Diane Young Galus "taught me that there was always more to learn, more to do, more to achieve," said her sister Pamela Young. "There was nothing in life that held her back," said Young, a news anchor at KITV-4, who noted that her sister, blind since birth, served as a role model for many others. At the One Kalakaua Senior

Living building, where she lived, Galus inspired others by her actions, showing people that "they could overcome their problems," Young said. Galus died Sunday Nov 18, 2001 at Queen's Medical Center. She was 57 years old. Galus was born in Honolulu on March 26, 1944. She studied at the Diamond Head School for the Deaf and Blind under Mabel Smythe. She later earned a bachelor's degree in history at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. Galus moved to Michigan, then Pennsylvania, where she obtained master's degrees in history and sociology. Galus was fluent in French, Mandarin and Japanese. Moreover, she contributed to several literary journals. Galus moved to New York where she became a computer programmer at the Chase Manhattan Bank in New York City. Later, she returned to Hawaii because of health problems. Galus believed in volunteer services for the community, said friend Ann Ito. She served on the advisory board for the Ho'opono Center for the Blind, Library for the Blind & Physically Handicapped, and March of Dimes. "She was so brilliant, capable and independent, despite multiple physical challenges," said Gere Masumoto of Ho'opono. She also loved the arts, supporting the Honolulu Symphony, Hawaii Opera Theatre and MENSA. Galus is survived by her father, William W.H. Loyal Garner - Because music was so much a part of Loyal Garner's life, mele and hula will play a large part in tributes by family and friends to the "Lady of Love" at her funeral next week. A service for Garner has been scheduled for 3 p.m. Monday at Kawaiaha'o Church. Burial is planned for noon next Tuesday at Hawaiian Memorial Park. Garner, 55, died Thursday at The Queen's Medical Center after a nearly two-year battle with colon cancer. A member of the popular Local Divas — with Carole Kai, Melveen Leed and Nohelani Cypriano — Garner was always preparing the music for the foursome. But she also had a solo career as the "Lady of Love," a nickname that emerged when she regularly was host for the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy telethons. The nickname continued as her career flourished in recordings such as "Chotto Matte Kudasai" and "Shave Ice," in clubs from the Three Torches at the old

Cinerama Reef Hotel to the Canoe House of the 'Ilikai Hotel, and on TV commercials for Cutter Ford and Windward Mall. "She was the essence of love — she always loved everyone, even strangers," Kai said. "The Divas will perform at the services," said Janice Ukauka, Garner's companion and manager for the past 20 years. "But there are so many people who want to perform, we're asking Cha Thompson (of Tihati Productions) to coordinate." Thompson said yesterday that performances by the Local Divas and Garner's brother Kimo Garner, also a musician, were the only ones confirmed so far. "So many performers have been calling Janice to be part of the program, she's asked us to help," said Thompson, who can be reached at Tihati offices (735-0202) or cellular phone (864-5454). A roster of performers was to be completed by the weekend. Garner's death prompted the surviving Divas to revamp their planned concert, still themed "This One's for You, Loyal" and slated for 7:30 p.m. Nov. 29 at the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel's Hawai'i Ballroom. From a mostly holiday serenade, with individual and group vocals, the concert has been reshaped into a tribute that will celebrate Garner's life and legacy. "Her last wish was to do the concert," Kai said. "Loyal had been orchestrating our music, so the show will go on, which was her desire; and in a sense, she'll still be directing us, since she did the charts." "She had every intention of being at the concert, though she didn't think she could sing; maybe just one song," said Ukauka. "So we're shocked that she's no longer here, though she really fought (the cancer) to the finish." The illness resulted in massive medical bills, said Ukauka, and Garner, a champion fund-raiser herself, was able to see her peers, friends and fans rally around her own cause. At least \$30,000 was raised Oct. 7 when 2,500 gathered to pay homage to Garner at Windward Mall. "She stayed the seven hours, because she was so touched, but she developed a blood clot sitting in the chair for so long," Ukauka said. It was Garner's last public appearance. A few days later, she was hospitalized at Queen's, where she died last week. Because of the mounting bills, Kai said, the Nov. 29 performance also will take on a benefit perspective. For every ticket sold, Sheraton will hand over \$5 to the Garner medical fund. Kai said proceeds from another Divas concert in the weeks ahead also will go to the Garner fund. Bruno Hans Geba's career took him from psychology to training U.S. Olympic skiers to writing books, said wife Penelope "Penei" Geba. She described her husband as "a true Renaissance man." Kona resident Jim Hinch, Bruno Geba's friend for seven years, said: "He was a really amazing man. His depth of knowing and his interests in scientific things mostly made him different than anyone I've ever known." Geba died from cancer July 27 at his Kona home. He was 74. Geba was born on March 8, 1927, in Salzburg, Austria. "His dream was to come to the New World and start a new life," Penelope Geba said. "He wanted to end up living someplace with palm trees and beaches." After World War II, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in medical science, psychology and physical education from the University of Vienna in Austria. Then he taught at the University of Tehran in Iran. He also served as an adviser to the Iranian Ministry of Health and Medical Education. At about the same time, he received his American doctorate in clinical psychology at the University of Colorado. He was director of the institute's health center until 1962. While in Aspen, Penelope Geba said, he trained the U.S. men's and women's Olympic ski teams and coached the International Professional Ski Racers Association. He later published three books dedicated to finding inner peace. In 1966 he started a private practice as a psychotherapist in San Francisco. He later became a professor at San Diego State University, then retired in 1992 and moved to Hawaii. "He was highly intellectual and very creative," Penelope Geba said. "He always read ... on scientific things and theories," Hinch said. "One of his interests were the pyramids (in Egypt), and he would read those and discuss those at length." Geba's hobbies also included gardening, golfing, landscaping, sculpting, tennis and swimming. "He was an athlete to the end," said Keoki Jenkins, a friend of Geba's for five years. "He was swimming six miles a day even though he was in his

Fred Gillett, 64, was among scientists who dreamed of blotting out the twinkle in stars to get unblurred light for better infrared images of astronomical objects. He was the principal figure in making that dream a reality with the Gemini Project in Hawaii and Chile. A pioneer in infrared astronomy, he died Sunday April 22, 2001 at the University of Washington Medical Center in Seattle after battling a rare bone marrow disorder. "He was a member of a small group who created infrared astronomy as a science," said Michael Merrill at the National Optical Astronomy Observatory in Tucson, Ariz. Gillett was project scientist for the International Gemini Observatory --

twin 8-meter telescopes located at Mauna Kea and Cerro Pachon, Chile. Technology of the Gemini telescopes makes it possible to erase twinkling of stars and prevent distortion to obtain better images. "Fred played a major role in convincing people to have the Gemini Telescope optimized for infrared astronomy," said Robert McLaren, Hawaii Institute for Astronomy associate director for Mauna Kea. "He followed through to make sure it was designed and constructed in such a way to fully exploit the capability at Mauna Kea." He said Gillett, who lived about two years on the Big Island, "was a close personal friend and colleague of many Hawaii astronomers, myself included." He first worked with Gillett at the Kitt Peak National Observatory in Tucson when he did his first observing run in about 1980, McLaren said. Gillett was support astronomer. "He was extremely helpful, a very competent and professional person." Gillett was a staff member at the national and Kitt Peak observatories from 1973 to 1989 and, for a period, was Kitt Peak's acting director. He pioneered exploration of astronomical sources in the thermal infrared, the region where many cool objects such as planets and dust clouds emit much of their light. His contributions included studies of Saturn, Uranus and Neptune, and observations of the center of the Milky Way and of star-forming regions in the galaxy. Sidney Wolff of NOAO, first director of the Gemini Project, formerly with the Hawaii Institute of Astronomy, said Gillett "was the one who persuaded the astronomical community that infrared-optimized telescopes should be a top scientific priority. "Then he carried out the detailed calculations that showed how to build them -- their requirements for telescope design, mirror coatings and instrumental performance. Fred kept us honest." Gemini director Matt Mountain said he "relied greatly on Fred's rigor, quiet wisdom and friendship to guide us through many difficult times on Gemini. Fred will be greatly missed by all of us. He has left a great void in our hearts and at our observatory." About half of the Gemini Project is funded by the United States through the National Science Foundation. The Association of Universities for Research in Astronomy Inc. operates the national and Gemini observatories for the foundation. "Fred was a tremendous asset for the Association of Universities for Research in Astronomy," said association President William S. Smith. "His contributions will have a long-lasting impact." Gillett also was active in space-based astronomy and influenced progress of all major infrared astronomy missions in the last two decades. He received NASA's Exceptional Scientific Achievement Medal in 1984 for his work on infrared astronomy satellites. When Gillett's eyes weren't on the heavens, they were on the road. He commuted to work on his bike nearly every day and participated in several cross-state rides and cross-country tours. Survivors include his wife Marian;

children Nancy Richardson, Michael Gillett and Danuta Gessner; grandchildren Elizabeth Gillett, Eric Gillett, Alexandra Richardson, Taylor Richardson and Megan Gessner; brother James Gillett; sisters Jeanne Mae Spears and Suzanne Hageman; and mother Elizabeth Gillett. Dr. William W. Goodhue Sr., a veteran physician whose father was a Hansen's disease specialist at Kalaupapa and in China, died Sunday Oct 7, 2001 on Kaua'i, where he had lived for more than 50 years.
