Peer Abben, a prominent Honolulu architect for 35 years, died Aug. 5 in Mill Valley, Calif. at the age of 85. Originally from Copenhagen, Denmark, Abben lived an adventurous life, counting his ascent to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro in Kenya as one of the highlights, said his friend Art Freedman of Honolulu. Abben requested that his ashes be scattered in Denmark, on Mount Kilimanjaro and in the ocean off of Diamond Head, Freedman said. His daughter Lee Skutch of Mill Valley plans to carry out his wishes, Freedman said. Abben was a member of the American Institute of Architects, headed his own firm, Abben and Utzon Inc., and was an associate architect for Bank Building Corp. of America, according to past news reports. He was an award-winning architect in Denmark and East Africa, a 1965 article said. Abben moved to Hawaii and became an American citizen in 1963. He left Hawaii in 1998 to be with Skutch. According to Freedman, Abben designed numerous private residences, office buildings and condominiums on each of the major islands, among them the Kapaa Shore Resort on Kauai, the Kona Bali Kai condominium project on the Big Island and the Dowsett Terrace Apartments, a \$3.5 million luxury apartment complex at 217 Prospect St. He did extensive work for the U.S. military designing buildings at Pearl Harbor and Barbers Point, Freedman said. In a 1967 article he wrote for a Honolulu daily, Abben said the environment should be incorporated into the design of a building. When someone is in a building, a person should be aware of "what time it is, or where the sun is ... which way or how strongly ... the wind is blowing ... or if the leaves of the palm fronds are rustling now, or if the sky is cloudy or clear ... whether the stars are bright," he wrote. "Abben was a fascinating man with a tremendous number of interests, an adventurer who traveled around the world," Freedman said. "He went to every seminar they put on here" on a vast range of topics, he added. He was a member of the Honolulu Skal Club for those of Danish ancestry. Abben is also survived by another daughter, Yin Abben of Copenhagen. [SB 17//8/2001]

Noah Kaimana Shigechi Abrazado, who was diagnosed with a rare brain tumor when he was two months old, died Feb. 1, 2001 at his Mililani home. Noah turned 1 Sept. 24. JACQUES H ADLER - He spent his childhood days in an Antwerp, Belgium, house that literally shook with the grinding of 90 diamond cutting wheels. Six decades later, he joined a pantheon of Hawai'i pitchmen with his famous on-camera slogan: "If you are not buying your diamonds from the House of Adler, you ARE paying too much." Sir Jacques H. Adler, knighted by King Leopold II of Belgium for post-war relief efforts, holder of the Order of Couronne and diamond merchant par excellence, died Tuesday in Denver, where he had resided during the past two years. He was 85. Born to one of Belgium's premier diamond exporters, Adler worked hard in the family's diamond and film businesses there but had room for playboy pastimes until the outbreak of World War II strained the family fortunes and sent him fleeing with a borrowed passport on a cruise ship to the United States. The days of being driven by a chauffeur to champagne-laced family reunions on the Cote d'Azur and at Monte Carlo were gone, but Adler brought to his new world the genteel and luxurious style that became a business trademark. "He was charming, probably the most perfect gentleman you could meet," said long-time Honolulu friend Carole Brooks. "Even on his last trip to Hawai'i, last summer, he would wear an ascot around his neck and always a hanky in the breast pocket of his suit jacket when he went down to the Outrigger Club, totally dressed to the nines." Attorney Jeff Portnoy, who represented Adler when a deal to sell his stores here soured in the midst of the 1990s Hawai'i recession, said Adler, along with Lex Brodie, was one of the last unique "personality" businessmen in a retail world rapidly fading to one vanilla flavor. "If you mentioned diamonds, you thought of him; if you mentioned him, you thought of diamonds," Portnoy said. "He WAS his business." The Aga Khan, buying baubles for his lady friends, was a favored client, and George Raft, Peter Lawford, Tony Martin, Gary Cooper, Jack Benny and Clark Gable were among his customers and friends. Although known best in Hawai'i beginning in the 1970s for his retail operations and his famous slogan, Adler's greatest business triumphs were in the PXs of military bases across the western United States during World War II, and in Vietnam during the war there, as well as in Puerto Rico, the Philippines, Guam, Thailand, Hong Kong, Casablanca and in foreign company compounds in Saudi Arabia. Adler is survived by his wife, Suzanne; daughters Jacqueline Anthony and Maury Leacox of Colorado; stepchildren Mack and Janice and Jan Tatarsky of California; four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Solita Marquez Aguirre, who was Philippine Consul General to Hawai'i from 1992 to 1996, died Thursday Jul 19, 2001 in her hometown of Kawit, Cavite, Philippines, the consulate announced yesterday. Manila's representative in Hawai'i during the post-Marcos years will be honored at a memorial Mass here Saturday. The Philippine Consulate and the Filipino-American Community of Hawai'i will sponsor the Mass at 10 a.m. Saturday at Sts. Peter and Paul Church, 800 Kaheka St. Aguirre, 60, had achieved the rank of ambassador in the Philippine diplomatic corps in 1996, when she was named her country's ambassador to Hungary. She also maintained relations with Poland, Slovakia and the Czech Republic. In Hawai'i, Aguirre was remembered for sheltering newly arrived Filipino veterans who fought for the United States in World War II and were seeking American citizenship; for organizing aid to victims of Typhoon Angela in 1995, and for a brouhaha over the arrival of Marcos supporters in Hawai'i for a wake in memory of the former president. Aguirre denied she had

slighted Marcos' son, Ferdinand Jr., and other Philippine congressmen, and said she failed to meet them personally at the airport in 1993 because she was unaware of their arrival. Serving as her government's representative in Hawai'i was especially challenging, because of the travel and commercial needs of Filipinos, who make up nearly 20 percent of the state's population, and because of deep political divisions in Hawai'i's Filipino community. She flatly labeled Marcos a dictator, and said his regime of torture and terrorism contrasted sharply with the "authentic democratic government of the Philippines" under Corazon Aquino, who appointed her, and Fidel Ramos, whom she also served. Applauding a verdict awarding millions to victims of the Marcos regime, Aguirre noted testimony that Marcos claimed full responsibility for actions of his military, and said Ramos defended his own human rights record under Marcos by saying he made martial law under Marcos "more compassionate" by trying to check abuses. Before her assignment in Hawai'i, Aguirre worked in Manila as director general of the government's office of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations. A 1962 graduate of Far Eastern University, she also served the government at the United Nations in New York. While in Hawai'i, Aguirre oversaw restoration of the consulate and adding of the Filipina Rooms, a display of antiques, art objects and a book collection open to the public. Abraham Aiona, community leader, dead at 75. He was a World War II paratrooper, a policeman, a police chief, a county councilman and an OHA trustee. Abraham Aiona, whose record of service to his country and community spanned almost six decades, died in his sleep yesterday at his son's Waimanalo home. He was 75. Aiona, who called himself "one of the few three-fourths Hawaiians still around," succumbed to the kidney failure he had fought for years and which forced him to retire as Maui's man at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs in 1998. Born Aug. 29, 1925, he was one of eight children raised in a poor but strict Seventh-day Adventist home. Aiona and others in Kaimuki Boy Scout Troop 10 learned thrift, honesty and loyalty. After enlisting in the Army in 1944, Aiona jumped with the 82nd Airborne in World War II. He then returned to Honolulu and spent 22 years in the police department. In 1969 Honolulu Police Chief Dan Liu urged his young executive officer to apply as Maui police chief, and Aiona was chosen over 16 other candidates to take over a department racked by politics. Aiona raided a notorious Lahaina gambling den and cracked down on organized crime. He disciplined or dismissed officers for everything from slander to stealing. "He told me one time," oldest son Abe Jr. said yesterday, "you are going to make friends and you are going to make enemies. The enemies you don't have to worry about — just worry about your friends; you are not going to please everybody." But his friends were legion. "We couldn't go into a restaurant and eat as a family without him stopping to talk to 20 people," hanai daughter Ellen Caringer of Maui said. Aiona's budget run-ins with Maui Mayor Elmer Cravalho prompted him to run for Maui County Council. He won, and was re-elected four times. He ran for mayor and lost, then was edged in another council race by a newcomer named Linda Lingle. Elected to OHA in 1990, Aiona became Clayton Hee's righthand man and finance chief, helping parlay the trust's \$19 million bankroll into \$150 million with a state settlement and then nearly doubling it. He is survived by a sister, Helen Cockett of Honolulu; sons, Abraham Jr., Leonard and George of Maui and Jeffrey of San Diego; and hanai daughter, Ellen. He will be buried next to his wife at Hawai'i State

Mitsuko Akimoto dies at 104. Mitsuko Akimoto never allowed life to pass her by. Even when she reached 80, she kept herself busy by sewing, cooking and teaching classes to senior citizens. In her spare time she did volunteer work. In a 1976 Advertiser interview, Akimoto, then 80, said she felt sorry for old people who spent their time on mall benches. "I can't stand wasting precious time," she said. A former picture bride who went on to become an award-winning volunteer with the American Lung Association and American Red Cross, Akimoto died Feb. 2, 2001 in Honolulu. She was 104. "She always felt very strongly committed to volunteer work because it was some way she could return something," said her daughter, Fumi Schmidt. "She always felt that that was the way she wanted to go, because she felt she had had a pretty good life here and she had become her own person here and wanted to pay back." Akimoto was born in a small town just outside Hiroshima, Japan, in 1896. In 1913 she was sent to Hawai'i to marry plantation worker Eiji Akimoto. She worked as a maid while raising five children. Irmgard Farden Aluli, who wrote fondly and sang endearingly of the Hawai'i and family she loved, died yesterday Oct 4, 2001 at Kaiser Moanalua Medical Center. She was 89. Aluli was surrounded by family and friends who sang many of her favorite Hawaiian songs and celebrated her life. Hailama Farden, Aluli's grandnephew and fellow composer, said her passing was peaceful and inspiring. "We were all there singing for her and doing our family thing, and singing her songs," Farden said. "Then my Uncle Buddy — her baby brother — leaned over and said, 'Goodbye, Irmgard,' and not even five seconds later she just went." Composer of more than 300 tunes, Aluli was one of 13 children of Charles and Annie Farden. Music was a staple in the family's Lahaina home. Her signature tune, "Puamana," was the focal point of her vocal-instrumental livelihood. The tune spoke lovingly of the family home, Puamana, on the Valley Island, and a group of the same name was organized in the early 1980s by Aluli. Hailama Farden considered himself lucky to have learned the art of composing from such a great woman. "She had so much to share," he said. "We just lost our last great composer. I put her up there with Helen Desha Beamer and Johnny Almeida." For 14 years, Puamana was the draw at The Willows restaurant in Mo'ili'ili, then a popular dining spot. Aluli's rich alto voice often took a backseat to the harmonic blend of Puamana, but her seasoned guitar stylings and her presence were formidable. A longtime Kailua resident, Aluli and her late Maui-based sister, Emma Sharp, kept the entire clan of sisters, brothers, nephews, nieces, cousins, grandchildren and great-grandchildren enmeshed in song. She said she never intended to be a professional musician, because she was raised and she believed in the family notion of singing and sharing in the spirit of fun. Indeed, she was a late bloomer, launching her career after she was married. While living on the Mainland, she realized the value of her Island roots and her unending love for Island music. "She was such a beautiful lady," Farden said. "Aloha emanated from her." In 1998, Aluli was inducted into the Hawai'i Music Hall of Fame. Just two months ago, she was honored as a living treasure by the Prince Kuhio Hawaiian Civic Club. Also recognized by the civic club was educator Gladys Brandt. Last night, Brandt called her longtime friend "one of the great ladies of Hawai'i." "She was a wonderful example of a kupuna," Brandt said. "She raised and served her people, and she was loved by them. We will miss

Irmgard." Entertainer Mahi Beamer said he grew up with the Aluli family and the two families were very close. "A long time ago my dad and mother were very close to them and they used to be down at their house and they had a big piano there. Daddy would play, and we'd play and Irmgard would play. Donald Hibbard Angus, one of Hawai'i's most important collectors of Hawaiian and Pacific island art, died Jan. 28 at age 94. He was born in the Kewalo section of Kaka'ako in 1908 at the home of his grandmother. Angus' discoveries are in the Peabody Museum of Salem, Mass., the American Legation Museum in Tangiers, Morocco, the Byzantine Collections at Boston Public Library, the Honolulu Academy of Arts, the Bishop Museum and the Hamilton Library at the University of Hawai'i. "He was a discoverer committed to seeing that things went to institutions," said Lynn Davis, head of preservation at the Hamilton Library. "He carefully annotated things. It increases the historical value enormously. He was very professional." Angus began collecting in London in the 1930s, sleuthing for historical documents about the Pacific. Later he turned his attention to botanical prints. As late as 1995, he donated an assemblage of more than 1,360 botanical illustrations from the 16th through 19th centuries to the Bishop Museum. The oldest print dated to 1574. After attending Punahou School, Angus entered the University of California at Los Angeles in the 1920s. Later he traveled to London, where he stayed for 12 years and began his

serious collecting. He haunted bookstores that specialized in old works, as well as museums and government records offices, looking for rare documents relating to Hawai'i and the Pacific. His first major find was the 18th century journal kept by James Colnett, an early Pacific fur trader. Over the years, Angus supported himself by driving an ambulance during World War II and acting as a photographer's model. Every spare cent went to buy manuscripts and original art work. He lived mostly in Honolulu during the latter part of his life. Angus is survived by cousins June Walker of Los Angeles and Howard Lionel Grace of Fresno, Calif.; and close friends Frederick Johnston of Santa Barbara, Calif., and Jim and Doric Little of Pupukeya.
