The 33-year-old Ma'afala brother was diagnosed with leukemia last year and received a bone marrow transplant early this year. The donor was his sister, Leimomi Ma'afala. Ma'afala, who played for UH in 1985 and 1986, underwent his first cycle of chemotherapy last April. Ma'afala was a standout defensive lineman at McKinley High School before injuries and personal problems abbreviated his college career. Surgically repaired knees cost him a pro career. He played semipro football, and spent 1999 as an assistant coach at McKinley. His brother Roy Ma'afala played football at Utah. Nick Ma'afala and his siblings grew up in Mayor Wright Homes. He is survived by his wife, Shannon Sandry of Pearl City, and by his mother, Lusia Ma'afala of Kalihi-Palama. Wai'anae Boat Harbor master William Aila was one of the people Maikai saw safely to shore over the years. "The first time I met him was when my wife and I bought our first boat in 1982," Aila said. "We had stayed out a little bit later than we normally would and were coming in at about 8 p.m. and here was this gentleman we didn't know from Adam who waited for us to come home. He knew we were still out there and we were rookies." After his wife, Abigail, died in 1983, Maikai slowed down, gradually losing his independence and stopped going to the harbor about two years ago, Mamaril said. He died peacefully in his bed, she said. Theodore M. "Ted" McCarty, a key figure in the development of the electric guitar and former president of Gibson Guitar Co., died Sunday Apr 1, 2001 in a retirement center. He was 91. McCarty, a part-time Hawaii resident, was the president of the Gibson Guitar Co. for 16 years, transforming a sleepy Kalamazoo, Mich., maker of acoustic musical instruments into the purveyor of guitars to the stars. Nearly every virtuoso guitarist of the rock 'n' roll era at one time or another played a Gibson. McCarty's Les Paul series -- named for the blues guitarist who endorsed it -- is arguably the most famous guitar ever made. It led to the Explorer series, widely used by both rock and country guitarists, and the radical Flying V. "It's fair to say that without him, our industry and the music would be different," said Paul Reed Smith, an acclaimed guitar designer who enlisted McCarty to help develop Smith's own brand. Gardner McKay, a former actor and prolific author of stories, novels, plays and radio shows, died in his Hawai'i Kai home yesterday Nov 21, 2001. He was 69. "He was a gem, in every way he lived his life, doing all the things the rest of us mortals aspired to do," said Michael Titterton, president and general manager of Hawai'i Public Radio, where McKay's weekly half-hour radio series, "Stories on the Wind," airs at 9 p.m. Sundays on KHPR (88.1) and at 7:30 p.m. Mondays on KIPO (89.3) on the FM dial. McKay had been battling prostate cancer for about two years. At the time of his death, he was putting the finishing touches on a series of biographical reflections, titled "Journey Without a Map," taping a segment as recently as two weeks ago from his sickbed. McKay was born June 19, 1932, in Manhattan. His full name was George Cadogan Gardner McKay and he lived in Manhattan, Paris, Ireland, Brazil, Egypt, Venezuela, the West Indies, Connecticut and Kentucky, before settling in the Islands about 25 years ago. To early television fans, McKay was Capt. Adam Troy, skipper of a schooner named Tiki that frequented the South Pacific in search of cargo, passengers and challenges on "Adventures in Paradise," which was televised on ABC from October 1959 to April 1962. That TV role would mirror his later life somewhat, since McKay was a seasoned sailor and skipper who never lived far from an ocean and also welcomed adventure and challenges to spice up his life. His acting career included 100 films for TV, between 1960 and 1963, and his passion for theatrics and literature enabled him to plunge into a career as a novelist ("Toyer," "The Last American," "Trompe L'Oeil"), and a playwright ("Toyer," "Masters of the Sea," "This Fortunate Island"). He also was a drama critic and theater editor for the Los Angeles Herald Examiner from 1977 to 1982, and taught at the University of California at Los Angeles and other colleges before moving to Hawai'i. He also taught a playwriting class at the University of Hawai'i-Manoa and was an artist of large oil paintings. "And he did some pretty good radio programs, too," Titterton said. "Besides being an actor, author and playwright, he was a raconteur, a tamer of wild animals and a perfect gentleman." McKay raised and lived with dogs, Nubian goats, hens, roosters, African lions, cheetahs, cats, cougars and other species of wildlife. "He fought (his cancer) till the end, with his wife, Madeleine, at his side, and he continued to write, as if 'Journey Without a Map' would be his last work, hanging on to finish it," Titterton said. "And it's beautiful writing." Although McKay spent much time in the Islands, he and his wife maintained a Los Angeles home, too. When he was able to, McKay could often be seen kayaking between Koko Head and Diamond Head, one of his favorite morning rituals. Besides his wife, survivors include a brother, Hugh Dean McKay; a

Kimo McVay left legacy of bravura. "Services at the Outrigger Canoe Club, with scattering of the ashes at sea. A big party. But I won't have the hats, the T-shirts, the party favors he did." She's still making decisions. McVay's grand style was recalled by his peers yesterday, with many speaking of his extravagances and hyperbole, as well as remembering a heart that was as big as his stunts, a personality as colorful as the performers he represented. "He was a dear friend and a wonderful person," said Tom Moffatt, a fellow entrepreneur. "He was an innovator, a one-of-a-kind. He had a special sense. He could always spot a winner: Don Ho. Tavana. John Rowles. The Beamers. John Hirokawa. And he could do more with \$5 in promotion than an ad agency could with \$50,000. He was truly remarkable. And no one could say no to him." Said Keola Beamer, a former client: "In addition to his competent and extremely valuable skills as a manager and promoter, Kimo McVay had a bountiful joy for living that he shared with all those who came into his life. We had so many good times together, so many madcap adventures that it will be hard to imagine the music business as being as much fun without him." "He easily was Hawai'i's top promoter," said Henry Ayau, who was a manager at the old Duke Kahanamoku's in the International Market Place, when McVay ran the club and launched Don Ho's national and international career. "He loved the business, the ambition to create popular entertainment. . . . He shall be missed." Comedian Andy Bumatai, who also hired McVay as his manager, likened him to the late Col. Tom Parker, the booster behind Elvis Presley's career. "I'm not sure any one of us would have gotten any attention without him making noise," Bumatai said. "He invented spin — before they gave it a name — and a little bit of Hawai'i dies with his passing." McVay had several aliases — "Knuckles McVay," when he manned the keyboards in St. Patrick's Day celebrations at the old Columbia Inn on Kapi'olani Boulevard, and the "Baron of Waikiki," when he briefly operated a lounge at the Reef Hotel. He was an old-school publicity wizard who put a buzz on any activity he engineered. His heyday was the Hawai'i of the 1960s and '70s, when he operated Duke Kahanamoku's nightclub. Folks lined up to applaud and cheer an upstart young Hawaiian talent named Don Ho,

backed by The Aliis, amid a celebrity clientele hoisting mai tai glasses emblazoned with "Suck 'em Up," which became collector's items and take-home souvenirs. Although he often quarreled with his clients, he succeeded in putting them on the map. He became obsolete when showrooms started to close, but he downsized accordingly, working with smaller acts and even taking on kickboxer Denis Alexio for a while. McVay had a keen eye and a sharp ear for discovering talent. Early in his management career, he saw the potential in then-Punahou School student Robin Luke, who had written and recorded a song about his little sister, titled "Susie Darlin'." McVay got local deejays and TV stations to air the song and expose the tune, and "Susie Darlin'" became a Top 10 hit nationally and gave Luke — and Hawai'i — 15 minutes of fame. McVay was born in Washington, D.C., on Sept. 16, 1927, and was the son of Kinau Wilder, a grand dame of Island theater and a prominent figure in Island society, and the controversial Capt. Charles Butler McVay III, the commanding officer of the USS Indianapolis, which in 1945 was hit by a Japanese torpedo and sank 600 miles southwest of Guam. Only 316 of the Indy's crew of 1,196 survived in shark-infested waters and Capt. McVay was found guilty of negligence, ultimately committing suicide. Kimo McVay's lifelong efforts to clear the name of his father finally ended last year, when the commander was cleared of guilt through congressional action, 55 years after the sinking and huge loss of lives. Besides Betsy, his wife of 45 years who was a well-known Island actress several decades ago, McVay is survived by two daughters, Lindsay Roberson of Honolulu and Melissa Mateo of Hacienda Heights, Calif; five grandchildren, Kim, Judd, Robin and Ryan Mateo, and Ashley Kinau Roberson; and a brother, Charles Butler McVay IV. Charles Andrew McWayne Jr., scion of a kamaaina family and former president and vice president of McWayne Marine Supply, one of Hawaii's oldest businesses, holds a special place in boating circles: He and his father actively organized and spearheaded the TransPacific Yacht Race. McWayne died Jan. 21, 2001 in Honolulu at age 80. His father, the late Charles Andrew McWayne Sr., was chairman of the race in 1928 and served as timer, starter and judge in later TransPacific races. Father and son revived the event in 1953. In World War II, the younger McWayne served with the Army's 42nd Rescue Squadron for three years after the Pearl Harbor attack. His education included Punahou from 1927 to 1939 and later Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pa., and the University of Oregon. McWayne Marine Supply, known earlier by another name, opened in 1823 at Honolulu Harbor, supplying goods to whaling vessels. James Robinson, McWayne's great-grandfather and a ship's carpenter, founded the firm. McWayne's ancestor Robinson had been shipwrecked on a reef about 1,200 miles west of Honolulu. He made his way here with other shipwrecked sailors in a boat they built from the wreckage. The boat was sold and Robinson opened the ship supply store with his share. The family boating supply firm

eventually moved to Kewalo Basin in 1950. The company later was sold to Finance Factors, then Amfac Inc. before its purchase by Servco Pacific in 1984. With the business closing, its structure was demolished in 1994 to make way for a state waterfront improvement project. McWayne belonged to the Pacific Club, Outrigger Canoe Club, Bishop Museum Association and Hawaii Historical Society. He is survived by wife Kathleen; daughter Ann Kathleen McWayne Kennedy; son Allen Charles McWayne, and three grandchildren. Services were private.

Ray Mews - award-winning photographer, dies at 62. Veteran KGMB television cameraman Ray Mews -- winner of national awards for a homecoming photo of a one-legged Vietnam veteran embracing his wife as the Marine's crutch fell by his side -- died Tuesday Jan 2, 2001 at home. He was 62. His death resulted from heart failure. As a 28-year-old photographer with the newspaper Sioux Falls (S.D.) Argus Leader, Mews took the famous picture Aug. 13, 1966. The still photo brought him a Sigma Delta Chi award on April 13, 1967. "Home from Vietnam" was its tag. The Marine, Lance Cpl. Perron Shinneman, was the last one off a plane that landed at Joe Foss Field, the Sioux Falls airport. The Marine's wife ran to meet him. Mews ran behind

her and snapped the photo as they embraced. Besides the Sigma Delta Chi Distinguished Service Award, the picture won a 1967 National Headliners Award, six other national awards and also appeared in numerous photo collections. Mews was born in Lakefield, Minn. He began his camera career in high school and entered the Army in 1957. Assigned to the Hawaiian Armed Services Police, he took pictures for investigations. After three years with the Sioux Falls Argus Leader, he left the paper shortly after taking the prize-winning picture and returned to Hawaii. He joined KGMB-TV in 1966 and stayed with it 30 years, retiring in late September 1996 after a heart attack. "For a lot of that time, he was the overnight guy," said longtime KGMB colleague Terry Hunter. "He was known as 'Hard News Mews.' "

On Feb. 24, 1989, Mews was first at the airport after United Airlines Flight 811 landed after a door blew out of the fuselage, causing nine deaths. Mews shot the only close-up video of the wreckage. "He was out on the tarmac before they closed it all off, and no one else got to it," Hunter recalled. It was the day's top national story, and CBS played it big. Network management later called KGMB with congratulations. Mews is survived by his wife, Theresa; four sons and two daughters.

May Arstad Neal Moir, who shared her secrets on growing and arranging flowers with thousands of Hawai'i gardeners, died Friday Sep 7, 2001. She was 93. her garden in Nu'uuanu Valley was known to horticulturists around the world. She introduced many tropical plants to Hawai'i, bred dozens of new orchid varieties, inspired many professional landscapers and wrote several books, including the classic "The Garden Watcher," a down-home volume that documented a year's changes in her

own backyard, called "Lipolani," "tropical heaven." For nearly 50 years, Moir also designed the weekly floral arrangements that decorate the Honolulu Academy of Arts. "She was an excellent gardener, way above normal in technical and aesthetic skills," said landscape architect Leland Miyano. "She was always willing to help others. She always shared her time and plants with anyone who was interested." After graduating from Punahou School, May Arstad married Charles M. Neal, with whom she had a daughter, Peggy. The Neals lived in Manoa, where she tended a large garden and began a business, making and selling jams and jellies in gift packages made of lauhala she wove herself. She later became a partner in her husband's real estate business. After Neal's death, she married agronomist W.W. Goodale Moir in 1949, and the two, both orchid enthusiasts and avid gardeners, began transforming the undeveloped grassy landscape around their Nu'uuanu home into a tropical garden. She was a pioneer in landscaping with bromeliads and succulents. On vacations, Moir and her husband collected and brought home exotic orchids and plants from Asia, Central America, Madagascar and Australia. Among many successes, she's credited with introducing the popular giant yellow heliconia to Hawai'i. A dendrobium orchid, May Neal, is named for her, said landscape architect Ted Green. "She helped put Hawai'i on horticulture map," Miyano said. "A lot of people who came through Hawai'i stopped to visit. Some of the best gardeners and landscape professionals always used her as a standard of how to put together a garden." Moir worked regularly in her garden, which was featured in many magazines and coffee table books around the world, until she fell about a year ago. "She called herself a dirt gardener," Miyano said. "She was definitely a hands-on type." A May Moir memorial garden is planned for Foster Botanical Garden, which benefited over the years from May's advice and donations. Helen Poindexter Morgan, daughter of the eighth governor of the territory of Hawai'i, died at her home in Honolulu last month, Feb 2001 at age 99. Morgan was born in Montana in 1902 to Joseph B. Poindexter, a lawyer who would impress both the Wilson and Roosevelt administrations, and to Margaret Conger Poindexter, who

died in 1918, when her daughter was 16. Morgan moved to Hawai'i with her family in 1917, when President Wilson appointed her father judge of the U.S. District Court. Poindexter held that position until 1924. Morgan attended Punahou, but graduated from a high school in Long Beach. After college, she studied music in Paris under Nadia Boulanger, a noted teacher of the time. In 1934, President Franklin Roosevelt appointed Poindexter governor. Poindexter had not remarried, and the duties of the first lady fell upon his daughter, then 32. She said she didn't care for formal receptions and belonged to no clubs. She did, however, love to dance. "I guess it is my one vice," she said. Poindexter's second term as governor was cut short when Japanese planes bombed Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. Morgan traveled extensively during the years that followed, until 1953, when she married English mining engineer Clifford Morgan. Her husband died in 1962, killed by a bull on his farm in Devon, and Morgan moved to Connecticut. She inherited a friend's apartment on Wilder Avenue in 1989, and moved here in that year. Morgan continued to visit the Mainland until well into her 90s, said her niece, Leslie Poindexter. She made frequent contributions to the humane society. She also continued to play the piano. "Two weeks before she died, she went to the piano and played," Poindexter said. The family will hold a memorial service in Connecticut in May.
