dec. 7, 1941. "He was not at the center of the attack — they were dredging in West Loch — but he didn't come home for 48 hours. The dredging crew worked around the clock trying to help people, trying to save people's lives and to collect bodies," said his wife, Frances Frazier, an author and translator of Hawaiian documents. Seldom was his work as exciting as it was that day, but the public-works projects on which he worked were important ones for the Islands. Frazier specialized as an engineer on dredging and tunnel projects. He drilled water tunnels around O'ahu for the Honolulu Board of Water Supply. He oversaw the construction of the Moloka'i water tunnel that pierces the island from Kaunakakai on the south shore to Waikolu on the north. After the 1946 tsunami, he oversaw the reconstruction of the Nawiliwili Bay breakwater, and he built the original small boat harbor at Port Allen. Frazier spent much of his career with Hawaiian Dredging, but in later years worked independently. He did river dredging work in what is now Bangladesh, and worked on harbor projects in Japan, Java and Taiwan. He was born in Honolulu, the son of a U.S. Army engineer. In addition to his wife, he is survived by his daughter, Stephanie Frazier; hanai daughter Kathy Valier; three grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren. No funeral is planned.
