Xiana Fairchild : Local service for Xiana Fairchild, the 7-year-old former Hawai'i girl whose body was found last month in California after being reported missing for more than a year, will be held at 4 p.m. today. The service will be held at the Salvation Army at 296 Vineyard Blvd., at the corner of Vineyard and A'ala Street. Fairchild had been missing since Jan. 9, 1999, after reportedly walking to a Vallejo school bus stop. Her disappearance sparked a nationwide search with thousands of volunteers and businesses getting involved. Her skeletal remains were found Jan. 19, 60 miles away from her home and later positively identified through DNA testing. Fairchild's great-uncle Sisto Domingo said the Hawai'i service gives local family and friends "a chance to come and celebrate Xiana's life." Domingo said his family has been updated twice a day on the case, which has been classified as a homicide. Those seeking more information on today's service may call Domingo at 833-7769. Kane Fernandez, who took over the family's carnival and circus business and built it into one of the most successful entertainment firms in Hawai'i, died yesterday of an apparent heart attack. He was 64. Fernandez suffered the heart attack following a meeting yesterday at Star of the Sea School. He was taken to the Queen's Medical Center, where he died. Fernandez was the son of E.K. Fernandez, who began entertaining Hawai'i residents before World War I. The elder Fernandez is credited with bringing the first merry-go-round and Ferris wheel to Hawai'i. Kane Fernandez was the president and chief executive of Fernandez Entertainment Inc. and E.K. Fernandez Shows Inc. His death yesterday shocked friends and family members. "We heard he was going to the hospital, and all of us were going to get in the office and say a prayer for him," said Porpilio "Pop" Tamala, who has been with E.K. Fernandez Shows for 53 years. "When we walked into the office, we got the news that he passed away." Tamala began as a maintenance worker with E.K. Fernandez, and his first job was scooping elephant manure at the circus. He now works as a supervisor in the company's food department. "He was a good man," Tamala said. "He had a big heart; he had a good heart. He was always helping people." Island Movers president and chief executive Donald Takaki agreed, saying Fernandez was active in community events. The two had known each other for more than 20 years. "He's done a lot of good things, business-wise, and also for the community. He really loved Hawai'i. He was a real good guy," Takaki said. Takaki remembers Fernandez as a star athlete at Punahou School and at the University of Hawai'i. In 1957, Fernandez was captain of the UH track team. The Fernandez family was active in the annual Punahou Carnival for more than 60 years. Punahou president Jim Scott said Kane Fernandez established an endowment fund in his father's name as a way of returning some of the profits from the carnival to the school. "He'd always come and give me a bunch of ride tickets the first day of the carnival, and ask me to make sure that they got circulated to kids who maybe couldn't afford the rides," Scott said. "I called the home tonight, and his daughter said there's going to be two Punahou carnivals this year: one at Punahou and one in heaven, because he's going to be celebrating." Fernandez was on the boards of the Boys and Girls Club, and the Hawaii Theatre Center. He also served as a director of the Bishop Museum, Variety School and the University of Hawai'i

Foundation. Fernandez graduated from the University of Hawai'i in 1958, and was accepted at the Navy's Officer Candidate School in Newport, R.I. He served 4 1/2 years in the Navy and returned to the Islands to work for his father in 1962. E.K. Fernandez died of a heart attack at age 86 while attending a showmen's convention in Chicago in 1970. Kane Fernandez took over as president and general manager of E.K. Fernandez Shows that November. Catharine Pratt Field - John D. Field was one of Catharine Pratt Field's biggest fans when in 1928 she helped start Central Union Church's "cooperative kindergarten," which became today's Central Union Preschool. After all, as her second son, he was able to go to school and be with his mom at the same time, Field recalled yesterday. "She was always there for me," he said. Catharine Pratt Field, 103, died Thursday at Arcadia Retirement Residence. She was a descendant of Dr. Gerritt Judd, who came to the islands from Massachusetts with the early missionaries. Fukushima joined the Maui Fire Department after Wimpy's and also worked as a mason, building chimneys, fireplaces, walls and other structures. His projects are found islandwide and include recognizable structures, such as the Wailuku Bridge. He also worked on East Maui Irrigation Co. tunnels and helped build irrigation ditches carrying water to the Central Maui isthmus. He served as fire chief from 1968 to 1971, retiring because of health problems after 25 years of county service. Unable to sit around, he and his wife started Fukushima Store. In the early days, both arose at 2 a.m. to make inari sushi and potato tempura for 10 cents apiece and maki sushi for 50 cents a roll. Today, Fukushima Store is renowned for its hot dogs, coated with mustard, catsup, mayonnaise, relish, a pickle slice and chopped onions. Fukushima's son, George, continues to operate the store. Leslie Vincent Fullard-Leo, O'ahu resident, Hollywood actor, adventurer, businessman and owner of Palmyra Atoll, died in Honolulu on Feb. 1, 2001 at age 91. Fullard-Leo was a graduate of Punahou School and attended school in Winchester, England. As a young man, the athletic Fullard-Leo was also a noted swimmer and Alpine skier. In the 1930s he worked his way to Asia on an ocean liner and lived in Shanghai for a year. He later returned to England, where he was one of the few Americans working on the stock exchange. Fullard-Leo studied acting at the Royal Academy of London, and appeared more than 30 Hollywood movies in the 1930s, '40s and '50s, including "Pursuit to Algiers," "Forever Amber" and "In Harm's Way." In Hollywood he performed under the name Leslie Vincent. "Marlene Dietrich gave me my first big break in acting," he once said. The two met in France and became friends. Fullard-Leo landed a lesser role in the famous 1939 film "Destry Rides Again," starring Dietrich. Although he had a major role as a young RAF pilot in the critically acclaimed "Paris Underground," a 1945 war film, Fullard-Leo didn't reach the Hollywood big time. "He never made major film stardom," said his brother Ainsley Fullard-Leo. "He came close, but then the Palmyra thing came up and he had to drop out." The "Palmyra thing" was a decades-long legal skirmish with the federal government over the ownership and use of the pristine Pacific atoll 1,000 miles southwest of Hawai'i. The atoll was purchased by Fullard-Leo's parents in 1922 for \$15,000. But the government claimed title. Ultimately the Supreme Court ruled in favor of the Fullard-Leo family. Following his Hollywood career, Fullard-Leo headed a small hotel association on O'ahu. Fullard-Leo is survived by brothers Ainsley and Dudley Fullard-Leo, four nephews and one niece.
