Seisuke "Sei" Serikaku was born on a Kahalu'u farm and rooted in the land that gave so much life. So when developers threatened the lifestyle of his family and neighbors in the 1970s, the Windward farmer became a warrior. "He didn't particularly like to lead, but when he spoke, he spoke with tremendous power. His words were like punches," said state Sen. Bob Nakata, a nephew of Serikaku's. Serikaku, a community leader and member of the Methodist church, died April 3, 2002. He was 77. Serikaku was one of dozens of farmers in Waiahole Valley who faced eviction in the mid-1970s. Developers had targeted the valley and neighboring Waiakane Valley for huge subdivisions and golf courses. In one of the most-recognized major land battles in Hawai'i since statehood, the community fought the urbanization of their rural neighborhoods. One of the leaders of the Waiahole-Waiakane Community Association was Serikaku. The group rallied support from throughout the island and held resistance drills to prepare for the eviction. Its motto, "The people united will never be defeated," could be heard throughout both valleys. In 1977, just days before the farmers were to be evicted, then-Gov. George Ariyoshi announced that

the state would buy the land for \$6 million and create an agricultural and residential subdivision. It was not until 1998, however, when the families finally received long-term leases from the state. Throughout the fight, Serikaku remained focused on what was most important to him: the farm and his church. Nakata, a Methodist pastor who also supported the farmers in the land dispute, said Serikaku identified himself with the prophets in the Old Testament. "(The prophets) tried to call the kings back to being righteous and serve the people rather than oppressing the people. You can see how that fits into the Waiahole-Waiakane struggle," said Nakata, D-23rd (Kane'ohe, Kahuku). "Every so often he would speak and it was most frequently to chastise people for not standing up and fighting for their own rights, or to really chastise those in power for not being righteous." Serikaku was born in Kahalu'u and attended Waiahole School and Benjamin Parker School. His family grew pineapple, but he would later farm taro, banana, ti leaves and papaya. "A lot of farmers in those times couldn't be anything else so they farmed. But he was a farmer through and through," Nakata said. "He loved the land, loved the productivity that comes from the land." Nakata said his uncle was respected not only among the Windward O'ahu farmers, but also in the Methodist church and Okinawan community. Serikaku is survived by his wife, Ethel; daughters, Leslie Ringuette, Laurie, and Leila Serikaku-Takagi; brothers, Stanley and Katsumi; and grandchildren, Ryan and Kiana Ringuette, and Katherine and Daniel Gilmore. Aileen Riggin Soule, described by another Olympian as a national treasure, will be missed by admirers throughout the world and friends she made in Hawaii where she lived for nearly 50 years. The world's oldest living individual Olympic gold medalist died Thursday night. The Manoa resident was 96. The cause of death was unknown yesterday, but Riggin Soule's health had been deteriorating in recent years. Arrangements are pending and being handled by Borthwick Mortuary. Riggin Soule was much more than the answer to a trivia question. She was a lifetime ambassador for the Olympics, aquatics, and seniors and women in sports. A survivor as well as a pioneer, she competed until five years ago and still holds several age-group swimming records. "I think she's had the longest athletic career of all-time," said Dr. Peter George, former president of the Hawaii chapter of the U.S. Olympic Committee. "She's a national treasure." Riggin Soule lived in Hawaii since 1957. After her husband, Howard, died several years ago, she lived alone in Waikiki before moving herself into a Manoa care home in 2000. She was 14 in 1920 and among the first group of American women to compete in the Olympics when she won the springboard diving gold medal in Antwerp, Belgium, becoming the youngest Olympic champion to that point. She met Duke Kahanamoku at those Games, and they shared a lifelong friendship. Upon her return to her native New York, Mayor John Hylan presented the teenager with a key to the city. Riggin also won a silver in springboard diving and a bronze in the 100-meter backstroke in Paris in 1924, becoming the first, and still only, American woman to win Olympic medals in swimming and diving. "(The Olympics) are so much bigger," Riggin Soule said in a 1996 Island Scene magazine interview. "Back then it was like a county fair; everybody knew each other on a first-name basis, and it didn't matter what sport you were in, or what country you were from. There were only 23 countries involved then. It's grown so much it's mind-boggling." In that era, world-class swimmers were as popular as ice skaters are today; they could make money by turning

professional and touring. Riggin did so, and toured Europe with a group that also included Johnny Weismuller of Tarzan fame. She also became an actress and writer. She had several minor roles in Hollywood films during the 1930s and wrote sports and advice columns for New Yorker magazine and the New York Daily Post. "The movies and things were during the Depression," she said. "You did what you could for money. And it was fun, too." Riggin Soule was honored twice as senior athlete of the year by the Honolulu Quarterback Club. "She was always so jolly and full of pep," said Quarterback Club emcee Les Keiter. "Whenever I would mention her age, people would go nuts in disbelief. "She was absolutely, unbelievably charming. So much energy. Her legacy will live forever in Hawaii and the worldwide aquatic and Olympic communities." In recent years, though, Riggin Soule was slowed by failing health. "She developed a condition that wouldn't allow her to be in water that wasn't warm," said Hawaii Senior Olympics President Mark Zeug. "That kind of cut her out of competition." She carried the flag at the 1984 Los Angeles Games for the U.S. team. Riggin Soule also attended the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, maintaining a heavy schedule of public appearances, endorsement photo shoots and interviews. Riggin Soule was invited to the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia to be honored as the oldest living gold medalist. But she turned down the trip. "She was worried about being able to handle all the appearances," Zeug said. Riggin Soule is a member of the Hawaii Sports Hall of Fame and the International Swimming Hall of Fame. She was also a founding board member of the Hawaii Senior Olympics. "I'm glad people think well of me," she said in 1996. "I think that's because athletic competition brings out the best in people. At least it did in my day. Sportsmanship was so important. And as amateur athletes, we tried to live up to such ideals. Although we were rebels as the first female athletes, we tried to conform to the ideals." Oliver Statler, one of Hawai'i's most prominent authors and an internationally known student of wood block prints, Shingon Buddhism and other things Japanese, died Thursday Feb 14, 2002 at The Queen's Medical Center after a brief illness. He was 87. His 1961 classic novel "Japanese Inn" gently lured Westerners into the history and heart of Japan. "I am headed for the dream-haunted calm of the old inn called Minaguchi-ya... the most Japanese place I know..." he wrote in the opening paragraphs. The son of an Illinois physician, Statler fought the Japanese in World War II but took a civil service position with the Army after the war to visit the country that fascinated him. His instant love of modern Japanese prints made him a friend and protege of author James Michener, who encouraged the self-

taught enthusiast in a new career as writer and art researcher. Invited to Honolulu in 1977 as a visiting professor in Asian Studies at the University of Hawai'i, Statler decided it was the place to live and work, "being closer to Japan, both physically and culturally, than any other part of the U. S." He fondly remembered Army training on Kaua'i, and literally immersed himself in the island environment, swimming daily before dawn Ala Moana Beach Park. Six years after joining the university, he published his landmark "Japanese Pilgrimage," a guide to the thousand-mile journey to the Eighty-Eight Sacred Places of Shikoku associated with the legendary priest and teacher Kobo Daishi, founder of the Shingon school of Buddhism. Thousands from America and Europe have since followed his footsteps along Daishi's path, some in tours led by Statler himself. "He was one of the most beautiful stylists of the English language that I have ever read," said James Brandon, emeritus professor of Asian theater at the University of Hawai'i. "He had an incredible ability to draw any person into the world that he was portraying, and he was portraying a world that to many people was extremely exotic and unknown." A graduate of the University of Chicago, Statler was a member of the board of directors of Kobe College in Japan. He received an honorary doctorate of humane letters from the National College of Education in Evanston, Ill., and fellowships from both the Guggenheim and Japan foundations. Statler is survived by distant cousins on the Mainland. In accordance with his will, memorial services will be held at a later date at the Koboji Shingon temple in Honolulu, and his ashes scattered in the ocean by friends. "I know Oliver now can talk directly with Kobo Daishi about the Shikoku pilgrimage," said long-time friend Nobuo Morikawa of Japan, who helped Statler make his own journeys on the island. Words that Statler once wrote of visiting the Minaguchi inn seem to describe a similar journey: "I know that in a few moments I will slip within its gate and be at home in Japan. "I am almost at the end of my journey, and my nerves ... relax a bit...." [Adv 18/2/2002]

Dwight C. Steele - As president of the Hawaii Employers Council from 1946 until 1959, Dwight C. Steele represented the interests of Big 5 companies, sugar and pineapple plantations and about 200 other Hawaii businesses in negotiations during a time when organized labor was on the rise. "He was very involved in all the labor negotiations when the unions were just getting started in the islands," said Alberta Steele, his wife of 62 years. "He had a pretty good relationship with all of the union people -- Harry Bridges, Jack Hall -- even though he represented the management," said daughter Diane Smith. Steele died July 11, 2002 from injuries suffered in a fall while gardening in his second home at Lake Tahoe, Calif., Smith said. He was 88. Not long after he arrived in Hawaii, sugar workers at all of Hawaii's plantations went on strike in August of 1946. The strike lasted 79 days and was a turning point in labor history here. Steele was also the chief negotiator in the 1949 International Longshore and Warehouse Union strike, which lasted six months. But his relationship with union leaders was such that he was called to San Francisco to help negotiate an end to a three-month-long 1948 West Coast dock strike. Smith remembers the union leaders would occasionally come to their house for a drink or dinner. "He was a very outstanding negotiator," said Alberta Steele. "He knew these men very well. They worked together very well, I think." Alberta Steele said that when ILWU leader Harry Bridges was dying in San Francisco, Bridge's wife called to ask Steele to come over because the labor leader wanted to see him one last time. After leaving Hawaii, Steele moved back to his native San Francisco Bay area and opened up a labor law practice. He left his

successful practice and became active in the conservation movement and campaigns to protect San Francisco Bay and Lake Tahoe. He was appointed to the War Labor Board and War Manpower Commission during World War II and the National Wage Stabilization board during the Korean War. Steele also is survived by another daughter, Marilyn Steele; brother Roger; seven grandchildren; and a great-grandchild.
