Jay Landis, 82, a tireless crusader for Hawaiian causes on the Wai'anae Coast, died of pneumonia May 4 at St. Francis West Medical Center. Unmarried and childless, Landis devoted half a century of his life to improvement of his community. A marina at Poka'i Bay, a public library, a sewage treatment plant and new beach parks came about partly because of his persistent effort. Landis, a grandson of Link McCandless, a former delegate to Congress, contributed the first \$500 to establish a Hawaiian language program at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. As a lifetime member of the Wai'anae Hawaiian Civic Club, he worked for the building of E'ala, a double canoe, now used as an educational tool. He was a founder of the Lualualei Lions Club and president of the Wai'anae Council, predecessor of the Wai'anae Neighborhood Board. His cousin, Albert Silva, said Landis was asked many times to run for political office but always refused. "He steered away from Hawaiian political issues," said Silva. "He concentrated on culture and education." He often testified on Wai'anae Coast issues before the City Council. An authority on Wai'anae Coast history, he was a major contributor to the book, "Historic Wai'anae." In the 1940s, he installed a screen in his back yard and showed free movies for Wai'anae Coast kids who couldn't afford the price of a movie-theater ticket. Landis was born March 13, 1920, in San Francisco. At 12, he came to Hawai'i and lived with his aunt, Annie Silva, in Wai'anae in back of

the police station. She became his guardian and raised him along with her own six sons. After graduating from the eighth grade, Landis quit school and moved to Kalihi where he lived with another aunt while working in construction. About 1946, two of his Wai'anae cousins drove their Model-A Ford to Kalihi. When Landis came to the curb, a cousin said, "Jay, it's time to come home." Landis went inside, packed a Pan American Airways flight bag and went back to Wai'anae where he lived after that, taking care of his aunt. "He was always proud of being Hawaiian, even when many Hawaiians weren't" said Silva. "He loved Wai'anae and its people." He is survived by four first cousins and more than 30 second cousins. Funeral services will be at 9 a.m., June 2, at Sacred Hearts Church in Wai'anae. Landis' ashes will be scattered off Poka'i Bay from the Hawaiian Civic Club canoe E'ala after the services. Auntie Violet Pahu Liliko'i, 76, one of Hawai'i's musical legends and frequent musical companion of Genoa Keawe, died at home March 13, of complications from diabetes "Auntie Violet," as she was known, had a career that lasted a half century. She started out performing in her childhood home, standing on a spiral staircase that her entertainer father built just so the 9-year-old girl could reach the top of her bass. Before she was done she had played for kings and presidents. She became a fixture on the developing Hawaiian music scene, playing such venues as Waikiki Tavern, Waikiki Sands, Club Polynesia, Polynesian Palace, Kodak Hula Show, and a five-year

stint on the S.S. Independence. She played alongside Hilo Hattie, Leina'ala Simerson, Pauline Kekahuna, Vickie Rodrigues and Leilani Sharpe Mendez. One of her longest associations would be a 64-year friendship with noted Island performer Keawe. The two were recipients of Duke's Canoe Club Waikiki's Ho'okahiko Award last year for pioneering efforts in perpetuating Hawaiian music and culture. Keawe dedicated a Hilo concert yesterday to her partner, friend and "sister," provoking tearful reminisces from the crowd. Keawe is booked as a headliner on Maui the night of the funeral, and she expects a tearful reception when she dedicates a few of Liliko'i's favorite songs: "Po'ina 'Ole," "Don't Forget," "Piha Hau'oli," and Liliko'i's trademark, frisky "Chickadee." "She was blessed," Keawe said. "She knew many of the (old) songs no one remembers. I will miss her." Keawe and Liliko'i began their musical careers with Honolulu Harbor Boat Days, playing 'ukulele and bass for arriving passengers. Liliko'i also played guitar and 'ukulele, and steel guitar with entertainer husband, the late steel guitarist, Edward. The pair sang with Alfred Apaka at Fort DeRussy, for 18 years at the 'Ilikai Hotel, and were discovered by Lucky Luck on his television show, "Lucky's Lu'au." The musical duo was also entertainment and worldwide traveling partners with many of the state's foremost entertainers, such as Kekua Fernandes, Ainsley Halemanu, Val Kepilino, Billy Hew Len and Peter Ahia, and many of Hawai'i's foremost halau, including Auntie Rose Joshua, John Ka'imikaua, O'Brien Eselu, Auntie Lei Sharpe Mendez, and even halau from Japan.

In 1985, Auntie Violet recorded her first album, "The Liliko'i Family," with her six children. She has passed on her legacy to her daughters, "The Liliko'i Sisters." For a week before her death, after she had returned home from the hospital, "Her kids were at her bedside daily," said Keawe, singing to her until she died. John C. Lilly of Kula, Maui, a brilliant but controversial brain researcher who went on to champion dolphins and interspecies communications, died Sunday at age 86. Lilly died of heart failure at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital in Los Angeles. A memorial service will be held Thursday in Los Angeles, with a memorial service on Maui to be scheduled later. "His many friends will miss him," said his former wife, Mary Lilly of Ha'iku. "Their interest in him kept him alive." Lilly was born in St. Paul, Minn., on Jan. 6, 1915. He attended the California Institute of Technology, Dartmouth College Medical School and the University of Pennsylvania Medical School. During World War II, he conducted high-altitude research at the Johnson Foundation for Medical Physics. After the war, he trained as a psychoanalyst and worked on mapping the brain for the U.S. Public Health Service. Lilly pioneered scientific research in the areas of electrical brain stimulation, sensory deprivation and human-dolphin communication. He invented the isolation tank in the 1950s and began using psychedelics such as LSD and ketamine in the solitude of the tank about a decade later. In 1959, he established the Communication Research Institute in the U.S. Virgin Islands to study the vocalizations of bottle-nosed dolphins. He later established the Janus Project in San Francisco to do further research on dolphins. Lilly retired to Maui in 1992. He is the author of 19 books and hundreds of scientific articles, and was the inspiration for two Hollywood films, "Altered States" and "Day of the Dolphin." He is survived by two sons, John Jr. of Zacatecas, Mexico, and Charles of Ha'iku; a daughter Cynthia Cantwell of Paradise, Calif.; a brother, David of St. Paul, Minn.; and Barbara Clarke-Lilly of Kihei and Philip H. He died Tuesday Oct 23, 2001 in California. "It was sudden, not expected," city Environmental Services Director Tim Steinberger said. Limtiaco had gone to Palo Alto, Calif., for treatment of a biliary blockage and potential tumor. During the procedure, surgeons discovered a cancerous tumor in his liver and bile duct. He died of heart failure because of excessive pressure on his organs as a result of the surgery, according to his wife, Ruth. The news of his death stunned friends here. "Forty-seven years old is too young, especially for a man who loved his family and life so much," Mayor Jeremy Harris said through city

spokeswoman Carol Costa." Felix Limtiaco served as deputy director of Wastewater Management in 1993-94, and director in 1994-96. During that time, he introduced micro-tunneling, a procedure that allows crews to work under the street without disturbing traffic flow. The procedure was used on the Nimitz Highway relief sewer project, which won a national award. He started the Limtiaco Consulting Group after he left the city. Born and raised in Guam, Limtiaco earned his civil engineering degree from Stanford University and worked as a project and engineering manager in Guam, Saipan and the Federated States of Micronesia before coming to Hawai'i in 1982. Limtiaco enjoyed spending time with his wife and adult children, Matthew and Kimberly, in addition to cooking, practicing aikido and playing golf. He and his wife would have celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary Dec. 4. "One of the most remarkable things to me was that at the young age of 21 years, he and I were married and he adopted and raised both of my children as his own," Ruth Limtiaco said. "I think the best way to define Felix is to say he was full of life," Steinberger said. "He didn't let work dominate his life. Services are pending. [Adv 27/10/2001]

Anne Morrow Lindbergh, wife of aviator Charles A. Lindbergh who became his copilot and wrote extensively about their pioneering adventures in flight, died at her rural Vermont home yesterday. She was 94. Lindbergh died in her home in Passumpsic, about 30 miles northeast of the state capital. "Mother died quietly in her second home in Vermont with her family around her," said son Reeve Lindbergh in a statement issued by the family foundation. A painfully shy woman, she was thrown into the spotlight of her famous husband immediately after they met in 1927, shortly after he made his famous solo flight across the Atlantic, the first ever. She was a senior at Smith College. He took her flying on their first date. She soon became her husband's co-pilot, co-navigator and radio operator. The couple's flights across oceans and around the world fascinated the American public. In 1932, the alreadyfamous Lindberghs drew worldwide attention when their first child, 20-month-old Charles Jr., was kidnapped and murdered. Bruno Richard Hauptmann, an unemployed Bronx carpenter, was arrested for the crime in 1934, tried and convicted in 1935, and executed the following year. Anne Lindbergh wrote of the amguish she and her husband felt after the body of their son was discovered 10 weeks after the sleeping baby was kidnapped from their newly built house near Princeton, N.J. She described one of her dreams: "I was walking down a suburban street seeing other people's children and I stopped to see one in a carriage and I thought it was a sweet child, but I

was looking for my child in his face. And I realized, in the dream, that I would do that forever." Lindbergh published 13 books of memoirs, fiction, poems and essays. In an introduction to her journals, she affectionately recalled her famous fiance as "a knight in shining armor, with myself as his devoted page." Charles Lindbergh and Anne Morrow were married on May 27, 1929, in a private ceremony at the Morrow residence in Englewood, N.J. The couple had six children together. Charles Lindbergh died in 1974 and is buried at Palapala Hoʻomau Church on Maui, where the Lindberghs once had a home. On April 20, 1930, the Lindberghs set a transcontinental speed record, flying from Los Angeles to New York in 14 hours and 45 minutes. Anne Lindbergh was seven months pregnant at the time. Lindbergh was the second of four children of Dwight Whitney Morrow, a banker who later became U.S. ambassador to Mexico and a U.S. senator, and Elizabeth Cutter Morrow, a writer and teacher. In addition to the kidnapped child, the Lindberghs had five other children — Jon, Land, Scott, Reeve and Anne, who died in 1993.

James Wilbur Lovell, retired president of Lewers and Cooke, a decorated World War II veteran and former Hula Bowl coach, touched the lives of hundreds of people in Hawai'i as a teacher, coach, battalion leader and businessman, said his son, Ray Yokoyama. Lovell died Sunday April 15, 2001 in Honolulu at the age of 94. Lovell helped to mold the lives of students, athletes and young soldiers, said Yokoyama, and

people remembered him as generous and helpful. Yokoyama recalled an encounter with an old man last year while pushing his father in a wheelchair. The man spotted them, waited, and called out his name. "I'm sure my father didn't recognize him," Yokoyama said. "But this guy was so touched by him that now as an old man he still remembered my father." Lovell was born Feb. 6, 1907 in Hastings, Neb. After graduating in 1930 from the University of Nebraska, where he was inducted into its Athletic Hall of Fame, Lovell accepted a job in Hawai'i teaching mechanical drawing at Washington Intermediate School. At Washington he coached football, basketball and track. In 1933 Lovell transferred to Roosevelt High School, where he taught and coached for six years. At the time of the 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor, Lovell was in the Hawai'i National Guard, which had been activated 15 months earlier. He became the second in command of the 100th Battalion, leading a group of mostly Nisei men into battle in Italy. In accounts of Lovell's war experience, members of the 100th said he was gutsy, took care of "da boys" and was always on the front lines with his troops. His combat record includes Purple Heart with cluster, Silver Star, Bronze Star with cluster, American, African, European and Asian Theater Medals, Victory Medal and Combat Infantry Badge. After returning to civilian life, Lovell worked in the building and wood product supply industries. He served as president of Lewers and Cooke, a major building company, working his way up from manager of the lumber and merchandise department. He retired from Lewers and Cooke after 27 years. He then worked as executive director of the Wood Products Association of Hawai'i. Joan Yvonne "Vonnie" Lyons - Kona tourism figure, artist and children's author Joan Yvonne "Vonnie" Lyons died Monday at Kona Community Hospital. She was 71. Lyons, who lived in Honolulu and on Maui before moving to West Hawai'i 21 years ago, was the widow of Honolulu Advertiser cartoonist Harry Lyons, who died in 1989. Aware she was dying of pancreatic cancer, Lyons attended a recent farewell gathering with close friends at the Kona Village Resort. A stroke last week left her in a coma, from which she never recovered, said longtime friend Pamela Parkhurst-Amaral. She said Lyons was "totally in charge of her life" right up to the end and was glad she was given a chance to plan for her death. "She was really looking forward to her next great adventure — (death)," said Sherry Bracken of the Kona Outdoor Circle, one of many organizations with which Lyons was involved. She was born in Burbank, Calif., Dec. 6, 1929, and moved to Hawai'i in the 1950s. Lyons was executive director of Destination Kona Coast and previously worked 20 years with the now-defunct Keauhou Visitors Destination Association. She was a member of the Kailua Village Design Commission and had worked with the Hawai'i Visitors and Convention Bureau and for several developments in Kona and on Maui. Bracken said Lyons "cared for the place she thought was the most beautiful on Earth and did something about it" by supporting outdoor plantings and fighting outdoor

advertising. Parkhurst-Amaral also recalled Lyons' passion for painting, noting her oil artworks were exhibited on several occasions. In 1995, Lyons published "Keikilani, The Kona Nightingale," a children's book about a singing donkey that lived on the slopes of Hualalai Mountain. At the time of her death, she had completed a sequel, but plans for publishing it were not immediately known. She also worked closely with her late husband during the six years they published his jocular magazine "Harry Lyons' Kona Coast."
