Robert S. DeMello: Longtime Honolulu symphony percussionist, music educator and conductor Robert S. DeMello died March 2 from cancer. He was 66. DeMello's tenure with the symphony spanned 50 years -- half of the time the symphony has been in existence -- the longest in Honolulu Symphony history. Raised in downtown Honolulu, DeMello -- as a student at Central Intermediate School -- was encouraged by the wife of then-Honolulu Symphony Music Director George Barati to begin viola studies. Shortly thereafter, he began to play viola with the symphony at the age of 14. When Barati was preparing a performance of "Belshazzar's Feast," an anvil player was needed, and DeMello, who had no formal percussion training, was chosen to play it on an old brake drum. Gradually he began to learn to play the different percussion instruments and never left "the back of the orchestra." As the symphony's schedule became more time-consuming during Barati's tenure, DeMello decided to devote full time to the orchestra. In his half-century with the orchestra, he held the posts of principal and associate principal percussionist, head and assistant librarian, and personnel manager. DeMello began his conducting career while still a student at McKinley High School. Then-band director Emma Lou Johnson appointed him as conductor during her illness, and he went on to conduct his first piece, "Der Freischutz." After graduating from high school, DeMello joined the Army and was stationed in France as an electronics specialist, a job that included repairing chapel organs on Army bases. DeMello longed to be a band director, so he read up on conducting and pursued a degree in music education from the University of Hawaii. Upon graduating he took positions with St. Louis High School and Kahuku High School. Although a strong personality, DeMello always kept a nonchalant, humorous demeanor and was generous with his resources and time. For 35 years he trained hundreds of Hawaii percussionists at his studio at Harry's Music Store. He also

volunteered his mentoring services at many local high and intermediate schools. For the past 19 years, he faithfully led the Oahu Civic Orchestra as its director and expanded its mission and presence in the community. DeMello would often dress as Santa Claus during the holiday season and distribute his own purchased Christmas gifts to the disadvantaged in his family's neighborhood. DeMello was known for two unique works for the Hawaii community. The first-ever pidgin version of Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf," entitled "Peetah and da Wolf," was premiered by the Honolulu Symphony in 1971 and became a favorite in youth and community concerts. DeMello also wrote an essential 427-page reference work on Portuguese immigration to Hawaii based on his extensive genealogical research trips to the Azores and Salt Lake City.

Augie Dias carried a starter's pistol and a big, warm smile. The 81-year-old passed away yesterday morning Oct 16, 2001 at the Kaiser Permanente Moanalua Medical Center, leaving a huge void in the youth athletic community. He had been hospitalized for two months. Dias was a master-level starter, the dean of Hawaii track and field officials and easily among the most well-known and beloved man in sports in the state. "He was so lovable," said Michael Ho, another longtime state track and field official. "You couldn't go anywhere with Augie without someone coming up and talking to him, from old friends to athletes who remembered him as an official and sportsman. "He seemed to be able to remember everything and everyone from every meet or game he went to." And there were a lot of events. From cross country to Pop Warner football, from biddy boxing to youth basketball. But track and field was the first love of Dias, a member of the first graduating class from Farrington High School. He ran track and played football and basketball for the Governors. Dias officiated at all but one state championship meet since the inaugural competition in 1959. He missed last spring's championship on Maui to stay on Oahu to run a youth track meet. "He told me he was sorry he couldn't go but, without him, they would have had to cancel the meet," said Keith Amemiya, executive director of the Hawaii High School Athletic Association. Despite completely losing his vision in one eye eight years ago, Dias continued his volunteer work. "You'd think that losing his sight suddenly and irreversibly would have sent him into a state of depression," Ho added. "But that wouldn't have been Augie. Not too proud to accept help when he had given it so willingly over the years, he asked for rides or took the bus. "The fullness of his life and the ease with which he handled his ability guaranteed that it would not be a defining part of his life." Dias was the track commissioner for the Oahu Interscholastic Association and chief starter for the Interscholastic League of Honolulu for over three decades. "He was so full of aloha," said Jeff Meister, ILH track coordinator and assistant athletic director at Punahou School. "He was also so giving, always there for the kids. Everyone enjoyed being around him. If there was a track meet to be found, he was there." Dias received a special service award in 1986 from the Hawaii Interscholastic Athletic Directors Association. Also, Radford High School gives a \$1,000 college scholarship in his name each year. It was an appropriate honor for Dias, who lived across the street from Radford and became intimately involved with Rams' athletics. When close friend and legendary football coach John Velasco passed away, current Radford principal Bobby Stevens took over the football team. And Dias took care of Stevens. "We used to joke that Augie coached me," Stevens said. "When John died, Augie came to football camp, made sure the kids had

sandwiches. He took care of me to make sure I was all right. "He could see the school from his house and if the alarm went off at night, he had his own key and would come over to check it out. I couldn't tell you how long he was with the school. When I came in 1970, he was already here." Many generations of Radford athletes and students called him "Grandpa." He is survived by wife Annie, a high school classmate, sons Austin and Keith, and daughters Patsy Balmores, Kathy Ah Sam and Stella Stewart, and 12 grandchildren and 17 greatgrandchildren. Dias was presented a lifetime achievement award by the Honolulu City Council for his work as a community volunteer. He was a longtime parishioner of St. Philomena Church in Salt Lake. The guy had a great sense of humor, and he loved to interact with everybody. He made everyone feel comfortable." Dias received an O'ahu Interscholastic Association Service Award in 1989 and a USA Track and Field certificate of appreciation, in addition to numerous other awards. He also was a former director of the Police Activities League and a co-founder and the first state commissioner of Hawai'i's Pop Warner Football organization. "He gave unselfishly and touched the lives of a lot of kids," Sutton said. "Some people who carry positions of authority can be remote, but Augie had a sweet disposition and was very approachable. He had a quick wit, and the best repertoire of ethnic jokes." Punahou School cross country coach Duncan Macdonald, one of Hawai'i's top runners who knew Dias since the 1960s, said events won't be the same without him. "It will be very strange," Macdonald said. Lionel Vernon DuPonte, 86, a pioneer in Maui's tourism industry, died Monday Jun 25, 2001 at his home in Wailuku. For more than 30 years, DuPonte operated Maui Island Tours, providing ground transportation, tours and school bus service. His fleet of limousines, vans and buses bearing the company logo of the sun rising over Haleakala was a familiar sight around the island until DuPonte sold the business to his friend Robert Iwamoto of Roberts Hawai'i in the 1980s. DuPonte brought the first rental cars to Maui when he opened a Hertz franchise. When the company bought back its franchises, DuPonte opened the local Budget car rental office. He also found success working for New York Insurance Co. and was one of three partners who owned the Valley Isle Motors Ford dealership before it was sold to Jim Falk. "He loved the idea of wheels," said DuPonte's son, Martin, of Pukalani. "He always said that wheels were the way to get around and that transportation is a basic need." As a member of the Hawai'i Aeronautics Commission in the 1950s, the elder DuPonte helped plan the current configuration of Honolulu International Airport. DuPonte was born in Kona where his father, Manuel, owned a coffee farm. The family later moved to Maui where Manuel DuPonte served as sheriff of Upper Pa'ia. Lionel DuPonte

attended St. Louis High School in Honolulu and the University of Hawai'i, where he was a wrestler. He won a scholarship to Greeley Teachers College in Greeley, Colo., and later earned a master's degree from UH. After serving in the Army Air Corps during World War II, he returned to Maui as an accounting teacher and football coach at Baldwin High School. Martin DuPonte said his dad was a sports buff who founded and served as commissioner of the amateur Maui Boxing Association during the 1950s. The sport was hugely popular among the island's plantation communities at a time when the only other form of entertainment was movies. Lionel DuPonte used boxing to steer young men away from trouble, his son said, and throughout his life imparted his belief in the importance of education. He helped sponsor and place a number of local athletes at Mainland colleges. Trained as an educator, DuPonte would enter the tourism trade through an association that began in the 1940s with Bob McGregor, who would become head of Tradewind Tours, and other industry pioneers. "Imagine, they had peanut shells between them, but they had a great vision," Martin DuPonte said. Referring to his father, Martin DuPonte said: "He saw a Maui that no one could have imagined."Although retired and a survivor of three open-heart surgeries, Lionel DuPonte stayed active running his horse stable in Kula until just a few weeks before his death. In addition to his son, DuPonte is survived by his wife, Eva; seven grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.
