Margery Hastert, a historian and volunteer who had been associated with The Queen's Medical Center for more than 50 years, died Aug. 28, 2004. She was 93. Hastert was born in New Jersey in 1911, and at a young age she boarded a steamer ship with a friend for a vacation to Hawai'i. The then-Margery Gubelman had planned a three-month visit with friends who had transferred to Schofield Barracks, but she fell in love with Hawai'i. While here, she enrolled in an occupational therapy course at The Queen's Hospital, which was founded in 1859. Hastert planned to remain in Hawai'i, but returned to New Jersey when her father became ill. In 1936, she was determined to make the Islands her home, and she accepted a job as an occupational therapist assistant with the hospital. A year later, she married Clark Hastert, an engineer with E.E. Black, and began to raise a family. As her three children grew older, Hastert went back to Queen's, this time as a volunteer in the hospital's admitting department. Tsutae "Ruthie" Hirai, who along with her sister helped revive and perpetuate Japanese culture through song and dance on the Big Island, died May 2, 2004. She was 85. Martha Poepoe Hohu - When Kaumakapili Church on North King Street went through a \$2.5 million restoration project last year, donors paid special tribute to the woman who directed the church's choir for more than 67 years and whose presence in the congregation spanned more than nine decades. As early as 1930, Martha Poepoe Hohu was leading a group in song during Kaumakapili's Sunday services. Today her name is emblazoned in a stained-glass window above the church's choir loft. "We decided to honor her," said longtime friend and church member Henry Maunakea. "What she was gifted with was her ability to compose Hawaiian hymns and to compose a range of Hawaiian hymns." Hohu, a conductor, composer, arranger, singer and organist who spearheaded the compilation of three Hawaiian hymnals and won numerous awards for her music, died Saturday at Kuakini Health System's Hale Pulama Mau. She was 97. Hohu's father, the Rev. Henry K. Poepoe, served as Kaumakapili's pastor from 1903 to 1950. When the current Kaumakapili Church in Kalihi was dedicated in 1911, Hohu was 4. "Mama grew up in the church," said Hohu's daughter, Leila Kiaha. "She was a true Christian, a true teacher, a musician. ... She lived a full life." Hohu, also known as "Auntie Martha," received a Na Hoku Hanohano Lifetime Achievement Award in 1993. Earlier, she was named a Kamehameha Schools Outstanding Alumna and was given a Hawaii Aloha Award from the Hawaiian Music Foundation. Hohu attended Kamehameha School for Girls, where she learned to play the organ. In 1932 she got her bachelor's degree in music from the University of Hawaii. By the time she was a teenager, Hohu was Kaumakapili's organist. At 23 she became the church's choir director. During her lifetime, Hohu served as a music teacher for Kamehameha Schools, a guide at the Bishop Museum and a docent at Washington Place. In 1967 she started directing the Hawaiian Electric Co. Employees Glee Club and also conducted the Honolulu Police Department's choral group. She was also a Hawaiian history, ukulele and Hawaiian language instructor. In 1969, when residents of Hana wanted to start a choir, Hohu became their music director. Twice monthly for 25 years, she flew to the island to bring them musical arrangements and lead them in song. And every week for years, Hohu would spend the day in Kalaupapa teaching songs to Hansen's disease sufferers, her daughter said. "As a result they were able to give concerts for their families," Kiaha said. "Mama would teach and then she would come home." Kahaunani Schoenstein, choir director at Kaumakapili Church, said her predecessor "set a lot of examples." "I could never fill her shoes," Schoenstein said. "It's just a matter of trying to continue what it is that she wanted to do as far as the church is concerned. ... One of her favorite hymns was 'I Am Happy in the Service of the King,' and

she was truly that. She was truly a servant, a servant of God." Hoku is survived by her daughter. Services are pending. [SB June 14, 2004]

Goro Hokama, who served for more than 40 years on the Maui County Council and as a defender of labor rights, died yesterday May 20, 2004 after a long bout with lung cancer. Hokama, 75, held his seat on the Council for 41 years, serving 16 of those years as Council chairman. Family members said Hokama died at 11 a.m. yesterday in his daughter's home in Wailuku. "He had a peaceful passing," said his son, Riki Hokama, who also now serves as a Maui County councilman. "Sen. (Daniel) Akaka called after midnight their time in D.C. to give his sympathies. ... We're very grateful of all the support for our family at this time." Hokama began his government service in the territorial days along with Akaka, U.S. Sen. Daniel Inouye and former Gov. George Ariyoshi. His long career on the County Council began in 1954, when the body was called the Board of Supervisors. "That's tragic, absolutely tragic," former Maui Mayor Elmer Cravalho said about Hokama's death. "I've known Mr. Hokama since the '40s ... almost 60 years. He was an outstanding public servant and, more importantly to me, a very dear personal friend." Hokama graduated from Lanai High School as the student body president, joined the Army in 1951, and then jumped into politics as soon as he got out in 1953. Hokama was also a Dole Pineapple employee for 45 years until his retirement in 1991. During that time he was a member of the International Longshore and Warehouse Union Local 142, where he wore many hats -- as a shop steward, negotiating committee member, and Maui Division representative. "I've known Goro for about 30 years, and he's always been a leader," said Willie Kennison, ILWU Maui Division director. "And because he came from the working class, because he struggled, he knew how important it was for people to have jobs. Thank God I was sitting down when I heard he died because I loved Goro." Hokama's role on Lanai and in Maui County was so well known that on April 12, 2001, the late U.S. Rep. Patsy Mink dedicated the Lanai City Post Office to be named after Hokama, as the Goro Hokama Post Office Building. While a great honor, Riki Hokama said his father's life was his own reward. "He was always grateful that the people of Maui County gave him 40 years of fulfilling his goals for a better Maui and better Lanai. ... He was always grateful for the people allowing him the chance to live his dreams." Hokama's friends described him as "quiet but determined," a man who did what he felt was right, though it might have not been popular at the time. "He was a fighter," said Kennison. "He would not back down. ... We used to argue but we never lost respect for one another because I knew what he wanted was the best for

the people." Cravalho remembered Hokama as "a good public servant, very forthright, unafraid, strong." "He will be missed," Cravalho said. Hokama is survived by his wife of 53 years, Kiwae Deguchi Hokama, his brothers Eisuke and Eiso, son Riki, daughter Joy Helle, and grandsons Jordan and Trent Helle. Funeral arrangements are pending. Alberta Pualani Hopkins spent her professional career fostering education in her native Hawaiian culture. In recent years, she nurtured that interest within the Episcopal Church. She taught at the University of Hawaii for more than 20 years and was the author of "Ka Lei Ha'aheo," the beginning level Hawaiian language textbook used at the university, community colleges and most high schools. Before retiring she served as acting dean of students. Hopkins, 65, of Kaaawa, died last Wednesday Sep. 15, 2004 in the Queen's Medical Center. "She was important in formation of the Hawaiian studies program," said Emily Hawkins, associate professor in the Hawaiian and Indo-Pacific Languages and Literature Program. She said Hopkins served on a task force that called for expanding Hawaiian studies into a graduate program and combining it with the languages program. "On the day she died, the UH Faculty Senate was told that we are moving toward a new school of Hawaiian knowledge" by UH Chancellor Peter Englert because of her contributions. "She was a person of spirit," said Hawkins. "She predates the 1970s renaissance" in Hawaiian studies, she said. Hopkins was co-author of an earlier Hawaiian language textbook, "E kama'ilio Hawaii Kakou." Hopkins received the UH Regents' Medal for Excellence in Teaching in 1989 and Ke Kukui Malama for Excellence in Hawaiian Education from the Office of Hawaiian Affairs in 1996. Last year, the Church Divinity School of the Pacific in Berkeley, Calif., named her a doctor of humane letters for

her involvement in Anglican Church efforts. "I would describe her as a scholarly activist," said the Rev. Charles G. Kamohoali'i Hopkins, retired vicar of St. John's by-the-Sea Church in Kahaluu. "She was a serving person, always looking to help others before herself. They were married for 23 years and were founding members of the Anglican Indigenous Network which "pulled together Maoris, American Indians, native Alaskans, Canadian natives and native Hawaiians ... to support one another in efforts in each of our provinces." She was a member of the national Episcopal Church Commission on Racial and Ethnic Ministry and was a frequent speaker at cross-cultural workshops here and on the mainland. She served as a professional consultant on the Hawaiian Bible Project and chaired the Native Hawaiian Ministries Board. "She translated our Eucharistic rites from English to Hawaiian," said her husband, adding that the text is used in Episcopal parishes and will be used in part at her funeral service. Tom Hugo Jr., a Kamehameha Schools graduate who went on to become a Canadian football all-star and longtime head of the Hawai'i Paroling Authority, died Nov. 15, 2004. He was 74. "Vince Lombardi had a motto that winning was No. 1, and that's the motto he lived by and told us to live by," said daughter Jan Hugo-Davis, one of Hugo's eight children. "He was strict but he was fair." Hugo was a sports celebrity in Hawai'i and in Canada, where he played seven seasons for the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League. In 1978 he was one of 25 people named as charter inductees to the Hawai'i Sports Hall of Fame. Twenty years before that, the Sportsmen's Association of Montreal named him Professional Athlete of 1958. Hugo-Davis said that in 2002 her father was honored before a game in Montreal. Thomas Kaluna Hugo Jr. was raised in Nu'uuanu and attended the Kamehameha Schools, graduating in 1949. He was a star football player at Denver University and went on to play for the Alouettes from 1953 through 1959, making the CFL all-star team six times as a 5-foot-10, 225-pound center and linebacker. He returned to Honolulu and found work as a marketing assistant for Hawaiian Telephone Co. In 1968 Gov. John Burns appointed him to the Civil Service Commission. In 1976 Hugo was appointed to the state Parole Board. A year later, when it was reconfigured as the Hawai'i Paroling Authority, Hugo became its chairman, a position upgraded to a full-time job. Hugo in 1978 testified at the Legislature against a bill for mandatory prison terms, saying the Paroling Authority needed to have discretion and flexibility. "No two crimes are exactly alike," he said. "No two people pose the same threat to society, neither do they require the same controls." Today, mandatory minimum terms are prescribed by state law for certain criminals, such as repeat offenders or those who use a gun to commit a crime. Hugo was also a strong proponent of work-furlough programs, and in 1983 implemented a

community service program in which inmates could work outside prison walls, doing such chores as trimming weeds along highways. Hugo retired from the Paroling Authority in 1985 but stayed in corrections, becoming director of the Hawai'i State Corrections Intake Service Center. He retired for good in 1997. Hugo also coached football at Kamehameha and for various Pop Warner teams. "He enjoyed coaching his sons and his grandsons. Whatever level, he was there," said Jan Hugo-Davis. She said her father also enjoyed golfing and "hanging around Kailua Beach with his dogs."
