Richard "Dickie" Carter, the Big Island police officer who was in charge of destroying millions of marijuana plants, and later helped prosecute a well-known crime figure, died Thursday Nov 8, 2001 at The Queen's Medical Center. Carter, who had retired in 1999 and underwent surgery for a brain tumor twice this year, was 58. Carter was in charge of the Big Island vice squad, which was involved in Operation Green Harvest, a marijuana-eradication campaign in the late 1970s. He was also involved in the prosecution of organized-crime leader Henry Huihui and was chosen statewide police officer of the year in 1984. He was "a man with a unique disposition and a very big heart," said Carter's brother, Maj. Morton Carter, also a police officer. Morton Carter said his older brother was devoted to fighting organized crime, coaching youth sports and helping his alma mater, St. Joseph High School. Richard Carter was an an all-star athlete into his 30s. He was a baseball catcher and held the island's prep shot put record for more than 30 years. He also was an all-league power forward in basketball. The 6-foot-2 Carter weighed between 240 and 270 pounds most of his life. Retired Circuit Judge Shunichi Kimura once described Carter as "a huge guy who can speak gruffly ... (but) can establish a rapport with the heavies." "He resolves cases because of his doggedness," Kimura said. "Emily Post he is not, but successful he is." Carter also gained a reputation for raising money for community groups and youngsters involved in sports. He also served quietly as the hanai dad for kids of some of the people he helped convict. Huihui also corresponded with Carter from prison. **William D. Castle**, a philanthropist and head of one of the oldest family foundations in the country, died Wednesday Jan 31, 2001 in Honolulu. He was 85. Castle was born in Honolulu and graduated from Punahou School. His great-grandfather, Samuel Northrup Castle, was a co-founder of Castle & Cooke. William's great-grandmother, Mary Tenney Castle, founded the Samuel N. & Mary Castle Foundation in 1894. The foundation was created to benefit early childhood education and care. The organization's earliest grants were to establish Hawai'i's preschool and kindergarten system in the late 19th century.

William Castle served as a trustee on the foundation for 42 years and president for 38 years. This year, the foundation is expected to donate \$2.5 million in grants to local agencies. Alfred Castle, William's son and executive director of the foundation, said his father was a gentle and giving man. "Mainly he was just a wonderful man who cared very much about this community and gave freely of his money and of his time to help the community build its civic infrastructure," Alfred Castle said. In addition to his work on the foundation, William Castle was on the board of many community organizations. He was a director at Chaminade University and was on the first board

of La Pietra-Hawai'i School for Girls. Alfred Castle said his father was most proud of his work with the American Red Cross. In the 1970s, Castle led the capital campaign to build the Red Cross' Diamond Head headquarters, which was named after William Castle's father, Alfred. After graduating from Punahou, Castle earned a degree at Harvard University. He joined the Navy and was a lieutenant commander stationed in Hawai'i when Pearl Harbor was attacked in 1941. When the war ended, Castle returned to Hawai'i and was an administrator with Alexander & Baldwin and Bishop Trust Co.

His civic contributions to Hawai'i were many, including his longtime leadership of the Hawaiian Humane Society (seven years) and the Hawaiian Kennel Club (34 years) where he often showed champion

purebred cocker spaniels. Educated at Huntington Park Union High School in California and holder of a bachelor's degree in architecture and structural engineering from Pacific Coast University, Champion came to Hawai'i in 1940 as an assistant construction superintendent on the Makalapa Housing project, then Pu'unene and Kahului air bases and the Naval Supply Center at Pearl Harbor. One of his first Hawai'i addresses was the bachelor cabins at the Pacific Club, one of the many organizations in which he later served as president. After three years with Raymond Concrete Pipe port projects in South America and the East Coast, Champion returned to Hawai'i in 1946 as general superintendent of Dillingham's Hawaiian Dredging and Construction Company. He married the former Gladys Ivy Lambert in 1947, and, following her death in 1977, was the husband of the former Glenna Moore Buscher from 1980 until her death in 1994. His early projects here included the Surfrider Hotel, Hawaiian Electric's Waiau and downtown power plants, Mayor Wright and Kalihi Housing, Johnston Island facilities, and the Standard Oil refinery. He was the Dillingham man in Australia and Asia for years, and rebuilt the water system in Saigon during the Vietnam War. Champion collapsed at his home at Arcadia Retirement Residence last week, and did not regain consciousness. Although confined to a wheelchair in recent years, "Champ was one of the most cheerful people I have ever seen," said fellow Honolulu Rotary Club member Ray Engle, who remembered Champion as "a real gentleman who contributed significant amounts to the various Rotary funds." He served as volunteer and often officer or director for Maunalani Hospital, St. Francis Hospital, Leahi Hospital, Boy Scouts, Salvation Army, National Crime Council, Friends of East-West Center, English Speaking Union, Navy League, Hawai'i Visitors Bureau, Arts Council, Friends of the Ballet, Advisory Board on Education, Pacific and Asian Affairs Council, and Tax Foundation of Hawai'i. His many memberships included Masons, Chamber of Commerce, Engineering Association, Public Relations Society, Wai'alae Country Club, Kane'ohe Yacht club, and the Polynesian Voyaging Society. Champion is survived by two sisters, Portia, of Oregon, and Vera, of California; and stepsons Harry of the Big Island and Ward of Honolulu.Funeral arrangements are pending. [Adv 24/7/2001]

Mrs. Chaplin will be buried in Charleston today, on the 64th anniversary of her marriage to the newspaperman who brought her to Hawai'i. Chaplin was editor of The Advertiser from 1959 to 1986, when he retired. The Chaplins lived in Hawai'i for nearly 40 years before they returned to Mrs. Chaplin's native Charleston in March 1998."She reflected everything that a great wife and companion should," Chaplin said yesterday. "I have been blessed." Chaplin recalled that his wife once asked him if she had married him or married a newspaper, and she was patient with his answer that she had probably married both. **Roy W. Cummings**, a journalist known as the "Father of the Hawai'i Newspaper Guild," died Saturday Nov 24, 2001. The Kailua resident was 88. Cummings was born in St. Louis, Mo., on Sept. 15, 1913. He graduated from the University of

Missouri in 1935 with a degree in journalism and moved to Hawai'i the following year to work for The Honolulu Advertiser. That job with the morning paper lasted just two years, however, when he was fired for his union organizing activity. Cummings did free-lance work until he was hired by the Honolulu Star-Bulletin in 1943. Cummings worked as a war correspondent in the Pacific during World War II. After the war he worked on the copy desk at the Star-Bulletin. In 1937, Cummings and a handful of newspaper employees formed the first Hawai'i Newspaper Guild, which represented workers at both daily newspapers. But with the dismissal of Cummings and other leaders, the guild lost its charter. But Cummings did not give up, and in 1949 he reorganized the guild as an independent union that included editorial staff at the Star-Bulletin. He later organized the editorial staff at The Advertiser. Cummings left the guild and Hawai'i in 1958. He was succeeded by Roy Kruse, who headed the guild for 27 years until his retirement five years ago. Kruse said Cummings was a tireless fighter for employee rights. "We didn't have any offices and you did all of the union work after hours," Kruse said from his home in Vancouver, Wash., "You give up your whole life for it and he did that. He was that kind of person, one of the finest persons I have ever met." Susan Cummings said her husband held union meetings and kept all records at his home. The couple met in Hawai'i, but were married in St. Louis in 1959. She said today's guild members owe a debt of gratitude to her husband. "He worked for 10 years without a vacation. They worked any hours anybody told them to for nothing, practically. So when the guild was formed, salaries went way up," she said. The Cummingses moved to New Mexico in 1958, but returned to Hawai'i from 1960 to 1962 when Roy Cummings worked for The Advertiser. In 1963, he went to work at the St. Louis Globe-Democrat, where he retired in 1983. Two years ago, the couple returned to Hawai'i and lived in Lanikai. In addition to his wife, Cummings is survived by his sons, Toby and Shawn; daughters, Melani Whitehead and Melissa Kornis; three grandchildren; brother, Rauj; and nephew, Mike Cummings. **Robert L. Cushing -** Through his writing and lectures, Robert L. Cushing helped make the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association Experiment Station world-class, said Dr. Robert Osgood, vice president of the station, now called the Hawaii Agriculture

Research Center. Cushing, former director of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association, died on Nov. 8, 2001 at his home in Gig Harbor, Wash. He was 87 years old. Cushing was born in Ord, Neb., on April 12, 1914. He obtained his bachelor's of science degree in agriculture in 1936 and later received a master's of science degree at the University of Minnesota. He started his career as an agricultural extension worker in Nebraska. Cushing arrived in Hawaii in 1947 and worked as an agronomist and agriculturist with the Hawaiian Pineapple Co. (now Dole Co.). Four years later, he served as assistant director of the Pineapple Research Institute and served as director from 1952 to 1963. In 1963, Cushing was appointed director of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association. "He had a very broad knowledge of agriculture," said Osgood who worked with Cushing. "Not only was he respected in Hawaii, he was respected around the world." In 1977, a building housing a new experiment station was built in Aiea and named in his honor. From 1968 to 1969, Cushing was chairman of the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii. He also served as executive vice president and president of the Pineapple Growers Association of Hawaii. Cushing was awarded an honorary doctor of science degree from the University of Hawaii for his work in Hawaii's agriculture. "His career spanned the dramatic post-war growth of pineapple and sugar production in Hawaii, as well as the decline of these agricultural industries," said Cushing's daughter Susan Chamberlin. "He was proud of the part he played in agricultural research but saddened to see empty fields near the end of his life." Cushing is survived by his sister, Marian Carlin of Corvallis, Ore.; three children, Susan C. Chamberlin of Richmond, Calif., John A. Cushing of Seoul and James R.
