Margaret Martin Kaaua, 92, a longtime Hawai'i County political figure, Hilo businesswoman and musician, died Sept. 12. From 1932-1965, Kaaua served as deputy county clerk or as county clerk, the latter an elected position. Active in the Republican Party on the national, state and county levels, she failed in a bid for Hawai'i County Council in 1968. Born May 24, 1909, on the Big Island, Kaaua was a member of the prominent Martin family of law enforcement officers. During World War II, when martial law was in effect, she served as a deputy sheriff. Her father, Henry K. Martin, was county sheriff, and her son, Martin, served on the Big Island police force for 27 years, the last eight as deputy police chief. Her late brother, George Martin, was police chief; another brother, Charles Martin, was a police inspector. Her late husband, Edward, served as Big Island district engineer for the Territory of Hawai'i. Francis Benevides, 83, who worked with Kaaua in Republican Party activities, recalling how much she loved children, described her as a "very compassionate and cooperative, a very good, wonderful woman." Throughout the years, Kaaua volunteered for community groups such as the Hilo Woman's Club and the Easter Seal Society. Before she began her public career, she performed with the Blue Melody Boys and owned several businesses. No public services are planned. Mary Jane Kahanamoku, a noted music educator who also played a key role in the revival of Big Island canoe racing in the 1970s, died Monday at Kona Community Hospital. She was 81. Her husband, the late Louis Ko'oliko Kahanamoku, was the fifth of six brothers of the legendary sports family whose most famous member was three-time Olympian Duke Kahanamoku. Family stories say she wooed her husband while playing 'ukulele at the Moana Hotel in Waikiki. She spent more than 20 years as choral music teacher at Konawaena High School and devoted most of her energy in retirement to promoting outrigger canoe racing. "She had a Hawaiian spirit throughout her life," said younger sister Lorraine Sohm, who lives in Kona. Kahanamoku was born Jan. 7, 1920, in Waiakea, and developed a lifelong love of things Hawaiian. Her mother was Portuguese and her father, who worked for Hawai'i Consolidated Railway in the early 1900s, was British. Don Isbell, who taught instrumental music at Konawaena during much of the time Kahanamoku taught classes in singing and 'ukulele, said she "just loved the kids." She took her choir on an extended tour of California and then to Tahiti, where she would later promote Polynesian canoe

racings. She helped found and served for a time as the secretary general to the International Vaa Federation, a canoe racing association. Isbell's most vivid memory of Kahanamoku is watching her "hyperventilate on the football field" after a 1972 fire destroyed the school music room and most of her collection of 'ukulele. "She was just devastated," he recalled. But she bounced back before retiring from the public school system. John "Butch" Kekahu III, who organized two marches upon Washington, D.C., to raise awareness of the plight of native Hawaiians, died Thursday Dec 27, 2001 at the Memorial Hospital in Lihue after a battle with diabetes. Kekahu, 57, organized the first Aloha March in 1998 to publicize Hawaiian issues, including the return of control of the islands to native Hawaiians. Two years later, a second march was held. Both events attracted participants from Hawaii and the mainland, and included a symbolic tossing of ti leaves into Boston Harbor. Kekahu, the founder of the Koani Foundation, an Anahola-based native rights organization, was arrested in 1993 for his six-year occupation of Hawaiian home lands. Despite his lack of a formal education, he lectured on Hawaiian self-determination before the U.S. Congress and at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. His mother, Rebecca Mikala Kekahu, marveled at her son's physical strength and determination to continue his advocacy in the face of advanced diabetes. "I have not seen anyone suffer so much and struggle just to get through each day," she said. "My son touched so many lives. He was indeed a patriot for our people." Kekahu was born in Hanapepe and spent the 1960s in Los Angeles as a musician and entertainer. He returned to Hawaii in 1971, when he began fighting for native rights. "Like a lot of us native Hawaiian brothers and sisters, I am the poster boy for how we have fared under the American way of life," Kekahu said recently. "It is with great sadness that I have seen too many of my people die while waiting for our lands to be returned." Francis J. Kennedy Jr., business manager for the Hawai'i Fire Fighters Association Local 1463 for more than 30 years, died yesterday morning at his Hawai'i Kai home. He was 59. Kennedy was born Nov. 2, 1941, and graduated from St. Louis School in 1959. He joined the Honolulu Fire Department in 1964 and served as a firefighter until 1972. Kennedy's father was a longtime labor leader in Hawai'i, so it made sense when the younger Kennedy was asked in 1970 to help build the fledgling Hawai'i Fire

Fighters Association union. He is credited with developing the business manager position and strengthening the union that represents 1,800 firefighters in all four counties and at the state airports. Union president Bobby Lee said last night that Kennedy fought for better pay and benefits, as well as improved living conditions for the state's firefighters. But Lee said Kennedy also had the public's interest in mind. He credited Kennedy with developing the state's collective bargaining law. He also fought for mandatory random drug testing of firefighters. "Drugs could also affect fellow firefighters. We worked at trying to better the environment, not just for the firefighters, but for the public too," Kennedy said. Kennedy's labor activities also went beyond the firefighters union. In 1971, Gov. John Burns appointed Kennedy to serve on the first Hawai'i Labor Relations Board, a position he held until 1979. He also served as a labor arbitrator and worked on several boards, including the Aloha United Way. Honolulu Fire Chief Attilio Leonardi would often be on the opposite side of the negotiating table. But the chief said he considered Kennedy a great friend. "He was a terrific guy who had a way about him that was very positive and easygoing," Leonardi said "He always had a different perspective and different way of looking at things. Whenever we got into a bind, after a couple of days he would always come up with a solution that was equitable for everybody." PAUL KIERKIEWICZ The icehouse on Hilo's Banyan peninsula, which had supplied blocks of ice to fishermen since 1949, has closed due to the death of its owner. Businessman Paul Kierkiewicz, 47, died April 19, 2001 in Queen's Hospital due to the failure of his liver and other organs, said his brother Jim Kierkiewicz. "Paul was a hard-driving man and he was a smart businessman," his brother said. Kierkiewicz bought Hawaii Ice & Cold Storage Inc. in 1989 and nearly obtained county approval to expand it to include a restaurant, museum and apartments. But his plans were stymied when retiree Henry Ross, a frequent critic of government, complained that the disbanded Hawaii Redevelopment Agency had sole control of the area. The body was reconstituted, but county agencies kept adding new requirements without granting Kierkiewicz approval. "He didn't know what side of the road to stand on," his brother said. Erida Reichert Klemmer, the first woman chief resident at the Queen's Medical Center and an advocate for men and women with Hansen's disease, died Monday of cancer. Reichert was born in San Francisco, and traveled to Honolulu every other summer with her family. She attended Katherine Delmar Burke School for Girls, the University of California and Stanford University. She graduated from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in 1953. But Reichert is best known for her work as facility director and medical administrator of the Hansen's disease program within the State Department of Health, where she worked hard to destigmatize the disease, said her son, Fred Klemmer. Dick Korsak, who knew Reichert for more than 25 years, said she was a dogmatic, thorough and honest individual. "Her intense care for the people she took care of made her a special physician. She loved her patients so much and

worked for their rights at whatever cost," said Korsak. Along with the assistance of Island businessmen, Reichert lobbied the state to allow for more openness at Hale Mohalu and Kalaupapa for patients to travel and for family and friends to visit. Kalaupapa postmaster Kuulei Bell said Reichert was invaluable to the people of Kalaupapa. "We called her mommy. She always went the extra mile whenever anyone needed anything, she was such a special person," Bell said. "All of the patients really loved her." From 1966-71, Reichert served as medical coordinator of the community studies on pesticides for the University of Hawai'i's Pacific Biomedical Research Center, and from 1967-76 she was a clinical instructor of pharmacology at the University of Hawai'i School of Medicine. Reichert helped set up Hawai'i's disaster response system and the statewide emergency medical services system when she was chief of the emergency health branch at the State Department of Health. And in 1979, she returned once again to become the chief of the Department of Health's Hansen's disease program, serving as physician at Hale Mohalu, making frequent trips to Kalaupapa, and directing inpatient and outpatient services for the entire program. She published a number of papers on the treatment of leprosy in Hawai'i's multicultural community. She is survived by her two sons, Fred Klemmer and E. Howard L. Shigeomi Kubota - Retired Kauai Councilman Shigeomi Kubota "stood for what he believed was right and did not always go along with what was popular," said his daughter Adele Stevens. "He did what was best for the people," she said. Kubota died Thursday Nov 29, 2001 at his Koloa home. He was 86. Kubota was born in Kekaha, Kauai, on Jan. 3, 1915, to Kiku Kitsutaka and Kizou Kubota. He was the second of 11 children. Kubota graduated from Kauai High School in 1933 and worked at a pineapple cannery to help support his brothers and sisters through college. Kubota later became chairman of the Public Works Committee and was a supervisor for the Kauai Pineapple Co. A former football star, Kubota was the chairman of the Kauai Football Officials Association. He was known for his

involvement in sports, coaching community football, basketball and baseball teams. Kubota also was the founder of the Garden Isle Mortuary in 1949. Kubota served six years as a member of the County Board of Supervisors and two years as a councilman. He served as Kauai County Council chairman in 1973-1974. "He was a people person," said Robert Yatsuda, who served on the Finance Committee while Kubota was chairman. Kubota also served as chairman of Kauai's School Advisory Council. As a father of five children, he was very indulgent, Stevens said. "He did everything for us," she said. Stevens said education was important to her father. During his term on the Council, Kubota initiated free bus transportation for all children, said Kubota's wife, Bernice. Stevens described her father as an independent thinker who taught his children to stand up for what they believe in. "He taught us too well," she said. Shigeomi Kubota was gruff and irascible as a politician, but associates remember him as an honest man unafraid to challenge powerful forces over what he thought was right. "He was a real stickler for doing the right thing," said Turk Tokita, longtime administrative assistant to the Kaua'i Board of Supervisors and its successor, the County Council. Kubota, 86, who died Nov. 29, 2001, served three terms on the board from 1963 to 1968, and won election to two-year terms on the council in 1969 and 1973. He was the council chairman during his last term and was a Democrat throughout his career. "He was very objective, straightforward and honest. He didn't play games," said Jerome Hew, a former councilman who retired as the county clerk. Kubota, an accountant with Kaua'i Pineapple Co., was a founder of Garden Island Mortuary, and he made his name in the community as a sports official. "I first remember Shigeomi from my high school days when he officiated our football games," said Burt Tsuchiya, a former county economic development director and former council member. The sense of fair play that is a part of sports carried over for Kubota into politics. He did not hesitate to lecture those he felt were acting improperly. "I've seen him go against the mayor. He would stand on principle and be the watchdog of county finances. He would always cite the Hawai'i Revised Statutes and the County Charter," Tokita said. Kubota also had a fine sense of humor and could tell a story with a grin and a gleam in his eye. "He was a good man with a kind heart, the last of Kaua'i's old school of politicians," Tsuchiya said.
