The Rev. Gyoko T. Saito, head of the Higashi Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i, died March 10 in Honolulu. He was 73. Saito was born in Kumamoto, Japan, on July 6, 1927. At age 17, he joined the Japan military academy and trained to become an army officer. With the surrender of Japan in 1945, Saito enrolled at the University of Kumamoto, majoring in electrical engineering. At the time, Saito said he had a profound sense of spiritual disillusionment because of his country's defeat in the war. In 1946, he was introduced to the writings of the Rev. Haya Akegarasu, head administrator of the Higashi Hongwanji in Kyoto, Japan. Saito later met Akegarasu and in 1950 Saito devoted his life to Buddhism. In 1954, he married Toshiko Yoshida and the couple had three children; son Shin, and daughters, Dawn and Maya. Saito moved to Chicago in 1956 to serve as assistant minister at the Buddhist Temple of Chicago. He said his sole purpose in coming to America was to introduce the teachings of the Rev. Akegarasu. Saito served in Chicago for 25 years and was head minister from 1966 to 1981. From 1981 to 1984, he served at the Higashi Hongwanji Los Angeles Betsuin. In 1993, he retired, but continued to serve as a minister at the Los Angeles Betsuin. Last year, Saito moved to Honolulu to become rinban, or head, of the Higashi Hongwanji Mission of Hawai'i. Saito suffered congestive heart failure late last year and was hospitalized for an aneurysm last month. He upset 18-year incumbent Ikuo Hisaoka for the council seat representing North and South Kohala. While serving a single term, Sameshima focused on tax reform and government spending. Wing Kong Chong of Waimea, a Republican who served on the old county Board of Supervisors and in the state House of Representatives, was a compatriot of Sameshima's in his property tax battles. He called Sameshima "a very dedicated person." "Although we may have disagreed in many things, we tried our best to be good elected officials, and he was one," Chong said. Adam A. "Bud" Smyser - In a journalism career spanning 55 years, Adam A. "Bud" Smyser was at the center of many of the great debates touching Hawaii, from the push for statehood, to the acceptance of nisei war veterans, to the issues of physician-assisted suicide and dying with dignity. During his career at the Star-Bulletin, Smyser was a reporter, city editor, managing editor, editor and editor of the editorial pages. After he retired in 1983, he continued to write his column "Hawaii's World" as a contributing editor. Smyser died at 4:25 a.m. today at Queen's Medical Center after a fall Saturday morning led to a brain hemorrhage. Honoring his wishes as an advocate of dying with dignity, Smyser's family chose to keep him off life-support systems when surgeons were unable to remove a blood clot from his brain. He was 80. "Fortunately for Bud, he did not need any physician assistance," said Dr. Norm Goldstein, who served with Smyser on a panel appointed by the governor on Living and Dying with Dignity. "He was just basically sleeping and that was the way it was supposed to be." Helen Chapin, author of "Shaping History, The Role of Newspapers in Hawaii, described Smyser as "pretty fearless." "Bud never really backed off of an argument or fight and he was usually on the right side," she said. She cites as an example his "epic struggles" with Frank Fasi, who during his 1970 campaign for Honolulu mayor, banned Smyser and the Star-Bulletin from his news conferences. Smyser won when he contested Fasi's actions in court. In 1988, Smyser was one of the

strongest voices on the Star-Bulletin's editorial board in its decision to endorse Fasi. "I loved the guy, I hated the guy, but I tell you when it comes down to the bottom line he was a good guy for the state of Hawaii and the people who live in it," Fasi said. Smyser took up many causes throughout his 55-year career, jumping into the statehood debate soon after arriving in Hawaii in 1946. He also fought to free Hansen's Disease patients from forced isolation, to keep Hawaii off daylight savings time, to rename Columbus Day Discoverer's Day, and to bring no-fault insurance to Hawaii in 1974. Long before the Star-Bulletin published "Broken Trust," Smyser began questioning the management and governance of Kamehameha Schools. A tireless advocate for openness in government, 30 years ago Smyser helped found the Honolulu Community Media Council, a watchdog group for Oahu media. Chapin, who also served on the council, said of Smyser, "he's always been a First Amendment rights kind of person." Ah Jook Ku, another media council founder, said she had been one of three Asians working at the Star-Bulletin when Smyser was hired. At a time when minorities had difficulty finding professional work, "he was the one always trying to promote good will and end racial discrimination," she said. Smyser was born in York, Pennsylvania on Dec. 18, 1920. He graduated from Pennsylvania State College (now University) with the Sigma Delta Chi award as Penn State's outstanding journalism graduate in 1941. After the attack on Pearl Harbor, Smyser enrolled in the Navy's V-7 officer training program and was called to active duty as an ensign in December 1942. Over the next three years, he participated in the invasions of Sicily, Saipan, Palau, Leyte, Lingayen Gulf and Okinawa, and in the post-war occupations of Korea and North China. In Jan. 1946, Smyser and his wife Betty moved to Hawaii. While Smyser made a name for himself at the Star-Bulletin, Betty worked on the television show "Conversations" for almost 25 years until she died of cancer in 1983. They had two children, Heidi Olivia and Avery Richard. In 1984, Smyser married a longtime friend of his and Betty's, Doris "Dee" Hetherington Prather. Smyser and Dee had met when they started working at the Star-Bulletin the same year. Always looking out for what was best for Hawaii, Smyser envisioned the Pacific state as a bridge to Asia and saw the development of Hawaii as a global marketplace. Recently, the Varsity Victory Volunteers, a group of nisei WWII veterans started a drive to have Smyser granted an honorary degree from the University of Hawaii. "We thought it was time that Bud was recognized for all that he does for Hawaii and its people," said Ted Tsukiyama, noting that the celebrated 100th battalion made Smyser an honorary member because of his support of nisei veterans. Gov. Ben Cayetano appointed Smyser to the Governor's Blue Ribbon Panel on Living and Dying with Dignity in

1997. Cayetano said, "for more than a half-century, Bud has been an outstanding citizen of our island community. "The high standards he set for himself as a journalist won him the respect and admiration of people from all walks of life. Bud loved Hawaii deeply and even in his golden years continued to be very involved in the difficult issues facing our state. Our prayers go to his wife Dee and the Smyser family in these very difficult days."

Irma Soong - Noted local historian Irma Tam Soong, known for documenting the history of the Chinese in Hawaii, died last week of pulmonary illness at the Arcadia Retirement Residence. She was 88. Raised in Chinatown, Soong knew nearly every merchant in the area, often speaking to them in Cantonese, a language she learned from her parents. "I know Chinatown, I lived here as a small child," she was once quoted as saying. "My grandfather owned a prosperous grocery store." Her sister, Pina Lee, remembers Soong as a very bright child who loved to read and later write poetry as a young woman. She was also a mother figure to her five siblings. "She was like a mother to us all," said Lee. "She was also very spiritual and intelligent." A distant relative of Chinese leader Sun Yat Sen, Soong devoted a large part of her life writing her experiences during World War II in China during the Japanese occupation. The biographical book titled "Chinese-American Refugee, a World War II Memoir," was published in 1984 and recounts a remarkable story. It begins with she being caught in Hong Kong with her 9-month-old son on the day the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor in 1941 and the difficulties encountered in reaching her husband's village, bordering Japanese-held territory. Her husband, whom she later divorced, was a photographer

for Chiang Kai-Shek's Central News Agency at the time. Soong's only son, Dr. Colin Soong, a physician in Carson City, Nev., remembers his mother as a vivacious, fun-loving woman who enjoyed eating healthy. "We would go to the farmers' market in Makiki and get soybeans and sweet potatoes for lunch," said Colin. But on Sundays she'd have no qualms about indulging in chocolate ice cream, he said. "She loved chocolate, and would say, 'That'll take care of my calories.' " Colin remembers his mother also being a "great" storyteller who enjoyed recounting the story about her flight from Hong Kong with him as a baby. Proceeds of her war memoir went to Mills College, where she received her master's degree in English, to the Community Church of Honolulu and the Hawaii Chinese History Center, of which she was founder and executive director. Soong retired from teaching English at Kaimuki High School in 1970, the same year the Hawaii Chinese History Foundation was established. "She did a lot of her most passionate activities her retirement," he said. In 1989, Soong co-authored with Wei-tun Lin "Five Hsing Chung Hui Men of Valor," a history of the revolutionary society founded in Hawaii by Sun. The book was printed as part of the 200th anniversary commemoration of the arrival of Chinese in Hawaii. In 1990, her article "Dr. Sun Yat Sen's Christian Schooling in Hawaii" appeared in the Hawaii Journal of History. Soong taught English at Hwa Nan Girls College in Foochow, Pomona College in Claremont, Calif., and Kaimuki High School. She is survived by a son, Dr. Colin Soong and his wife Nancy; grandchildren Tamara and Andrew; sisters Mrs. Pina Lee, Mrs. Fannie Ching, Mrs. J.C. Lee; and brothers James S.T. Tam and Edward S.T. Satguru Sivaya Subramuniyaswami, an American who became a spiritual leader for Hindus around the world, died Monday Nov 12, 2001. He was 74. He was the successor to the guru Yogaswami of Sri Lanka and was spiritual leader for 2.5 million Tamil people. He published the respected English-language newspaper Hinduism Today, which he founded in 1979, from his Saiva Siddhanta Church in Wailua Homesteads on Kaua'i. He designated as his successor Satguru Bodhinatha Veyanswami, 59, a 35-year disciple who will serve as the new guru of Subramuniyaswami's temple and monastery, the Kaua'i Aadheenam. The guru, known to followers and friends as Gurudeva, lived a quiet life, but was active in the community, helping Mayor Maryanne Kusaka promote anti-drug programs for youths and promoting the aloha spirit. "Gurudeva was such a gifted and inspired leader," Kusaka said. "He has done so much for our community, always behind the scenes, and he leaves a tremendous legacy of goodness and aloha for us all." He also worked with other faiths to promote peace and community. "He was a tremendous participant in the community and a force for world peace. We did Martin Luther King Day together. He came and spoke at St. Michael's," said the Rev. Jan Rudinoff, an Episcopalian. "He had a holy presence that I felt," Rudinoff said. Subramuniyaswami was born in Oakland, Calif., and studied dance in his early life, starring with the San Francisco Ballet at age 19. A year later, he abandoned his dance career and went to India and Sri Lanka to take spiritual training. He was given his name and was ordained by his mentor, Yogaswami, a Saivite Hindu guru. He formed the first Hindu temple in the United States on Sacramento Street in San Francisco in 1957, and after helping establish other centers on the Mainland, he moved in 1970 to Kaua'i to establish a monastery and temple. A continuing mission of his monastery is the completion of the massive San Marga Iraivan Temple, being built of Indian granite on the monastery grounds. Subramuniyaswami was named one of the five Hindu spiritual leaders outside India at the 1986 World Religious Parliament in New Delhi. In 2000, he was awarded the U Thant Peace Award, named for the former director general of the United Nations. Past winners included the Dalai Lama, Nelson Mandela, Mikhail Gorbachev, Pope John Paul II and Mother Teresa. He is the author of numerous religious books, among which the ones considered most important are his Siva trilogy: "Dancing with Siva," "Living with Siva" and "Merging with Siva."

"Subramuniaswami has done great work for Hinduism, and the recent reawakening of the Hindu mind carries his stamp," said Hindu writer Sita Ram Goel of India. He suffered from incurable intestinal cancer and died in the presence of 23 members of his monastic order, after a self-imposed 32-day fast. Among his notable achievements, Sumner served on the board of directors for the Hawaii Visitors Bureau from 1960-62; as president of the Bishop Museum Association from 1969-70; on the Kauikeolani Children's Hospital board of directors from 1973-76; on the American Cancer Society national board of directors from 1977-82; on the St. Andrew's Priory board from 1984-86; and Le Jardin Academy's board of trustees from 1990-2000. He was chairman of the Le Jardin board from 1992-96 and was instrumental in planning and fund-raising for the new Windward Oahu high school campus, according to his son. Sumner also received the cancer society's Distinguished Service Award in 1974. Richard Carpenter "Ike" Sutton. He had already placed his regular 4th of July advertisement, calling on the people of Hawai'i to remember the soldiers and sailors who died at Pearl Harbor. And for many malihini, those little patriotic ads in the newspaper every holiday were what they knew of Richard Carpenter "Ike" Sutton, who died Saturday at St. Francis Hospice at the age of 86. But those who met him never forgot the politician who brought political sign-waving to Hawai'i and made the double red carnation lei his trademark. He was a Pearl Harbor survivor who went on to serve on the staff of Adm. Chester Nimitz in World War II and mustered out with the rank of lieutenant commander. Born in Honolulu on April 5, 1915, Sutton graduated from Punahou School. He earned a bachelor's degree at Stanford University and returned to Hawai'i to work for Hawaiian Electric Co. He served in the Marine Corps in 1937-38 and in the U.S. Naval Reserve on active duty from 1940 to 1946. After the war, Sutton returned to Stanford for his law degree and began practicing law in Hawai'i in 1950. He owned the Malihini Hotel in Waikiki and was active in real estate as well. Sutton was the Republican Party's candidate for Congress in 1962 and 1964, a delegate to the state Constitutional Convention in 1968 and was appointed a federal judge for Wake Island by President Nixon. He served in the state House, representing Nu'uuanu from 1974 to 1980 and was a candidate for other offices, most
