George Chew Kai Young, respected leader in the Chinese Community of Honolulu, died Oct. 31, 2001. Young was 76 years old. He will be remembered for his work at the Manoa Chinese Cemetery, which he transformed from a weedy, unkempt place to beautiful garden spot, and for reviving interest in Ching Ming, a ceremony to honor departed ancestors. Under Young's guidance, Ching Ming became a major cultural event in Honolulu. Young, long time president of the Lin Yee Chung Association, was named Chinese Citizen of the Year for 1996 for his volunteer work in the cemetery. During his 13-year tenure the grounds were landscaped, ornate gates were erected and buildings repainted. Young often mowed the grounds himself. His knowledge of Chinese culture and efforts to promote understanding of it won him the designation of "Living Treasure" from the Chinese Youth of Hawai'i. He was named Man of the Year by the Chinatown Merchants in 1996. In 1999, he was appointed by Mayor Jeremy Harris to the City & County Civil Service Commission and by Gov. Ben Cayetano to the state's Civil Service Commission on Repricing. Last year, he was named Model Chinese Father of the Year by the United Chinese Society. Young retired from the law enforcement division of the state Labor Department and was a retired deputy sheriff. He taught for 40 years at the Department of Education's Adult Community Program and was a frequent guest lecturer at various functions. He served as president of more than half a dozen charitable organizations. A 1944 graduate of St. Louis High School, Young was the son of prominent herbalist, Kee Nam Young. His father taught him the importance of charity and service to the community, and Young learned his lessons well. "He was giving all the time," said Bob Krauss, an Advertiser journalist and longtime friend of Young. "His life was a contribution. I don't know how he ever made any money, he gave so much." Young's brother, James C.M. Young, said Young was a dedicated family man who spoke of his family members as the wind beneath his wings. In addition to his brother James, George Young is survived by his wife of 52 years, Jeanette M.H.; three sons, Wesley, Clayton and Curtis; four granddaughters and three grandsons. Services will be held Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Community Church of Honolulu. The Rev. Dr. Wally Fukunaga will preside, assisted by Rev. Mark Lee. George C.K. Young, known best for restoring the Manoa Chinese Cemetery, died Wednesday Oct 31, 2001 at the Queen's Medical Center of a lung disease. He was 76. The former state labor law inspector received several awards for outstanding achievements from the Chinese community, but "the cemetery was his baby," said brother James C.M. Young. George was president of the Lin Yee Chung Association, which oversees the cemetery, for the past 13 years and one of its trustees, he said. James, a retired architect who helped with the restoration, said his brother will be the first to be buried in the lower section next to a newly erected line of 12 white marble animals of the Chinese zodiac. Erecting the statues along the roadway was the latest of his projects to improve the historic cemetery. "They were erected one week before he died, so he didn't get to see it," but after he is buried Saturday he will get to look at them all the time, James said. The brothers were charged with doing charity work for the cemetery by their father, Nee Nam Young, a doctor and herbalist. Filial piety, or respect for one's ancestors, was a philosophy George lived and passed onto his children and other young people, according to James. George often labored into the evening to keep the cemetery tidy even though there was a groundskeeper, and he personally planted the red ti leaves there, James said. Wesley K.K. Young, his son, said he will always remember his father as "a visionary, who would paint a picture so we could achieve our best or even higher." He would always encourage his children to take it to the next level, and he was a good father who had a great sense of humor and gave his sons a lot of attention, Wesley said. Young, a 1944 graduate of St. Louis School, was named Model Chinese Father of the Year in 2000 and Outstanding Senior Volunteer in 2001. In 1996 he was Outstanding Chinese Citizen of the Year and held several other honorary titles. Young held chairman positions in six Chinese societies and conducted many lectures on culture and traditions. On a professional level, he was an inspector for the state Department of Labor for some 30 years, retiring in 1983. In 1999, he was appointed as a city Civil Service commissioner, and state Civil Service commissioner on repricing, holding these positions until his death. Young also taught accounting at Kaimuki Adult Education the past 40 years and was a sergeant in the U.S. Army. He is also survived by his wife, Jeanette; sons Clayton K.W. and Curtis K.C.; and seven grandchildren. Wah Duck Young, who saved the legendary Chung Shan School, also known as the Sun Yat Sen Chinese Language School, died April 13, 2001 of cancer. He was 87. When the city demolished the pioneer school for the Kukui redevelopment project in the 1960s, Young moved the classes above his feed store on Fort Street. The feed store became a center of agitation to preserve Chinatown. He and his friends raised money to protect the rights of aged Chinese facing eviction, and influenced the course of development and cultural preservation in the district. "He was one of the founders of the Chinese Cultural Plaza, so that the school could go there and they couldn't tear it down again," said his nephew Danny Young. In 1962, Young opened the King's Garden Chinese restaurant in Kaimuki to put food on the table and to keep the school alive. He spearheaded a fund-raising campaign by the Buck Toy Benevolent Society to build a middle school in his ancestral village in Chungshan, China. The Youngs in Hawai'i donated \$80,000 toward an elementary school there. For years, Young worked 15 hours a day as principal of the Sun Yat Sen School, running the restaurant and promoting cultural activities. His father was a founder of the United Chinese Society of Hawaii. Both father and son were past presidents. Young was also director emeritus of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce. He was born Sept. 27, 1914, in China, where his father served as Chungsan magistrate for Sun Yat Sen. As a boy, kidnapers held him for ransom for six months. He said the experience taught him the importance of responsibility and education. Young came to Hawai'i and married in the 1930s. He and his wife, Grace, had one child who died in infancy.
