Louis Pavao, 83, known to many Hilo residents as "Mr. Christmas" for his holiday light displays, was buried yesterday April 27, 2001 at Hawai'i Veterans Cemetery. Pavao began creating his Christmas displays at the family's Kaumana Drive home as a memorial to his only son, Randy, who died in 1966 at age 19 in an automobile accident while at college in New Mexico. The display at first featured simple luminaries — lighted candles placed in paper bags filled with sand. But with Hilo's rain, the candles later were placed into protective jars. The collection grew each year as more lights and religious and secular symbols were added. The Pavaos' house became the scene of traffic jams as thousands made their annual Christmas pilgrimage to see the display. Kenneth D. Perkins, minister and historian, dead at 92. He was an itinerant preacher who traveled to churches around the Islands to deliver Sunday sermons. He was a noted historian who helped write the history of St. Andrew's Cathedral. He was a renaissance man who read a book a day, but never before he'd completed a daily crossword puzzle without a dictionary. Before his first retirement in 1962, the Rev. Kenneth D. Perkins was a clergyman and Navy chaplain who had preached to Presidents Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry Truman, survived a Japanese destroyer attack on Midway Island on Dec. 7, 1941, and, at age 28, circled the globe before spending eight months studying at the London School of Economics. Although Perkins, who died of a heart attack on Jan. 23 at Pohai Nani Retirement Home, was not a familiar figure to many in Hawai'i, he was well known to Hawai'i Episcopalians. "He had an absolutely perfect last day on Monday the 22nd," said his niece, Sigrid Southworth. "He went up to Tripler and the doctors said he looked fine. He and his wife, Ruth, had lunch there, and later he had a visit from a retired bishop

and friend from San Diego, and they had a gala Chinese New Year's party for dinner. "The next morning, he was dressed for breakfast and collapsed over his desk."

Perkins was born on Aug. 11, 1908, at Himrod, N.Y., and, in 1932, graduated from the Berkeley Divinity School at Yale University. After he arrived in Hawai'i in 1933, he was ordained at St. Andrew's Cathedral by Bishop S.H. Littell. Perkins taught at Iolani School, which at the time was on the banks of Nu'uaniu Stream, and later served as an assistant under Dean William Alt and conducted weekly chapel services at St. Andrew's Priory. From 1939 to 1941, he was the vicar of Holy Apostles Church in Hilo, Hawai'i.

In October 1940, Perkins was a guest preacher at St. Thomas Protestant Episcopal Church in Washington, D.C., which was attended by President Roosevelt and his family.

In 1941, he became a Navy chaplain and was stationed on Midway Island. In 1945 Perkins was the chaplain aboard the USS Augusta, which carried President Truman to the Potsdam conference on postwar Germany. Perkins established a reputation as a leading church historian in Hawai'i. Rianna Williams, author of the history of St. Andrew's Cathedral, said: "He had a detailed knowledge of the Episcopal Church and the cathedral itself that nobody else had." Perkins is survived by his wife of 51 years, Ruth Kirkpatrick Perkins; a sister, Mildred Louise Schmidt of Columbus, Ohio; and a nephew, Luther Calvin Perkins of Hammondsport, N.Y. CLAUDE BERNARD "PHIL" PHILLIPS - Claude Bernard Phillips -- who earned the Silver Star for shooting down a Japanese plane on Dec. 7, 1941 -- had a hard time seeing himself as a hero. But his actions during the war spoke otherwise, and Phillips received numerous awards, including the Distinguished Flying Cross and Presidential Unit Citation. His "extraordinary heroism" also earned him a Distinguished Service Cross for his actions on July 31, 1942. As a bombardier on a reconnaissance and photographic mission, Phillips helped man guns and fend off an attack by enemy aircraft near Wake Island. Phillips died Aug. 31, 2001 at Wahiawa General Hospital. He was 85. Born in Oneida, Tenn., in 1916, Phillips came to Hawaii in 1937 as a private in the Army Air Corps. He rose to the rank of major before retiring from the Air Force 27 years later in 1964. Phillips flew 84 combat missions during the war in the South Pacific. "I'm still in shock of being thought of as a hero," Phillips told a reporter at his 1997 induction into the Gallery of Heroes at the U.S. Army Museum of Hawaii. "It makes me feel very honored." On Dec. 7, 1941, the day that started it all, Phillips is credited with shooting down an enemy plane over then-Hickam Air Field. "He grabbed a machine gun off a B-17 bomber that was damaged in the attack and used the machine gun to shoot down an enemy aircraft," said Maj. Stephen Clutter, Hickam Air Force Base spokesman. "We certainly count him as one of our heroes here at Hickam." Sylvia, Phillips' wife, said he was a humble man. He would "tell the same story every time, he never embellished it," she said. "But he was proud of his (citations) and proud of serving his country." He is also survived by son Robert Phillips of Louisiana; daughter Geraldine Yoder of Ohio; eight grandchildren; several great-grandchildren; and sisters Selma McGibney of Ohio, Lucille Wright of Georgia and Ottie Sexton, Delphia Baldwin and Edna Heth of Tennessee. John David Provoo, also known as **NICHIJO SHAKA**, 84, of Hilo, Hawai'i, died Aug. 28, 2001. After World War II, Army Sgt. John David Provoo faced another yearslong, but bloodless, battle for freedom. Accusing Provoo of "giving comfort" to his Japanese captors after Corregidor fell in 1942, the government spent \$1 million prosecuting his case. In 1953, a jury found him guilty of four acts of treason, including contributing to the death of an American officer. He was sentenced to life in prison; the U.S. Supreme Court overturned his conviction, saying he was denied his constitutional right to a speedy trial. Provoo, who also was known as Nichijo Shaka, died Aug. 28 at Hilo Medical Center. He was 84. In 1968, Provoo told a Honolulu Star-Bulletin reporter that life after the trial "was like towing a shipwreck after you." "It was extremely difficult living with it and there was no living without it," said Provoo, then a 52-year-old ordained Buddhist priest in Nuuanu. Before the war Provoo worked at a federal bank in San Francisco, the city of his birth in 1917. He had a "literal adherence to Buddhist principle," after becoming interested in the religion as a teen, said his brother George Provoo of Los Alamitos, Calif. "I can remember as a child watching him stand at the kitchen sink fishing ants out of it with his finger so they wouldn't drown," he said. "He believed in the sanctity of all forms

of life." His brother didn't often talk about his legal battles, said George, who is John's sole surviving relative. "He seemed to want to put it behind him and get on with his life." During the trial, the defense admitted Provoo broadcast propaganda for the Japanese, but said he did so under duress. Testimony also revealed that a Japanese firing squad executed Capt. Burton Thomson after Provoo told them the captain was "uncooperative" and anti-Japanese. After the high court's ruling, Provoo studied Nichiren Buddhism in Japan. He came to Hawaii around 1966, he said, to fill a need for Buddhist teachers competent in English. Provoo led an independent Nichiren Buddhism sect on Oahu and later on the Big Island, said friend Richard Peterson. Provoo also set up the nonprofit Buddhist School of America. Peterson said Provoo enlisted in the service when the war broke out. He was honorably discharged from the Army in 1946 and was arrested in 1949 when he was discharged from a postwar enlistment. Peterson said his friend had a "magnetic personality" and could be "extremely brilliant at times but had some failings," including a fondness for alcohol. His life was "quite a spectrum," said Peterson, an emeritus professor at the University of Hawaii College of Business Administration. In the 1968 interview, Provoo told the Star-Bulletin: "I was disenchanted with the jury that convicted me of treason, but I never gave up faith in America. I never had any idea of changing my allegiance to my country." Provoo was inurned Oct. 8 at Hawaii Veterans Cemetery No. 2. [SB 27/10/2001]
