Clarence Tenki Taba, a longtime banker and World War II veteran, died last Thursday July 19, 2001 in Honolulu. He was 79. Taba was born April 7, 1922, in Lahaina, Maui, as the fifth of 13 children. During the war, he was awarded two Bronze Stars and a Silver Star for courage in combat, and a Purple Heart with two Oak Leaf Clusters for injuries in three battles. He was a first sergeant in the Army. He worked with banks until retiring in 1997, first as a senior bank examiner for the Territory of Hawai'i and later in management positions with private banks such as City Bank and Bank of Hawai'i. He then served the Hawai'i Bankers Association for 22 years, helping to write bank legislation. His work with banks helped him establish a savings and loan program for the 442nd Veterans Club, where he was treasurer, vice president and president. Taba was also a founding member of the Hawai'i Department of Disabled American Veterans and treasurer at Manoa Valley Church for 27 years until he was forced to retire because of heart problems. "He didn't feel like, 'I'm doing all this volunteer work for free,' it was something he was proud of," said his wife, Nancy Nobuko Taba. His wife remembers him as someone always full of energy and who enjoyed to travel. Taba is also survived by brothers Victor and Masa; sisters Tsuruko Taba, Adele Onaga, Lurline Matsumoto, Yoshiko Taba and Kimiko Taba;

Sakae Takahashi, retired attorney, World War II veteran and former territorial treasurer and state senator, died Monday April 16, 2001 in Honolulu. He was 81. Takahashi was born in the tiny plantation town of Makaweli, Kaua'i, on Dec. 8, 1919. He graduated from Waimea High School in 1937 and was a member of the University of Hawai'i ROTC. He entered the Army in 1941 and was an original member of the

100th Infantry Battalion, the forerunner of what later became the famous 442nd Regimental Combat Team. Takahashi rose from the rank of 1st lieutenant to captain of Company B. The 100th fought in some of the bloodiest operations in Italy and France and was nicknamed the "Purple Heart Battalion." The battalion received three Presidential Unit Citations, the highest honor for an individual unit. Takahashi himself received the Combat Infantry Badge, Bronze Star and Purple Heart. U.S. Sen. Daniel Inouye, a member of the 442nd, said Takahashi was a "great American." When Takahashi was married in 1946, Inouye was Takahashi's best man. "He was a leader in the executive branch, at the Legislature, on the battlefield and in the boardroom," Inouye said. "What I admired most, however, was that he was a good husband and father." Stanley Akita, president of Club 100, said Takahashi was the battalion's best commander, a "brilliant tactician, outmaneuvering the enemies. He is one of the most well-liked members of the Club 100, always willing to help." After the war, Takahashi earned a law degree from Rutgers University and returned to Hawai'i in 1948 to begin his practice. Two years later, Takahashi began his political career when he was elected to the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of Honolulu. In 1951, Takahashi became the first American of Japanese ancestry to serve on the territorial government cabinet when he was appointed treasurer by Gov. Oren Long. In 1954, Takahashi was elected to the territorial Senate and joined other nisei veterans and business leaders in rejuvenating Hawai'i's Democratic Party. He was elected to the first state Senate in 1959 and served for 20 years. [Adv 18/4/2001]

Takahashi also was an astute business man and was one of the founders of Central Pacific Bank in 1954. He served on numerous boards, including Hawaiian Airlines, Investors Equity Life Insurance Co., and the Hawaii Islanders minor league baseball team.

Longtime friend Shurei Hirozawa said Takahashi showed leadership skills from their days on the Kaua'i plantation. "Quiet and determined, Sakae was a man of conviction," Hirozawa said. "We have lost a great humanitarian." In 1993, Takahashi was honored by the Japanese government with the Order of the Rising Sun for helping establish Central Pacific Bank and for his work as director of the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawai'i. He retired as a director of the bank and chairman of the parent company CPB Inc. in 1990.

John Paul Thomas of Kona, who came to Hawai'i in 1965 to teach art for a year and stayed for the rest of his life, died Tuesday at Tripler Army Medical Center. He was 74. The Alabama-born painter's works were displayed at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York, the Smithsonian in Washington, San Francisco's Legion of Honor and museums from Seattle and Los Angeles to Rome and Bucharest. Since 1970, he worked from his home and studio in Kona where he collaborated with noted composer and longtime companion Jerre Tanner. Thomas started his art career depicting abstract human forms, but later switched to watercolor studies of flowers. When he came to the Big Island in 1965 to teach at Hilo College, now the University of Hawai'i-Hilo, the artist was captivated by Hawai'i's colors, intense light and mystique. In a 1985 interview, Thomas said he was unable to get the Islands out of his creative system. He painted watercolors, mostly of orchids, and large oil paintings of tropical foliage using bold colors. His orchid watercolors were reproduced on notecards and posters; his "Boy With Goldfish" series inspired a musical composition by Tanner in 1976 that was later recorded by the London Symphony Orchestra. The following year, Thomas received a National Endowment for the Arts grant to create sets and costumes for "Ka Lei No Kane," the first Hawaiian opera ever produced. He was commissioned by the State Foundation of Culture and the Arts to produce an oil painting of Washington Place in celebration of the 150th anniversary of the governor's mansion and former home of Hawaiian royalty. Hilo artist Kay Yokoyama considers

Thomas her mentor. He told her "don't be afraid of colors," she said yesterday. Her pastel palette became "much brighter" because of Thomas' strong influence, she said. Friends in Kona said Thomas had been ill for some time and was being treated for a chronic heart condition at Tripler before he died. Thomas was born Feb. 4, 1927, in Bessemer, Ala. After serving in the Navy during World War II, he used the GI Bill to obtain a master of arts degree from New York University. He also studied in Europe and taught at the Detroit Institute of Art, the University of Iowa at Iowa City, San Francisco State University, the University of Washington at Seattle and other colleges. Myron "Pinky" Thompson - [Former Bishop Estate trustee Myron "Pinky" Thompson, a leader in the native Hawaiian community for more than three decades, died last night Dec 25, 2001 in the Queen's Medical Center after a long battle with cancer. He was 77. Family spokeswoman Paula Akana said that Thompson will be remembered for his work in health, education, social services and preserving Hawaiian culture. In 1975, Thompson created a statewide healthcare system for native Hawaiians and helped start Alu Like, Inc., to obtain federal funding for native Hawaiians in job training, health, housing, education and native rights. Alu Like co-founder Winona Ellis Rubin said more than 100,000 Hawaiians have benefited from the services. "Pinky was an extraordinary individual whose intent was to help improve conditions for all people and especially native Hawaiians and he made a tremendous difference in his lifetime," Rubin said. Thompson also served as president of the Polynesian Voyaging Society and his son Nainoa was a master navigator on the voyaging canoe Hokulea. As a Bishop Estate trustee, Thompson was instrumental in developing early education programs and improving the Kamehameha Schools outreach programs in the Department of Education and the community. "It's](#)

a sad day," said Office of Hawaiian Affairs chairman Clayton Hee, who got to know Thompson in 1991, when both served on the board of a native Hawaiian culture and arts program. Hee said Thompson was one of the prime movers to establish federal legislation to continue native culture and arts for the people of Hawaii. Thompson's focus on early education programs through Kamehameha Schools was revolutionary for the time and left an enduring legacy, Hee said. "That's by far his biggest contribution, because it's a gift that will live on and will not only benefit that Hawaiian child but will benefit society," said Hee, a former teacher. "He was the ultimate social worker. He knew that children needed help during those very early years," said Beadie Dawson, Thompson's public information officer when he was executive director of the state Department of Social Services and Housing in the early 1970s. Thompson earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Colby College in Maine and his master's degree in social work from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. "He was very open, very honest and had a way of dealing with people where this honesty always shone through," Dawson said. "He was never afraid to admit mistakes the state had made or personnel had made. He was totally up front. (Reporters) knew they could always go to him and get straight stories." Former Gov. George Ariyoshi remembered Thompson as a trusted administrator for Gov. John A. Burns in the late 1960s. Burns "was always going to Pinky to ask about Hawaiian issues and community needs," Ariyoshi said. From 1962 to 1967, Thompson was executive director of the Queen Liliuokalani Trust. He also worked as director of the Salvation Army Child Welfare Service and served as the first chairman of the State Land Use Commission. Dawson said she had met Thompson when they were both at Punahou School. "He was a big football star and I was a lowly little school kid." Long-time friend Roy Benham said he had known Thompson practically all his life -- through Kamehameha Schools, canoe paddling and the Polynesian Voyaging Society. As immediate past president of the Kamehameha Schools Alumni Association, Thompson was responsible for many of the federal grants Kamehameha received, because of his willingness to travel to Washington to work with Congress, Benham said. The two had also paddled together, Benham said, although he refused to join Thompson in the "makule" crew for older paddlers. "Grandpas and everyone would paddle with that one. He always looked good in the makule crew," Benham said. As Gov. Ben Cayetano reflected recently on Hawaii's political history, he cited Thompson as one those toughened by war who made a difference in the islands. During the invasion of Normandy, Thompson was shot in the head by a German sniper and was put with the wounded expected to die while medics

concentrated on those they fel they could save, Cayetano said. A group of Thompson's friends insisted, however, that doctors try to save him. "And you know, he survived and when he came back, he helped to build a better Hawaii," Cayetano said. Thompson is survived by wife Laura Thompson, daughter Lita, sons Myron and Nainoa, sister Kamaoli Miyamoto and brother Henry. Services are pending. [SB 26/12/2001]

The Rev. Edward Todd fulfilled one of his last wishes in March by witnessing the groundbreaking for a \$2.5 million building program at Doris Todd Memorial Christian School in Pai'a, a school he founded with his late wife nearly 50 years ago. Todd, 89, died Saturday at his home in Kihei. He devoted his life to missionary work on Maui and elsewhere in the Pacific. Leta Carpenter, vice principal at the memorial school in Pai'a, said Todd will be remembered for "his friendliness toward people and

his love of the Lord." Todd was born March 28, 1912, in Belfast, Northern Ireland, and later moved to Canada and then Pennsylvania, where he met his first wife. The couple served as missionaries in the Philippines until forced to leave because of Doris Todd's failing health. Wishing to continue mission work with the Filipino community, they decided to move to Maui in 1954, Carpenter said. The Todds saw a need for more Christian education on Maui and opened a preschool in their home. A few years later their Pa'ia Baptist School moved to a bigger site and added grade levels. The name was changed to Doris Todd Memorial Christian School after Doris Todd's death in 1965. Today, the school accepts students from preschool through Grade 8 and has an enrollment of 143. Edward Todd also founded Ha'iku Bible Church in the late 1950s and Paipala Church and started Maui Christian Book Shop, which now operates in Kahului. With his second wife, Mabel Sharples, a teacher at the school, Todd moved to New Zealand in 1987. He returned to Maui in 1997 and retired a couple of years ago. Todd served in the U.S. Army during World War II . Rev. Giko Yoshihiro Tsuge - A funeral will be held at 5 p.m. tomorrow for the Rev. Giko Yoshihiro Tsuge, the retired chief minister of the Big Island's largest Buddhist church. Tsuge, 92, died July 6 in Hilo. Tsuge was one of the first bilingual Buddhist ministers to serve in the Islands. His ability to speak Japanese and English helped Buddhism flourish in Hilo, said retired banker Albert Nishimura, a senior leader of the 1,100-family Hilo Betsuin of the Honpa Hongwanji. "Rev. Tsuge was among the first to give a decent sermon in English," Nishimura said. Tsuge was born in 1908 in Shimane, Japan, and came to Hawai'i in the 1930s to minister first at Kona Hongwanji Mission in Kealakekua, then at Honoka'a Hongwanji Mission. He was later transferred to Hilo Hongwanji Mission where he served for 25 years before retiring in

1974. That mission is now known as the Hilo Betsuin. He also helped bring about construction of the \$3.6 million Sanga Hall next door to the Hilo temple on Kilauea Avenue.
